APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

CERTIFICATE NO. 8434

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Charles E. Gosson (Name of applicant) of R. D. #2, The Dalles, (Postoffice) Oregon, County of Wasco, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Unnamed small spring in Lot 3, NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Sec. 32, Tp. 1 N. R. 12 E. W.M. (Vacant U.S. Land) and the spring flow in dry weather evaporates before reaching any flowing stream (Name of stream), tributary of

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is .025 cubic feet per second. (1 miner's inch)

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Primarily domestic and stock use, with surplus for irrigation of garden of less than 2 acres (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located at spring 150 feet south and 1760 feet east of NW corner of Sec. 32 Tp. 1 N. R. 12 E. W.M. (Give distance and bearing to section corner)

being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 (Lot 3) of Sec. 32, Tp. 1 N, R. 12 E, W. M., in the county of Wasco (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

5. The pipeline of 3/4 inch pipe to be 1600 feet (Main ditch, canal or pipe line) /miles in length, terminating in the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Sec. 29, Tp. 1 N, R. 12 E, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map. (Smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is Gosson Spring Water Supply

9. The land to be irrigated has a total area of Not exceeding 2 acres, located in each smallest legal subdivision, as follows: All near residence in SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 29 Tp. 1 N. R. 12 E.W.M. Description of Works: Applicant owns and resides on land in Sec. 29, adjoining on North and has begun work digging ditch and placing 3/4 inch pipe from spring to residence located about 330 feet west of center of SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 29. Will use the water for domestic and stock purposes as soon as completed during this month and surplus for garden irrigation. Before July 1, 1927, expects to put in concrete reservoir about 300 to 400 feet north of spring on own land to hold about 50 barrels so that water can be better used for all purposes. Water to be conveyed by gravity as there is about 150 feet of fall between spring and residence. Water has never been heretofore used, nor land claimed or filed upon. Land is steep hill side and only unusual shortage of water in Mill Creek and shutting off of water from later appropriators in favor of earliest rights during the summer shortage has made necessary and justified the expense of this filing and contemplated use.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from an unnamed spring in Lot 3 (NE 1/4 NW 1/4) of Sec. 32, Tp. 1 N. R. 12 E. W.M., for irrigation and domestic purposes, including stock water.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed .025 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is July 6, 1926.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 12, 1927 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1928

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1929
