This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited

to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water fro
Tualatin River for irrigation purposes.
The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to bene-
ficial use and not to exceed 0.04 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of
rotation. The priority date of this permit is March 31, 1928
Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 24, 1929 and shall
