

APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, William Austin (Name of applicant) of Roseburg, Oregon (Postoffice), County of Douglas, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is South Umpqua River (Name of stream), tributary of Umpqua River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.2 cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of division is located West 3,960 ft. and N. 40 degrees 2' E., 468.1 ft., (Give distance and bearing to section corner) from the NE corner of Sec. 10, T. 28 S., R. 6 W., W.M.

being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Sec. 3, Tp. 28 S., R. 6 W., W. M., in the county of Douglas (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.) (No. E. or W.)

5. The water to be used at diversion pt. to be (Main ditch, canal or pipe line) miles in length, terminating in the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Sec. 3, Tp. 28 S., R. 6 W., W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map. (Smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.) (No. E. or W.)

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation

of water from South Umpqua River for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.2 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is September 21, 1928

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 17, 1929 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1930

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1931
