

APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Gus Newbury (Name of applicant) of Medford (Postoffice), County of Jackson, State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is a spring on hillside, the waters of which do not reach any stream in Applegate country.

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is one-fourth cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Domestic (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of division is located about 350 feet East and about 900 feet North from the SW corner of the NE 1/4 Sec. 22, Township 39, 3 West W. M.

being within the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Sec. 22, Tp. 39, R. 3, W. M., in the county of Jackson

5. The Pipe line to be about 1100 feet in length, terminating in the SE 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 22, Tp. 39, R. 3 West, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is domestic water supply spring and pipe line for Newbury ranch.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from An Unnamed Spring for domestic purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.05 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is November 7, 1928

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 16, 1929 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1930

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1931
