

*APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Clair Reid, of Dayton, Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Unnamed stream, a tributary of Yamhill River

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 1.2 cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation

STATE OF OREGON, } ss. County of Marion,

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.75 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Unnamed stream, tributary of Yamhill River

The use to which this water is to be applied is Irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The priority date of this permit is June 18, 1930

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 30, 1931 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1932

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1933
