APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

CERTIFICATE NO. 12506

To Appropriate the Underground Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Henry Boog Johnson (Name of applicant)
 of Freewater (Postoffice), county of Umatilla,
 state of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate
 the following described underground waters of the state of Oregon, subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. Give name of nearest stream to which the well, tunnel or other source of water development
Crystal Spring, a tributary of East prong of Little Walla Walla River
 is situated (Name of stream)

(sometimes called Home Brook a tributary of a spring creek)

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.5
 cubic feet per second, for the irrigation of 20 acres.

3. The place where the water to be pumped or developed is located 308 feet west
from the S.E. corner of the East half of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$
 (Give distance and bearing from section corner)

being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 23, Twp. 6 N, R. 35 E,
 W. M., in the county of Umatilla

4. The ditch to be 1200 feet miles
 in length, terminating in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 23, Twp. 6 N,
 (Smallest legal subdivision) R. 35 E, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

5. The name of the well or other works is

7. The development will consist of one well (concrete) having a

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: This appropriation shall be limited to one ~~eightieth~~ ^{thirtieth} of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper State officer

The right herein granted shall be limited to the appropriation of water from a well for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.50 cubic feet per second/or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is April 15, 1935

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 29, 1936 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before Oct. 1, 1937 Extended to Oct. 1, 1939

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before Oct. 1, 1938 Extended to Oct. 1, 1939
