SUBJECT: Water Right Transfer Application T-10940

Please find enclosed the Preliminary Determination indicating that, based on the information available, the Department intends to approve application T-10940. This document is an intermediate step in the approval process; water may not be used legally as proposed in the transfer application until a Final Order has been issued by the Department. Please read this entire letter carefully to determine your responsibility for additional action.

A public notice is being published in the Department's weekly publication and in the Blue Mountain Eagle newspaper, simultaneously with issuance of the Preliminary Determination. The notice initiates a period in which any person may file either a protest opposing the decision proposed by the Department in the Preliminary Determination or a standing statement supporting the Department's decision. The protest period will end 30 days after the Department's notice *or* 30 days after the last date of newspaper publication, whichever is later.

If no protest is filed, the Department will issue a Final Order consistent with the Preliminary Determination. You should receive a copy of the Final Order about 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If a protest is filed, the application may be referred to a contested case proceeding. A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.

Authority

Findings of Fact

Background

- 1. On July 31, 2009, Jim Gillespie filed an application to add an additional point of diversion under Certificates 9154, 9155, 25488, 25490 and 25497. The Department assigned the application number T-10940.

- 15. Notice of the application for transfer was published on August 18, 2009, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice. However, the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.
- 16. No other comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 17. Accompanying the transfer application was a letter from Gary Wilson, Engineer for the Grant Soil and Water Conservation District (GSWCD), stating that this transfer is one of three transfers being proposed and a part of a complete project on the South Fork of the John Day River to improve irrigation efficiency, fish passage and habitat for listed steelhead and spring Chinook salmon. These projects would result in the elimination of three gravel pushup dams and would convert a fourth to a lay-flat stanchion structure, all allowing for the conversion of 115 acres from flood irrigation to sprinkler along a 5.5 mile reach of the river.
- 18. In addition to the support letter from the support letter from the GSWCD, the ODFW stated that because the transfer was submitted along with two other transfers as described in the tables below, the merits and impacts of the project may create an overall net benefit to the resource (fish) and wildlife habitat. The ODFW also stated that they would look forward to a more thorough review once the transfers proceed. Transfer application T-10938 (Lee Schrier) and T-10939 (Stan Harlan) are being processed simultaneously with this transfer. The following table was submitted by the Grant Soil and Water Conservation District and may be used to evaluate the "package" as a whole in terms of the three associated transfer files being proposed on the South Fork John Day River. The table represents the movement of a specific amount of cubic foot per second per each segment of the river described.

- 19. The applicant and the Watermaster have reported that in the summer of 2005, a fish-friendly, lay-flat stanchion design was installed at the Cummings Ditch diversion.
- 20. On November 28, 2011, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10940 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination set forth a deadline of December 28, 2011 for the applicant to respond. On January 12, 2012, the agent, on behalf of the applicants, submitted a written response requesting the Department to proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 21. On October 16, 2012, Lee Schrier, applicant for the associated (upstream) transfer application T-10938 submitted a request to withdraw a portion of the place of use involved in the transfer and submitted a revised application and map to reflect the modification. The adjustment made to the place of use also necessitated modification to the amount of water associated with the new acreage amount. The table in Finding of Fact #18 above has been adjusted accordingly to reflect these changes to transfer application T-10938.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 22. Water has been used within the last five years prior to submittal of the transfer application according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 23. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-10940.
- 24. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 25. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.

Determination and Proposed Action

The change for an additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-10940 appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be approved.

If Transfer Application T-10940 is approved, the final order will include the following:

- 1. The change to add an additional point of diversion proposed in application T-10940 is approved.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 9154, 9155, 25488, 25490 and 25497 are cancelled.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of diversion together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.
- 5. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at the new additional point of diversion. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring devices in good working order. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring devices; provided however, where the meter or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or fish by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-

pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or bypass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

- 7. The approved changes shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2014**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
- 8. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.
