- \*Example for Line 5a calculation to transfer 45.0 acres of Primary Permit S-12345 (total 1.25 cfs for 100 acres) and 45.0 acres of Supplemental Permit S-87654 (1/80 cfs per acre) on the same land:
- 1. For irrigation calculate cfs for each permit involved as follows:
  - a. Divide total authorized cfs by total acres in the permit (for S-12345, 1.25 cfs  $\div$  100 ac); then multiply by the number of acres to be changed to get the application cfs (x 45 ac = 0.56 cfs).
  - b. If the water right permit does not list total cfs, but identifies the allowable use as 1/40 or 1/80 of a cfs per acre; multiply number of acres proposed for change by either 0.025 (1/40) or 0.0125 (1/80). (For S-87654, 45.0 ac x 0.0125 cfs/ac = 0.56 cfs)
- 2. Add cfs for the portions of permits on all the land included in the application; however **do not count** cfs for supplemental permits on acreage for which you have already calculated the cfs fee for the primary permit on the same land. The fee should be assessed only once for each "on the ground" acre included in the application. (In this example, blank 5a would be only 0.56 cfs, since both permits serve the same 45.0 acres. Explain in your own words what you propose to accomplish with this permit amendment; and why: TEMPORARY TRANSFER OF A PORTION OF PERMIT S-54926 FOR PILOT TESTING OF AN AQUIFER STORAGE AND RECOVERY ("ASR") SYSTEM (UNDER AN "ASR" LIMITED LICENSE APPLICATION) TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL GROUNDWATER SOURCES OF WATER SUPPLY TO IRRIGATE LANDS SUBJECT OF PERMIT G-16671.

GROUNDWATER IS USED TO IRRIGATE LANDS UNDER PERMIT G-16671 BETWEEN 1 MARCH AND 30 OCT. THIS GROUNDWATER IS BECOMING SUBJECT OF CURTAILMENT DUE TO DECLINING WATER LEVELS. AN "ASR" SYSTEM WILL BE DESIGNED AND TESTED TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL WATER TO AUGMENT AND FINALLY REPLACE NATIVE GROUNDWATER. THIS AMENMENT INCLUDES A REQUEST TO CHANGE THE PLACE OF USE OF A PORTION OF S-54926 TO PROVIDE SOURCE WATER FOR ASR TESTING. IF PILOT SYSTEM TESTING PROVES SUCCESSFUL, FULL SCALE FACILITIES WILL BE DESIGNED AND CONSTRUCTED AND A NEW SURFACE WATER RIGHT WILL BE APPLIED FOR IN WHICH CASE THE TRANSFERRED AMOUNT WILL NEED TO TRANSFER BACK TO THE ORIGINAL LANDS UNDER S-54926.

THE AMOUNT REQUESTED IN THIS AMENDMENT IS 3 CFS (240 ACRES X 1/80<sup>TH</sup> CFS PER ACRE).


