SUBJECT: Water Right Transfer Application T-12140

Please find enclosed the Preliminary Determination indicating that, based on the information available, the Department intends to approve application T-12140. This document is an intermediate step in the approval process; water may not be used legally as proposed in the transfer application until a Final Order has been issued by the Department. Please read this entire letter carefully to determine your responsibility for additional action.

A public notice is being published in the Department's weekly publication and in the Yamhill Valley News Register newspaper, simultaneously with issuance of the Preliminary Determination. The notice initiates a period in which any person may file either a protest opposing the decision proposed by the Department in the Preliminary Determination or a standing statement supporting the Department's decision. The protest period will end 30 days after the last date of newspaper publication.

If no protest is filed, the Department will issue a Final Order consistent with the Preliminary Determination. You should receive a copy of the Final Order about 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If a protest is filed, the application may be referred to a contested case proceeding. A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.

Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of appropriation, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

- 1. On August 20, 2015, the CITY OF DAYTON filed an application for additional points of appropriation and to change the place of use and to change the character of use under Certificates 68768, 82997, and 89940. The Department assigned the application number T-12140.
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on September 1, 2015, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of notice of this preliminary determination.

- 3. On February 9, 2016, the Department contacted the applicant's agent by telephone and by written correspondence (email) to notify them of deficiencies in the application. The deficiencies being discrepancies in the "measured distances" description of a couple of the points of appropriation; clarification of the location of the types of use on Certificate 82997; clarification of the type changes on Certificate 68768; and an authorized point of appropriation missing from the application map. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by March 10, 2016.
- 4. On March 9, 2016, revised application pages and maps were submitted, resolving the deficiencies. As part of the resolution, for Certificate 68768, it was determined that the type of change is a change in point of appropriation as opposed to adding additional points of appropriation.
- 5. On March 14, 2016, the Department sent a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-12140 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of April 13, 2016, for the applicant to respond. The applicant noted a scrivener's error in the number of acres for greenhouse use under the description of Certificate 82997 and requested that clarification of the total duty be included in the order. With that change and correction, the applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer. The changes are in **bold and underlined** in this Preliminary Determination.

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for nursery use is limited to a maximum of 5.0

acre-feet per acre and a diversion of 0.15 cubic foot per second per acre.

For irrigation of containerized nursery plants, the amount of water

diverted is limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 5.0 acre-feet per acre per year. For irrigation of in-ground nursery plants the amount of water diverted is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 2.5 acre-feet per acre per year. The use of water for nursery use may be made any time, during the period of allowed use specified above, that the use is beneficial. For irrigation of any other crop, the amount of water diverted is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 2.5 acre-feet per acre during the irrigation season of

each year.

Transfer Review Criteria (OAR 690-380-4010)

- 17. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 18. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-12140.
- 19. The proposed change in character of use from nursery to municipal use could result in enlargement of the right, unless conditioned to limit the rate of diversion under the rights to a total of 442.5 gallons per minute (gpm), being 110.2 gpm under Certificate 68768; 81 gpm under Certificate 82997 and 251.3 gpm under Certificate 89940 and further limit the total volume of water being diverted under the rights to 46.6 acre feet (9.32 acres X 5.0 acre feet/acre) under Certificate 68768 annually; 46.6 acre feet (9.32

acres X 5.0 acre feet/acre) under Certificate 82997 annually; and 29.35 acre feet (5.87 acres X 5.0 acre feet/acre) under Certificate 89940 annually.

- 20. The proposed changes, as conditioned, would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 21. The proposed changes, as conditioned, would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 22. All other application requirements are met.

Determination and Proposed Action

The change in point of appropriation, additional points of appropriation, change in place of use and change in character of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12140 appear to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the application will be approved.

If Transfer Application T-12140 is approved, the final order will include the following:

- 1. The change in point of appropriation, additional points of appropriation, change in place of use and change in character of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12140 are approved
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 68768, 82997, and 89940 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 68768, 82997, and 89940 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing those portions of the rights not affected by this transfer.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, or the additional points of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original points of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation.
- 5. The amount of water used for the proposed municipal use shall be limited to a rate of 442.5 gallons per minute (gpm), being 110.2 gpm under Certificate 68768; 81 gpm under Certificate 82997 and 251.3 gpm under Certificate 89940 and shall not exceed a total volume of water diverted of 46.6 acre feet under Certificate 68768; 46.6 acre feet under Certificate 82997; and 29.35 acre feet (5.87 acres X 5.0 acre feet/acre) under Certificate 89940, annually.
- 6. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of appropriation.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

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- 7. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.
- 8. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
- 9. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2036**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
- 10. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.
