Re: Application for a Water Right Transfer – Coquille Indian Tribe (Certificates 11180 and 11185)

Dear Mr. Starnes:

The Coquille Indian Tribe (the Tribe) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe with a reservation land base in Coos County, Oregon. The Tribe has federally reserved water rights to sufficient water to fulfill the purpose of its reservation lands which have not been adjudicated. The Tribe also holds state water rights on some of these lands.

The Tribe is proposing to change the character of use for two state water rights to store water in Fourth Creek and Tarheel Reservoirs. Both reservoirs are operated by the Tribe and are located on property owned by the United States of America and held in trust for the Tribe.

The Tribe is the holder of water right Certificate 11180, which confirms a right to store 21 acre-feet of water in Fourth Creek Reservoir for manufacturing and steam boiler supply, and water right Certificate 11185, which confirms the right to store 75 acre-feet of water in Tarheel Reservoir for manufacturing and steam boiler supply. The Tribe is proposing to change the character of use for Certificates 11180 and 11185 from manufacturing and steam boiler supply to multipurpose storage.

The Applicant is also proposing to change the Character of Use for Certificate 11185, which confirms the right to store 75 acre-feet of water in Tarheel Reservoir, from manufacturing and steam boiler supply to multipurpose storage.

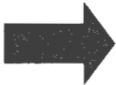

As described in the permit application, Fourth Creek Reservoir is located in Section 36, Township 25 South, Range 14 West and Section 31, Township 25 South, Range 13 West.

Note that, as shown in the map in Attachment B, due to water storage under Permit R-13907 (which authorizes the storage of an additional 61 acre feet of water in Tarheel Reservoir) the reservoir now extends into NW-SW, Section 31, Township 25 South, Range 13 West.
