- \*Example for Line 5a calculation to transfer 45.0 acres of Primary Permit S-12345 (total 1.25 cfs for 100 acres) and 45.0 acres of Supplemental Permit S-87654 (1/80 cfs per acre) on the same land:
- 1. For irrigation calculate cfs for each permit involved as follows:
  - a. Divide total authorized cfs by total acres in the permit (for S-12345, 1.25 cfs  $\div$ 100 ac); then multiply by the number of acres to be changed to get the application cfs (x 45 ac = 0.56 cfs).
  - b. If the water right permit does not list total cfs, but identifies the allowable use as 1/40 or 1/80 of a cfs per acre; multiply number of acres proposed for change by either 0.025 (1/40) or 0.0125 (1/80). (For S-87654, 45.0 ac x 0.0125 cfs/ac = 0.56 cfs)
- 2. Explain in your own words what you propose to accomplish with this permit amendment; and why: Water right application S-71040 was submitted on December 12, 1990 presumably with the intent of using the existing diversion point for permit S-17554. It should be noted that we have not been able to obtain a copy of the application map that shows the proposed location for the diversion point. The permit was issued over 6 years later on February 26, 1997. Meanwhile, Goschie Farms Inc. purchased the adjoining land to the east that gave them access to a buried mainline that ran from the Abiqua to the place of use for application S-71040. The purchase also gave Goschie Farms access to three additional diversion points on the Abiqua. Thus, by the end of 1992, Goschie Farms had 5 diversion points on the Abiqua for 5 different water rights and one pending application to use one of the existing diversion points. Goschie Farms wanted to install fish screens on their diversion points in-spite of the fact that none of the water rights required fish screens. On February 5, 1993, transfer T-6895 was submitted to consolidate all of the existing diversion points to two locations and add fish screens. The final order for T-6895 was issued on 7/2/1998 and construction on the new Diversion Points and fish screens was completed by the end of the year. It is not known when construction was started on the two new diversion points, but the meter's serial number for the western new diversion point has a 1997 date. The COBU for T-6895 was submitted on 4/2/1999, and the COBU for this application was submitted on 8/3/2000 claiming the new diversion points. We do not know why Don Buell did not address the fact that neither diversion point for the COBU was in the location described by the permit. However, the COBU was submitted before the C-date. Thus, there was time for OWRD to catch this issue before the C-date and an extension could have been requested to change the diversion point. A pump could have been re-installed at the authorized diversion point with a fish screen (old diversion point for permit S-17554) and all of the permit conditions could have been met until a permit amendment could be submitted and approved. However, for some unknown reason the COBU was not logged in at OWRD when submitted. The COBU was finally logged in after 7/31/2015 when Greg Kupillas from Pacific Hydro-Geology tried to find out why the water right had not been certificated. At this point, a permit amendment is needed to rectify the diversion point issue, but first, an extension is needed to allow time for the permit amendment.
