Dear Sir:

This will acknowledge receipt of application for the approval of a change in place of use of water from Silver Creek on behalf of J. R. Brock, together with money order in the amount of \$9.50 and stamps in the amount of 20 cents.

The application is being returned together with our check #2750 in the amount of \$9.70, for the reason that this office cannot approve the application.

The proposed change in place of use of water if approved would be an enlargement of the existing water right. Our records indicate that there is a water right for 40 acres from Silver Creek and 22 acres from Hurricane Creek appurtenant to the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, Township 2 South, Range 44 East, W.M., which is a 40 acre tract. If 20 acres were transferred to some other sub-division there would be 60 acres irrigated whereas at the present time there are only 40 acres irrigated.

After discussing this matter with Mr. Stricklin he is of the opinion that you should secure a permit to appropriate this water. Blank form, together with a 4-section plat and Rules and Regulations of the State Engineer are being enclosed for your convenience.
