Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Applicant

CARLTON NURSERY CO. LLC C/O ALLAN ELLIOTT PO BOX 398 DAYTON, OR 97114

Findings of Fact

- 1. On December 22, 2017, CARLTON NURSERY CO. LLC, c/o ALLAN ELLIOTT filed an application for an additional point of diversion under Certificates 64748, 87769, and 89032. The Department assigned the application number T-12798.
- 2. Certificates 64748, 87769, and 89032 are in the name of Palmer Creek Water District Improvement Company, however, Carlton Nursery Co. LLC, c/o Allan Elliott, will be responsible for completion of the changes.
- 3. Notice of the application for transfer was published on January 2, 2018, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 4. On May 23, 2019, the Department contacted the applicant by written correspondence to notify the applicant and the applicant's agent of the deficiencies in the application. The application did not correctly identify the authorized point of diversion under Certificates 64748, 87769, and 89032. The application maps identifying the current place of use under Certificates 64748 and 87769 do not match the place of use as identified by Department records. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by June 21, 2019.

Pursuant to QAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of notice of this preliminary determination.

- 5. On June 19, 2019, the applicant's agent submitted revised tables and a map, correctly identifying the authorized point of diversion for Certificates 64748, 87769, and 89032. The applicant's agent also informed the Department that the Palmer Creek Water District Improvement Company (PCWDIC) had revised maps for all water rights involved, and that the maps would be submitted to the Department as part of a District reconciliation of irrigated acres and quarter-quarter lines. The maps submitted with the application were simply a re-description of Certificates 64748 and 87769.
- 6. On June 24, 2019, the applicant's agent informed the Department that PCWDIC never completed re-mapping that was allowed under House Bill (HB) 3111, as the maps were done but the acreages needed to be added.
- 7. On July 18, 2019, the Department informed the applicant's agent that the Department was unable to locate a petition for PCWDIC, as was required under ORS 541.327. The Department determined that PCWDIC was not eligible for re-description under HB 3111, since a petition was not on file with the Department. The Department also determined that a change in place of use had taken place, and that the application would need to be revised, or a new transfer application would need to be submitted. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by August 2, 2019. The Department did not receive a response.
- 8. On August 29, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to deny Transfer Application T-12798 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of September 27, 2019, for the applicant to respond. The Department did not receive a response.
- 9. The portion of the first right to be transferred is as follows:

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured

under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right allowed herein is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed

the limitation allowed herein.

15. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish

screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 16. Water has been used within the last five year period prior to submittal of the transfer application according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 17. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-12798.
- 18. The proposed change as conditioned would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 19. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 20. The Department has determined that a change in place of use has already occurred, as the application maps for Certificates 64748 and 87769 do not match the place of use as identified by Department records, and authorized by Certificates 64748 and 87769.

Determination and Proposed Action

The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-12798 appears to be NOT consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be denied.

If the deficiencies are resolved, and Transfer Application T-12798 is approved, the final order will include the following:

- 1. The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-12798 is approved.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 64748, 87769, 89032, and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 64748, 87769, and 89032 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing that portion of the rights not affected by this transfer.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of diversion (CP POD), together with that diverted at the original points of diversion (PCWDIC), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion (PCWDIC).
- 5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion.

- b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.
- 7. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2021**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
- 8. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the rights transferred will be issued in the name of Palmer Creek Water District Improvement Company.

Please find enclosed the Preliminary Determination indicating that, based on the information available, the Department intends to deny application T-12798. This document is an intermediate step in the denial process; water may not be used legally as proposed in the transfer application until a Final Order to approve the transfer has been issued by the Department. Please read this entire letter carefully to determine your responsibility for additional action.

A public notice is being published in the Department's weekly publication, simultaneously with issuance of the Preliminary Determination. The notice initiates a period in which any person may file either a protest opposing the decision proposed by the Department in the Preliminary Determination or a standing statement supporting the Department's decision. The protest period will end 30 days after the Department's notice.

If no protest is filed, the Department will issue a Final Order consistent with the Preliminary Determination. You should receive a copy of the Final Order about 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If a protest is filed, the application may be referred to a contested case proceeding. A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.
