Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 537.610, 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which the holder of a certificate of registration may submit a request for recognition of modifications to the place of use, character of use or point of appropriation under a groundwater certificate of registration.

Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Divisions 382 and 380 implement the statutes and provide the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating groundwater registration modification applications.

Findings of Fact

1. On December 27, 2018, WALTER AND LORA LIERMAN filed a groundwater registration modification application to modify the points of appropriation under Registration Application GR-122 (Certificate of Registration GR-113). The Department assigned the application number T-13084.
2. On June 9, 2015, Registration Application GR-122 (Certificate of Registration GR-113) was assigned from ED HASELBACHER to TERRA ENTERPRISE LLC, DBA FIVE OAK FARMS/JERRY DITCHEN.
3. On January 3, 2019, Registration Application GR-122 (Certificate of Registration GR-113) was partially assigned from TERRA ENTERPRISE LLC, DBA FIVE OAK FARMS/JERRY DITCHEN to WALTER LIERMAN.

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of notice of this preliminary determination.
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4. Notice of the application for groundwater registration modification was published on January 15, 2019, pursuant to OAR 690-382-0600. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
5. On October 11, 2019, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-13084 to the applicants. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of November 12, 2019, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
6. The portion of the groundwater registration to be modified is as follows:

Registration: Application GR-122 (Certificate of Registration GR-113), in the name of TERRA ENTERPRISE LLC, DBA FIVE OAK FARMS/JERRY DITCHEN (*partially assigned to Walter Lierman*); as modified by Special Order Volume 98, Page 1031

Review Criteria for Groundwater Registration Modification Applications [OAR 690-382-0700(2)]

8. The proposed modification would not result in enlargement of the groundwater registration.
9. The proposed modification would not result in a state Scenic Waterway not receiving previously available water during periods in which streamflows are less than the quantities determined by the Department to be necessary to meet the requirements of ORS 390.835.
10. The proposed modification would not result in injury to other water rights.

Determination and Proposed Action


The modification in points of appropriation proposed in Groundwater Registration Modification T-13084 appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.610, 537.705, 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-382-1000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-382-0900, the modification will be approved.

If Groundwater Registration Modification T-13084 is approved, the final order will include the following:

1. *The modification to Registration Application GR-122 (Certificate of Registration GR-113) proposed in Groundwater Registration Modification Application T-13084 is recognized. Recognition of the modification shall not be construed as a final determination of the right to appropriate groundwater under the certificate of registration or modification. Such a determination will occur in an adjudication proceeding under ORS 537.670 to 537.695.*
2. *The use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Registration Application GR-122 (Certificate of Registration GR-113) and any related decree.*
3. *Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.*
4. *Water shall no longer be appropriated from the recognized points of appropriation as part of this groundwater certificate of registration.*

5. *The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (Well #1 new POA), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the recognized points of appropriation (Well #1 and Well #2).*

SUBJECT: Water Right Transfer Application T-13084

Please find enclosed the Preliminary Determination indicating that, based on the information available, the Department intends to approve application T-13084. This document is an intermediate step in the approval process; water may not be used legally as proposed in the transfer application until a Final Order has been issued by the Department. Please read this entire letter carefully to determine your responsibility for additional action.

A public notice is being published in the Department's weekly publication, simultaneously with issuance of the Preliminary Determination. The notice initiates a period in which any person may file either a protest opposing the decision proposed by the Department in the Preliminary Determination or a standing statement supporting the Department's decision. The protest period will end 30 days after the Department's notice.

If no protest is filed, the Department will issue a Final Order consistent with the Preliminary Determination. You should receive a copy of the Final Order about 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If a protest is filed, the application may be referred to a contested case proceeding. A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.
