The 2 APOA will also be collector wells located at the same facility as the authorized POA. This application is being evaluated simultaneously with contemporaneous GR modification applications T-13312, T-13315, and T-13316 and water right transfer application T-13313 (which also involve the proposed APOA) to appropriately consider potential impacts to the groundwater resource and nearby groundwater and surface water rights.


