## Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

ORS 540.621 establishes the process for the owner of land to which a water right is appurtenant to certify under oath that the water right, or a portion thereof, has been abandoned and to voluntarily request that it be cancelled.

# Applicant

ROBERT W. GABRIEL 8474 HAZELGREEN RD NE SILVERTON, OR 97381

#### **Findings of Fact**

- 1. On January 24, 2019, ROBERT W. GABRIEL filed an application to change the points of diversion and to change the places of use under Certificates 15413 and 54224, and to change the point of appropriation and place of use under Certificate 54225. The Department assigned the application number T-13112.
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on October 29, 2019, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of notice of this preliminary determination.

- 3. On February 18, 2020, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to deny Transfer Application T-13112 to the applicant, due to the proposed points of appropriation under Certificate 54225 not developing the same source as the authorized point of appropriation. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of March 19, 2020, for the applicant to respond.
- 4. On February 19, 2020, the applicant's agent requested to place T-13112 on administrative hold, so the applicant could work with the Department to resolve the deficiencies for proposing a denial of T-13112. The Department does not have authority to place applications on administrative hold, so the Department set forth an extended deadline to, April 20, 2020.
- 5. On April 21, 2020, the Department extended the deadline to May 22, 2020, as the applicant was waiting for a response from the Department's Groundwater section.
- 6. On May 21, 2020, it was determined that the Department's Groundwater section would conduct a re-review of the proposed points of appropriation.
- 7. On November 30, 2020, the Department completed a groundwater re-review. The Department determined that a revised draft Preliminary Determination would need to be issued, as the draft Preliminary Determination issued on February 18, 2020, did not address Certificates 54224 and 54225.
- 8. On February 1, 2021, the applicant requested to extend the date for completion of the water to full beneficial use to October 1, 2024, in order to construct the new well, and the new point of diversion with an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife approved screen.
- 9. On January 28, 2021, the Department mailed a copy of the revised draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-13112 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of March 1, 2021, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 10. The first right to be transferred is as follows:

19. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

## Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)

- 20. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 21. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-13112.
- 22. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 23. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 24. On November 30, 2020, the Department determined the proposed points of appropriation (POA) under Certificate 54225 will develop the same aquifer (source) as the existing authorized POA.

The authorized From-POA (Well 1, CLAC 9792) is completed in an unconfined aquifer comprised of recent alluvium deposited in the floodplain between the Pudding River (to the west) and the Molalla River (to the east). The proposed To-POA Well 7 would be completed in the same unconfined alluvial aquifer based on its proposed construction. However, the proposed To-POA Wells 2-6 are or would be completed on a terrace west of the Pudding River, into a confined aquifer comprised of older sands and gravels overlain by ~80 ft or more of fine-grained sediments, all deposited across the broader Willamette lowland by the Missoula floods (Gannett and Caldwell, 1998; O'Connor et al., 2001). However, hydraulic conductivity and specific storage are similar in both the unconfined recent alluvium and the confined older sands and gravels, and both systems are hydraulically connected to the Pudding River. Based on the definition of "aquifer" provided in OAR 690-200-0050(9), the authorized and proposed POA can be considered to develop the same source for purposes of the proposed transfer.

25. All other application requirements are met.

## Partial Cancellation of a Water Right

26. On November 8, 2019, an affidavit certifying that a portion of a water use permit has been abandoned and requesting cancellation of the permit was received from Bob Gabriel. The portion of the permit to be cancelled is as follows:

27. The applicant requested to cancel a portion of acres under Permit G-17557. The Department determined a portion of the rate authorized by Permit G-17557 would not be cancelled, as the right was considered to have a deficient rate, and enlargement of the right would not occur.

## **Determination and Proposed Action**

The change in points of diversion, change in point of appropriation, and change in places of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13112 appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705, 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000 and the abandoned permit should be cancelled. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be approved and the abandoned permit will be cancelled.

If Transfer Application T-13112 is approved, the final order will include the following:

- 1. The changes in points of diversion and in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13112 are approved. The portion of the permit that has been abandoned is cancelled. The portion of the permit is diminished to supplemental irrigation.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 15413, 54224, and 54225, and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 15413, 54224, and 54225 are cancelled.
- 4. The quantity of water, as authorized under Certificate 15413, diverted at the new point of diversion (POD 3), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion (POD 1 and 2).

- 5. The quantity of water, as authorized under Certificate 54224, diverted at the new point of diversion (POD 3), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion (POD 1).
- 6. The quantity of water, as authorized under Certificate 54225, diverted at the new points of appropriation (Wells 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation (Well 1).
- 7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.
- 8. The former place of use of the transferred rights shall no longer receive water under the rights.
- 9. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before October 1, 2024. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.

10. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the rights transferred will be issued.

A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.
