Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use; or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Applicant

ERL MCLAUGHLIN 65708 SUNRISE RD ENTERPRISE, OR 97828

Findings of Fact

- 1. On June 5, 2020, ERL MCLAUGHLIN filed an application to change the point of diversion and place of use under Certificate 7716, and to change the place of use under Certificates 9045, 9046, 9311, and 48403. The Department assigned the application number T-13459.
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on June 16, 2020, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 3. On October 5, 2020, the Department contacted the applicant by written correspondence to notify the applicant of deficiencies in the application. An Evidence of Use Affidavit and supporting documentation was submitted for only Certificate 7716. The application included only one map. Pursuant to OAR 690-380-3100(1)(i), if the proposed transfer involves changes in place of use or character of use for more than three water rights, a separate map shall be provided for each water right. Additionally, Table 2 under Certificates 9045, 9046, and 48403 incorrectly described the places of use being transferred. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by November 5, 2020.
- 4. On October 19, 2020, the applicant submitted a revised Table 2 for Certificates 9045, 9046, and 48403.

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of notice of this preliminary determination.

- 5. On October 30, 2020, the Department received Evidence of Use Affidavits and supporting documentation for Certificates 9045, 9046, 9311, and 48403.
- 6. On November 23, 2020, the Department received a separate map for Certificates 7716, 9311, and 48403, pursuant to OAR 690-380-3100(1)(i).
- 7. On December 9, 2020, the Department received separate maps for Certificates 9045 and 9046, resolving the deficiencies.
- 8. On January 21, 2021, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-13459 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of February 22, 2021, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.

24. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 25. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 26. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-13459.
- 27. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 28. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 29. All other application requirements are met.

Determination and Proposed Action

The change in point of diversion and change in places of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13459 appear to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be approved.

If Transfer Application T-13459 is approved, the final order will include the following:

- The change in point of diversion and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13459 are approved.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 7716, 9045, 9046, 9311, and 48403 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 7716, 9045, 9046, 9311, and 48403 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing that portion of the rights not affected by this transfer.
- 4. The quantity of water, as authorized by Certificate 7716, diverted at the new point of diversion (Lower Alder Slope), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion (Dam and Big Bend Ditch).

- 5. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department. The water user shall maintain the headgate as required by the Department.
- 6. The water user shall maintain and operate a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.
- 7. The former place of use of the transferred rights shall no longer receive water under the rights.
- 8. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before October 1, 2022. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
- 9. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.

Please find enclosed the Preliminary Determination indicating that, based on the information available, the Department intends to approve application T-13459. This document is an intermediate step in the approval process; water may not be used legally as proposed in the transfer application until a Final Order has been issued by the Department. Please read this entire letter carefully to determine your responsibility for additional action.

A public notice is being published in the Department's weekly publication and in the Wallowa County Chieftain newspaper, simultaneously with issuance of the Preliminary Determination. The notice initiates a period in which any person may file either a protest opposing the decision proposed by the Department in the Preliminary Determination or a standing statement supporting the Department's decision. The protest period will end 30 days after the last date of newspaper publication.

If no protest is filed, the Department will issue a Final Order consistent with the Preliminary Determination. You should receive a copy of the Final Order about 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If a protest is filed, the application may be referred to a contested case proceeding. A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.
