Dear Ms. Berry:

I am writing to thank you for working with the Oregon Water Trust in developing and submitting an application for a conserved water project. I have been working with Kerry KenCairn of the Oregon Water Trust in processing this application. It is delightful to see Evans Creek residents, and the creek itself, benefitting from this action.

As you were previously informed, the CWRE-prepared map for the Williams-Whalen Conserved Water Project showed that there are currently less acres irrigated than the several paper water rights had allowed. For example, water right Certificate 32772 which is appurtenant to your land and to four other adjoining properties is for irrigation of a total of 10 acres in the SE¼ SE¼ Section 1, 7.6 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the NE¼ NW¼ of Section 12 and 11.9 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the NW¼ NW¼ of Section 12. However, the actual irrigated lands involved in the applications under Certificate 32/72, as shown on the CWRE map, are for slightly less than these amounts. There is 1 acre in the SE¼ SE¼ Section 1, 1.18 acres in the NE¼ NW¼ and 1.82 acres in the NW¼ NW¼ of Section 12 unaccounted for in the conserved water applications and CWRE map and which have been lost/through nonuse.

These unirrigated acres are subject to cancellation due to nonuse over the past 5 or more years. As part of the conserved water project process, it is necessary for the Department to account for all acres involved and to cancel those acres from which the water right has been forfeited through nonuse. To accomplish this, I am asking that you please read over the enclosed statement and verify your understanding that these 'unaccounted for' acres are to be cancelled by signing and returning the attached statement. A stamped and addressed envelope is also enclosed for your convenience. This will not affect the amount of water or the acres available to irrigate under your new water right which will be issued as a result of your conserved water project.

Thank you again for your time and I apologize for any inconvenience this late-coming detail may cause.

# Notice of Application for Allocation of Conserved Water, Application 98-04, and Notice of Proposed Associated Change in Point of Diversion for 1.5 acres in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12, T35S, R4W, Jackson County, Oregon

Jerry N. Hilger, Gary and Alice Teague, Linda Lance, G.L. and Gwen Scott, Dorothy H. Berry, Robert and Elanor Burton, Jakob Jauker, Dora M. Baines, John W. and Irene E. Loper and the Oregon Water Trust have made application to the Oregon Water Resources Department for approval of a project to conserve water as provided by ORS 537.470. The application involves water rights for irrigation of contiguous or near-contiguous lands lying on the north side of Evans Creek in the SE¼ SE¼, SW¼ SE¼, and SE¼ SW¼ Section 1, the NE¼ NE¼ NE¼ NW¼ and NW¼ NW¼ Section 12, the NE¼ NE¼ and the SE¼ NE¼ Section 11 in Township 35 S, Range 04 W, WM.

The project involves Certificates 68497, 32772, 42921 and a portion of 42921 involved in Transfer 4037. Water has previously been diverted under the subject water rights from the Williams Whalen Ditch, and applied by flood irrigation. The amount diverted and applied under these three rights in this manner was 0.077 cfs under Certificate 68497, 0.4% cfs under Certificate 32772, and 0.06 cfs under Certificate 42921.

The applicants propose to change the point of diversion from the Williams Whalen Ditch to individual metered and screened pumps in Evans Creek adjacent to the individual applicants' properties, to deliver a reduced quantity of water to each property via pipe and apply water via sprinkler irrigation. The reduced amount of water required as a result of this conservation project will be 0.048 cfs under Certificate 68497, 0.288 cfs under Certificate 32772, and 0.037 cfs under Certificate 42921.

The applicants further propose to allocate 100% of the water conserved through these modifications, being 0.21 cfs (93.8 acre feet), to an instream water right beginning at river mile 11 and ending at river mile 8 on Evans Creek. The water conserved will be combined with the existing instream right for 0.055 cfs at this location, established under a related conservation project completed in 1996 and evidenced by the Order recorded at Special Order Volume 50, page 853, and will have the same priority date of 1896 plus one minute.

In addition, applicants Robert and Elanor Burton have filed an application proposing to move the point of diversion for Certificate 49039 appurtenant to 1.7 acres in the from the Williams Whalen Ditch to the same pump to be utilized under this conserved water application for 4.64 acres owned by applicants in the NW¼ NW¼ Section 12, T35S, R4W, under C. 32772. Applicants have voluntarily authorized cancellation for nonuse of the portion of the right appurtenant to 0.2 acre allowed under Certificate 49039, and seek approval of the new point of diversion and issuance of a remaining right certificate for irrigation of 1.5 acres.

Any interested person may submit comments on these applications. Comments must be received by the Water Resources Department by May 17, 1999. The Department will review any comments received when determining whether to allow the requested allocation of conserved water. Thanks -- I was glad to get one completed, but I did feel a little uncomfortable because I feel that we really skipped a step that the rules impose under OAR 690-018-050(4) -- even if no comments have been filed in the earlier comment period, there still needs to be a 60-day waiting period between providing notice of the determination under subsection (3) (determination on the 10 points listed under this subsection) and issuing a final order allocating water. The reason there needs to be a 60-day waiting period is because the rules require it and anyone, whether they commented earlier or no, can file a protest and that time period can't be skipped. I talked about this in an email sent 12/7 but perhaps it wasn't clear.

>Williams Whalen applications can now be processed, the project is done.

Everything except for getting that sign-off from Jauker. It would be a shame to have the whole thing going and then have him come back and point out, rightfully so, in a lawsuit against WRD and/or the Trust that he had not acknowledged the loss of some acreage and authorized cancellation of a portion of his water right. I have been thinking about this a lot and it just has my gut in a knot. It seems like Mr. Jauker ought to be coming back pretty soon from Europe, perhaps if I contact Mr. -- oh, shoot, I was thinking that it was Mr. Hilger who was getting his mail and so forth, but does not have power of attorney, isn't it Hilger? -- I could find out when Jauker is definitely returning and go from there. I know it is frustrating to have this drag on, I would like it to have been done last year as well, but I can not in good legal conscience go ahead without a sign off from Jauker.

>What do we need to do to finalize the Menteer order as well?

The Menteer order was signed Jan. 6, I had our assistant send a copy of the order to you and to Andrew -- I'll have her send another to you for your files, ok? Sorry about that!

>I will be rewriting Drobcowits shortly, it seems the problem lies with me >leavng out a section from my description......will i be sending that to you? Kerry, I am working through the applications and am running into some snags. I've tried to outline the history of several of the water rights involved, which have undergone some cancellations as a result of transfers, and to confirm that all lands covered by the applicable rights are accounted for. What I've come up with is diagramed on the following pages. but let me put a narrative to it that might help.


Short and sweet, water right certificate 16115 was cancelled as a result of a transfer and 3 new ones issued — one to Zellen, one to Smith, and one, #68497, to Taylor. The ones to Zellen and Smith have since been cancelled again as part of their conserved water application which was approved but is still waiting for new certificates to issue. The lands for which applications are made for Hilger and Teague are for the lands under Cert. 68497, rather than Cert. 16115 which is no longer in existence.

In addition, the total acreage under Cert. 68497 is 2.86 acres in the SE¼ SE¼ Section 1 and 3.06 acres in the NE¼ NE ¼ Section 12. The lands covered by the Hilger and Teague applications should be the same. However, even with taking into account the 0.37 ac recently removed from irrigation due to house, shop and driveway construction on the Hilger place, the lands involved in the Hilger and Teague conserved water applications only total 2.23 acres in the SE¼ SE¼ Section 1 and 1.82 acres in the NE¼ NE ¼ Section 12; there are 0.63 acre in the SE¼ SE¼ Section 1 and 1.24 acres in the NE¼ NE ¼ Section 12 which must be accounted for.

It may be that these lands have gone out of irrigation and production over the years and this is shown by Spero's mapping. It would be simple to just cancel these acres in the conserved water order; but to do so without the applicant's involvement and knowledge would be ill-advised, to say the least.

Similar problems are discovered with Certificates 32722 (Lance, Scott, Berry, Burton and Jauker) and with C.49039, the land involved in the Burton transfer. The attached shcet should be self-explanatory as to what amount of acreage unaccounted for under these certificates.

Give me a call and we can discuss this in more detail and figure out the best approach. Thanks!

I would be happy to prepare owner affidavits voluntarily relinquishing the small difference or otherwise acknowledging the reduction through the CWRE mapping and indicating no objection to Department action taken in conjunction with the conserved water project whereby the unused portions of the rights are cancelled.

We could do revised pages 1 and 3 for the Teague and Hilger applications under 16115 (now 68497) but there is still the problem of the 1.87 acres which must be cancelled off. There's also the problem (not a huge problem, just a little one ;-)) of the 2 ODFW Exhibits which refer to 16115. Again, I would be happy to make new statements with the correct number, or we could probably make the correction ourselves and it would be ok.

There is nothing in the rules or the statue that require submission of a statement certifying that the water right has been exercised in the last 5 years, athough it would be a good thing to have some indication of that from each applicant. In this case, because the applications have already been notarized, I would suggest just having an unnotarized addendum page from each person stating that the named person certifies that the portion of the right to which the application applies has been exercised within the last 5 years according to the terms of the water right. I would be happy to prepare this and send them on to you, send them out or something else if this is problemmatic for you.

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

#### CORRECTING FINAL ORDER

Jerry N. Hilger, Gary and Alice Teague, Linda Lance, G.L. and Gwen Scott, Dorothy H. Berry, Robert and Eleanor Burton, Jakob Jauker, Dora M. Baines, John W. and Irene E. Loper and the Oregon Water Trust submitted a conserved water application and associated change in the point of diversion dated September 1, 1998. The Department issued an order approving the allocation of conserved water for Certificates 32772, 68497, 76182, and approving the associated change in the point of diversion for Certificate 49039 on June 10, 1999. The order was filed as Special Order Volume 53, pages 870-873.

Subsequent to issuance of the order, the Department has identified clerical errors in the assignment of irrigated acreage, the rates and duties, and priority dates of the associated rights established under the order.

The following information summarizes the results of the conserved water project. For each certificate involved in the application, a summary by quarter quarter section describes what acreage is part of the conserved water application, what acreage is not part of it, and what acreage will be canceled. A table then describes the irrigated acreage by landowner, the rate before and after the conserved water application, and the instream contribution.

(Special Order Volume 53, p. 870 listed Certificate 49038 as part of the Conserved Water Application. This was a clerical error and should not have been included. Certificate 76182 was erroneously omitted from Special Order Volume 53, p. 870.)

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-001-005 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order.

Jerry N. Hilger, Gary and Alice Teague, Linda Lance, G.L. and Gwen Scott, Dorothy H. Berry, Robert and Elanor Burton, Jakob Jauker, Dora M. Baines, John W. and Irene E. Loper and the Oregon Water Trust, have filed a conserved water application in which they propose to effect the conservation project by moving their points of diversion under the several water rights involved from the Williams & Whalen Ditch to Evans Creek, and reducing the amount of water diverted, appropriated and applied for irrigation of the subject lands. The applicants further proposed to allocation 100% of the water conserved to an instream right.

Pursuant to ORS 537.470 and OAR Chapter 690, Division 18, notice having been given and no comments filed within the time allowed, Conserved Water Application 98-04, together with the associated application to change a point of diversion filed by Robert and Elanor Burton, is APPROVED.

### Findings of Fact

- Certificate 32722 allows the use of waters of Evans Creek, tributary to the Rogue Basin, for irrigation of 10 acres in the SE¼ SW¼ Section 1, 7.6 acres in the NE¼ NW¼ and 11.9 acres in the NW¼ NW¼ Section 12, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, all lying north of Evans Creek. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for irrigation and shall not exceed 0.50 cubic feet per second for said lands, under a priority of 1896.
- 2) The amount historically diverted under this Certificate is 0.448 cfs. Applicants owning land to which Certificate 32722 is appurtenant propose to reduce the amount appropriated and used from 0.448 cfs to 0.288 cfs, and to allocate the amount conserved, being 0.159 cfs, to an instream right with a priority of 1896 plus one minute. The amount so allocated will be combined with the existing instream right for 0.055 cfs beginning at river mile 11 and ending at river mile 8 on Evans Creek, established under a related conservation project completed in 1996 and evidenced by the Order recorded at Special Order Volume 50, page 853.
- 3) Applicants owning land to which Certificate 32722 is appurtenant further requested that the Department permanently cancel from this Certificate the right to appropriate and use water for irrigation of 1 acre in the SE ¼ SW ¼ of Section 1, 1.18 acres in the NE¼ NW¼ Section 12 and 1.82 acres in the NW¼ NW¼ Section 12, T35 S, R 4 W, WM, which has been forfeited for nonuse.

- 4) Certificate 68497 allows the use of waters of Evans Creek, tributary to the Rogue Basin, for irrigation of 2.86 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1, and and 3.06 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, all lying north of Evans Creek. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for irrigation and shall not exceed 0.14 cubic feet per second for said lands, under a priority of 1896.
- 5) The amount historically diverted under this Certificate is 0.077 cfs. Applicants owning land to which Certificate 68497 is appurtenant propose to reduce the amount appropriated and used from 0.077 cfs to 0.048 cfs, and to allocate the amount conserved, being 0.029 cfs, to an instream right with a priority of 1896 plus one minute. The amount so allocated will be combined with the existing instream right for 0.055 cfs beginning at river mile 11 and ending at river mile 8 on Evans Creek, established under a related conservation project completed in 1996 and evidenced by the Order recorded at Special Order Volume 50, page 853.
- 6) Applicants owning land to which Certificate 68497 is appurtenant further requested that the Department permanently cancel from this Certificate the right to appropriate and use water for irrigation of 0.26 acre in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 1 and 1.24 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12, T35 S, R 4 W, WM, which has been forfeited for nonuse.
- 7) Applicant Hilger further withheld 0.37 acre from this conserved water application and requests that a remaining right certificate for 0.37 acre in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1, T35S R4W, be issued.
- 8) Certificate 76182 (previously C. 42921) was issued following approval of transfer application T4037 filed by applicant Baines for a change in place of use for 1.5 of the 3.0 acres allowed under Certificate 42921. Certificate 76182 allows the use of waters of Evans Creek, tributary to the Rogue Basin, for irrigation of 1.5 acres in the the NE ¼ NE ¼ and 1.5 acres in the SE¼ NE¼ Section 11, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, all lying north of Evans Creek. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for irrigation and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic feet per second for said lands, under a priority of 1896.
- 9) The amount historically diverted under this Certificate was 0.06 cfs. Applicants owning land to which Certificate 76182 is appurtenant propose to reduce the amount historically appropriated and used by 38%, from 0.06 cfs to 0.037 cfs, and to allocate the amount conserved, being 0.023 cfs, to an instream right with a priority of 1896 plus one minute.
- 10) The maximum amount allowed under this Certificate is 0.05 cfs. A 38% reduction of 0.05 cfs, the maximum rate allowed, is 0.031 cfs, leaving 0.019 cfs for allocation to an instream right. The amount so allocated will be combined with the existing instream right for 0.055 cfs beginning at river mile 11 and ending at river mile 8 on Evans Creek, established under a related conservation project completed in 1996 and evidenced by the Order recorded at Special Order Volume 50, page 853.

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- 11) Certificate 49039 is appurtenant to 1.7 acres in the NW ¼ NW ¼ Section 12, owned by applicants Robert and Elanor Burton. Applicants Robert and Elanor Burton have filed an application proposing to move the point of diversion for Certificate 49039 from the Williams Whalen Ditch to the same pump to be utilized under C. 32772 for 4.64 acres owned by applicants in the NW¼ NW¼ Section 12, T35S, R4W, under this conserved water application. Applicants have further voluntarily authorized cancellation for nonuse of the portion of the right appurtenant to 0.2 acre allowed under Certificate 49039, and seek approval of the new point of diversion and issuance of a remaining right certificate for irrigation of 1.5 acres.
- 12) The applicants have filed a notice with the Department that the project is complete, and have requested a final allocation of the water conserved under this project.

# Conclusions of Law

- 1) The allocation of the water conserved under this project will not injure existing water rights and no conserved water is needed to mitigate injury.
- 2) The allocation of conserved water is consistent with OAR 690-05-045.
- 3) The allocation of conserved water is consistent with ORS 537.455 to 537.500 and with OAR 690-18-010 to 690-018-050.

### ORDER

### NOW, THEREFORE, it is ORDERED:

- 1. Certificate 32722 be and the same is hereby cancelled.
- 2. The Department is directed to issue a superseding Certificate with a priority date of 1896 for diversion and use of 0.288 cfs, from Evans Creek, not to exceed 122.8 acre feet, for irrigation of 21.46 acres, being 9 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1, 6.42 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> and 10.08 acres in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, all lying north of Evans Creek, representing the reduced rate and duty and the cancellation of 4 acres.
- 3. It is further ordered that Certificate 68497 be and the same is hereby cancelled.
- 4. The Department is further directed to issue a superseding Certificate for diversion and use of 0.048 cfs from Evans Creek, not to exceed 20.47 acre feet, for irrigation of 2.86 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1, and and 3.06 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, all lying north of Evans Creek, with a priority date of 1896.
- 5. The Department is further directed to issue a remaining right Certificate for diversion and use of 0.007 cfs from Evans Creek, not to exceed 3.0 acre feet during the irrigation season, for irrigation of .37 acre lying north of Evans Creek in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 1, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, under a priority of 1896.

- 6. It is further ordered that Certificate 76182 be and the same is hereby cancelled.
- 7. The Department is further directed to issue a superseding Certificate for diversion and use of 0.031 cfs from Evans Creek, not to exceed 15.78 acre feet, for irrigation of 1.5 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the NE¼ NE¼ and 1.5 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the SE¼ SE¼ of Section 11, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, with a priority date of 1896.

Kerry, I am working through the applications and am running into some snags. I've tried to outline the history of several of the water rights involved, which have undergone some cancellations as a result of transfers, and to confirm that all lands covered by the applicable rights are accounted for. What I've come up with is diagramed on the following pages. but let me put a narrative to it that might help.  $72^{12^{3}7}$   $7^{2^{14^{9}}}$ 


Short and sweet, water right certificate 16/115 was cancelled as a result of a transfer and 3 new ones issued — one to Zellen, one to Smith, and one, #68497, to Taylor. The ones to Zellen and Smith have since been cancelled again as part of their conserved water application which was approved but is still waiting for new certificates to issue. The lands for which applications are made for Hilger and Teague are for the lands under Cert. 68497, rather than Cert. 16115 which is no longer in existence.

In addition, the total acreage under Cert. 68497 is 2.86 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1 and 3.06 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12. The lands covered by the Hilger and Teague applications should be the same. However, even with taking into account the 0.37 ac recently removed from irrigation due to house, shop and driveway construction on the Hilger place, the lands involved in the Hilger and Teague conserved water applications only total 2.23 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1 and 1.82 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12; there are 0.63 acre in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1 and 1.24 acres in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12 which must be accounted for.

It may be that these lands have gone out of irrigation and production over the years and this is shown by Spero's mapping. It would be simple to just cancel these acres in the conserved water order; but to do so without the applicant's involvement and knowledge would be ill-advised, to say the least.

Similar problems are discovered with Certificates 32722 (Lance, Scott, Berry, Burton and Jauker) and with C.49039, the land involved in the Burton transfer. The attached shcet should be self-explanatory as to what amount of acreage unaccounted for under these certificates.

Give me a call and we can discuss this in more detail and figure out the best approach. Thanks!

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Burton:

I am writing to thank you for working with the Oregon Water Trust in developing and submitting an application for a conserved water project. I have been working with Kerry KenCairn of the Oregon Water Trust in processing this application. It is delightful to see Evans Creek residents, and the creek itself, benefitting from this action.

As you were previously informed, the CWRE-prepared map for the Williams-Whalen Conserved Water Project showed that there are currently less acres irrigated than the several paper water rights had allowed. I am the applicant for a conserved water project involving the portion of water right certificate 68497 (previously Certificate 16115) which is appurtenant to my property located in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1 and the NE <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 12, Township 35 South, Range West, WM. As part of my application, a map was prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner on which were mapped the lands which have been irrigated under the portion of the right appurtenant to my property. I am and have been aware since this conserved water project was initiated that a portion of the right appurtenant to my property has not been exercised for more than 5 years, and that the CWRE-prepared map would illustrate that. I understand that when the conserved water project application is approved, the Department will cancel Certificate 68497 and issue two new certificates, one for the conserved water to instream use and a superceding certificate for the continued use of the remaining water on my property. It is and has been my expectation that the portion of the right which has not been exercised would be permanently cancelled off the right and not included in either of the subsequently-issued certificates for instream and out of stream use.

I am making this statement to confirm that I am aware of the difference in irrigated acreage between that allowed in my Certificate and that shown on the CWRE map prepared in support of my conserved water application, and to further confirm that I have abandoned any interest in the unexercised portion of the above water right appurtenant to my property, and request the Department permanently cancel that portion of the right through the processing of my conserved water application.







#### PROPOSED AND FINAL ORDER FOR ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER

Pursuant to ORS 537.470 and OAR Chapter 690, Division 18, after notice was given and no comments were filed, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, an application for allocation on conserved water submitted by:

Larry and Helen Zellen 11020 E. Evans Creek Rd. Rogue River, OR 97537

Carl and Jane Smith 11172 E. Evans Creek Rd. Rogue River, OR 97537 Oregon Water Trust 111 S.W. Front Ave., Suite 404 Portland, OR 97204

#### Background

The application for the allocation of conserved water proposes a reduction in the maximum rate of diversion allowed under Certificate 72139 in the name of Carl and Jane Smith and Certificate 72140 in the name of Larry and Helen Zellen. The water right holders (adjoining property owners) previously irrigated from the Williams and Whalen Ditch using flood irrigation. In 1995, they completed a conservation project involving a change in their points of diversion and the conversion of their method of application from flood to sprinkler irrigation.

The water right holders now pump water directly out of Evans Creek and into their respective irrigation systems. Each water right holder operates and maintains their own pumps and pipelines. The locations of the new diversions are on the water right holders' respective properties adjoining Evans Creek near River Mile (RM) 11. The conversions to sprinkler irrigation were accomplished by the installation of buried P.V.C. and aluminum pipe and sprinklers. These changes have produced a 50 percent reduction in the rates of diversion needed by the water right holders.

During normal flow years, Evans Creek contains water from the Williams and Whalen Ditch point of diversion at RM 12 to its mouth. During years when streamflows are below normal, surface flow in Evans Creek disappears at approximately RM 8. Flow reappears at the confluence with Pleasant Creek. Distribution activities on Evans Creek frequently require regulation of all post-1902 water rights. Streamflows from Pleasant Creek mask the extent to which water saved by the conservation project would normally flow to the mouth of Evans Creek.

The applicants propose regulation for the instream water right from conserved water only during periods in which surface flows do not disappear in Evans Creek. The instream water right can not be protected below the point at which the creek disappears. In addition, seepage losses from the Williams and Whalen Ditch and runoff from lands which were flood irrigated likely returned to Evans Creek above RM 8. Allocation and protection of this water below RM 8 for instream purposes could result in harm to existing downstream water rights.

There is an existing instream water right for the purpose of supporting aquatic life and minimizing pollution on Evans Creek from Pleasant Creek to the mouth. The right is evidenced by certificate 59705. The date of priority is November 3, 1983. Applications for two instream water rights have been filed by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife for flows in Evans

Creek. If issued, the rights would protect streamflows in Evans Creek from Morrison Creek at RM 25.7 to the mouth. The dates of priority for the rights would be December 7, 1990.

ORS 537.470 requires the Commission to allocate to the state a percentage of conserved water equal to the percentage of the public funds used to complete the project, up to a maximum of 75 percent, unless the applicants propose a higher allocation to the state. Public funds contributed 48 percent of the construction costs. However, the applicants have proposed that 100 percent of the conserved water be allocated to an instream water right in Evans Creek for the purpose of supporting aquatic life. No increase in out-of-stream use is proposed.

The first right modified under this order was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County as evidenced by Certificate 72139 in the name of Carl and Jane Smith. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 4, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1896.

That water right allows the use of Evans Creek, a tributary of the Rogue River, for irrigation of 1.80 acres. The amount of water which may be used under this right is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic feet per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, if available, measured at the authorized point of diversion from the source: NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, T 35 S, R 4 W, WM; 196 feet south and 616 feet east from the NW corner of the NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12. The authorized place of use is SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 1 (1.12 acres) and NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12 (0.68 acres), T 35 S, R 4 W, WM.

The second right modified under this order was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County as evidenced by Certificate 72140 in the name of Larry and Helen Zellen. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 4, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1896.

That water right allows the use of Evans Creek, a tributary of the Rogue River, for irrigation of 2.28 acres. The amount of water which may be used under this right is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic feet per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, if available, measured at the authorized point of diversion from the source: NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, T 35 S, R 4 W, WM; 385 feet south and 158 feet east from the NW corner of the NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12. The authorized place of use is SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 1 (0.67 acres) and NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12 (1.61 acres), T 35 S, R 4 W, WM.

The right to use water for the above purposes is restricted to beneficial use on the lands described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

#### Findings

- 1. The conservation projects yielded a 50 percent reduction in the rates of diversion required to meet the beneficial uses under the original water rights. The reduction is a result of eliminating seepage losses in the ditch and changing irrigation practices from flood irrigation to sprinklers.
- 2. It appears that the proposed allocation of conserved water to an instream water right will not cause harm to existing rights, if limited to the reach of Evans Creek between RM 12 and RM 8.
- 3. The proposed allocation is consistent with the requirements of OAR 690-05-045.
- 4. No conserved water is needed to mitigate harm to existing water rights.

- 5. No duty was established for these water rights. The rate for the remaining rights shall be 0.025 cubic feet per second in the names of Carl and Jane Smith and 0.03 cubic feet per second in the names of Larry and Helen Zellen. The rights may be used in rotation to allow each water right holder the use of up to 0.055 cubic feet per second, provided the total diverted by both water right holders shall not exceed 0.055 cubic feet per second.
- 6. The 0.055 cubic feet per second of conserved water is needed to support instream uses in Evans Creek. There is an instream water right on Evans Creek from Pleasant Creek (at approximately RM 8) to the mouth. There are no existing instream water rights on Evans Creek between RM 12 and RM 8.
- 7. The amount of water allocated is consistent with ORS 537.470 (3).
- 8. No conserved water will be used out-of-stream. The state's portion of the conserved water will be dedicated to an instream water right on Evans Creek from RM 12 to RM 8.
- 9. The project was constructed and completed in 1995 and conserved water may be allocated under OAR 690-18-014 (2). The applicants have filed notice of completion of the conservation measures and no additional time has been requested or is needed to finalize the allocation.
- 10. The conditions listed in the order below, in addition to the conditions and limitations provided under the decree and subsequent modifications in the rights, will protect existing water rights and shall be included in the respective water right certificates.

#### Order

Now, therefore, it hereby is ordered that:

- 1. Certificates 72139 and 72140 are canceled.
- 2. A new certificate describing the remaining portion of the existing water right evidenced by Certificate 72139 shall be issued in the name of Carl and Jane Smith. The water right shall allow for the use of Evans Creek, a tributary of the Rogue River, for irrigation of 1.80 acres. The amount of water which may be used under the right shall be limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.025 cubic feet per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, if available, measured at the authorized point of diversion from the source. The date of priority is 1896.

The authorized point of diversion is NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, T 35 S, R 4 W, WM; 196 feet south and 616 feet east from the NW corner of the NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12. The authorized place of use is SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 1 (1.12 acres) and NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12 (0.68 acres), T 35 S, R 4 W, WM.

In addition to the conditions and limitations provided under the decree and any subsequent modifications in the rights, the following condition shall be included on this right:

This right may be used in rotation with the certificate recorded at page (the right described in 3. below), State Record of Water Right Certificates, to allow the diversion and use of up to 0.055 cfs, provided the total diverted under both water rights shall not exceed 0.055 cfs. The rotation shall be in accordance with an agreement filed with and acceptable to the Watermaster. This condition shall not limit the ability of the water right holder to enter into any other rotation allowed by law.

A new certificate describing the remaining portion of the existing water right evidenced by 3. Certificate 72140 shall be issued in the name of Larry and Helen Zellen. The water right shall allow for the use of Evans Creek, a tributary of the Rogue River, for irrigation of 2.28 acres. The amount of water which may be used under the right shall be limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.03 cubic feet per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, if available, measured at the authorized point of diversion from the source. The date of priority is 1896.

The authorized point of diversion is NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12, T 35 S, R 4 W, WM; 385 feet south and 158 feet east from the NW corner of the NE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 12. A new certificate confirming the instream water right shall be issued in the name of the 4. Water Resources Department to be held in trust for the benefit of the people of the State of Oregon. Dear Mr. Smith and Mr. Zellen:

Thank you for your letter of May 21, 1996; and Mr. Zellen, for your appearance before the Water Resources Commission in June. I realize the transfer process can be a frustrating and daunting process, especially when it involves a transfer that appears to be fairly simple. I am sorry that you did not have a more positive experience in working with the Water Resources Department. As we discussed at the Commission meeting, I am hopeful that recent changes in our rules and procedures may help avoid some of the problems you encountered.

Since a transfer deals with a legal right to use water, I am sure you appreciate having a process in place that protects your legal rights. A very important part of any transfer is the maps and Final Proof Survey. As you are aware, a Certified Water Right Examiner (CWRE) completes these items. CWREs function at the private level and as such, our department has no jurisdiction over what a CWRE charges. Your suggestion to provide information about the required use of CWREs is a good idea. We are in the process of producing a brochure that includes suggestions for hiring and using CWREs. This brochure will be available to all applicants.

Your letter contains good comments concerning the change in point of diversion process. Our department is currently reviewing and updating the transfer process, so I have passed your comments on to the people involved in the review.

The gentlemen who visited you in May 1995 were members of the cooperative group working to enhance stream flows through conservation. Since your project was one of the first to be completed, this group was quite interested to see how it was progressing. They do not have the authority to do a Final Proof Survey, but I can understand how you would feel that their visit was duplicative of the final proof process.

Again, I am sorry for the problems you encountered. Thank you for taking the time to write and to attend our Commission meeting. Please contact me at the address below if you have further questions. · ....

In October 1994, we decided to change our irrigation system from flood irrigation to sprinkler irrigation thus changing our point of diversion (POD).

At the time we applied for our permit at the Water Resources Department (at the cost of \$205.00 each) we were told we needed to hire a Certified Water Examiner (CWE). We did at the cost of \$491.00 which we feel was not necessary as this information can be acquired off of our title deeds.

We were also required to place an article in the local paper to run three weeks with regard to our intent to change our POD, which we did.

In May 1995 our POD was completed. The system was then inspected by Douglas Parrow from the Water Resources Department of Salem, Alan Cook, Regional Water Resources Manager, Andrew Perkey, Oregon Water Trust and Bob Pierce, Watershed Technician (no longer with the program).

The unused water was to remain instream for fish and wildlife habitat. We did not ask for more water or to water land we had not already been watering prior to installation of the new system. This was just a simple POD and because of problems within the Water Resources Department we were inconvienced and had to wait (we feel) an unreasonable amount of time to be paid as we were inspected and reinspected many times.

With regard to the CWE, we are very upset as we should have been told from the very beginning the total cost. Instead we were charged \$491.00 and upon completion and inspections we were told before were would receive our "Certificate of Water Right" we needed the CWE to come and do a final surveyor's report which cost us \$1600.00 more that we did not anticipate and was not included in the grant.

It is our opinion that to cut down on expenses and paperwork, a surveyor is not necessary where:

1. Neither an increase or decrease in the amount of property to be irrigated.

- 2. The property has been surveyed before.
- 3. Narrow down the departments involved to save in confusion.

We feel that very few current and future landowners will be interested in changing POD's with this much unnecessary expense, time and confusion within departments of the Water Resources Department.



ORDER APPROVING APPLICATION, ALLOCATING CONSERVED WATER and APPROVING CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

8) Certificate 76182 (previously C. 42921) was issued following approval of transfer application T4037 filed by applicant Baines for a change in place of use for 1.5 of the 3.0 acres allowed under Certificate 42921. Certificate 76182 allows the use of waters of Evans Creek, tributary to the Rogue Basin, for irrigation of 1.5 acres in the the NE ¼ NE ¼ and 1.5 acres in the SE¼ NE¼ Section 11, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, WM, all lying north of Evans Creek. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for irrigation and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic feet per second for said lands, under a priority of 1896.

9) The amount historically diverted under this Certificate was 0.06 cfs. Applicants owning land to which Certificate 76182 is appurtenant propose to reduce the amount historically appropriated and used by 38%, from 0.06 cfs to 0.037 cfs, and to allocate the amount conserved, being 0.023 cfs, to an instream right with a priority of 1896 plus one minute.

10) The maximum amount allowed under this Certificate is 0.05 cfs. A 38% reduction of 0.05 cfs, the maximum rate allowed, is 0.031 cfs, leaving 0.019 cfs for allocation to an instream right. The amount so allocated will be combined with the existing instream right for 0.055 cfs beginning at river mile 11 and ending at river mile 8 on Evans Creek, established under a related conservation project completed in 1996 and evidenced by the Order recorded at Special Order Volume 50, page 853.

- 11) Certificate 49039 is appurtenant to 1.7 acres in the NW ¼ NW ¼ Section 12, owned by applicants Robert and Elanor Burton. Applicants Robert and Elanor Burton have filed an application proposing to move the point of diversion for Certificate 49039 from the Williams Whalen Ditch to the same pump to be utilized under C. 32772 for 4.64 acres owned by applicants in the NW¼ NW¼ Section 12, T35S, R4W, under this conserved water application. Applicants have further voluntarily authorized cancellation for nonuse of the portion of the right appurtenant to 0.2 acre allowed under Certificate 49039, and seek approval of the new point of diversion and issuance of a remaining right certificate for irrigation of 1.5 acres.
- 12) The applicants have filed a notice with the Department that the project is complete, and have requested a final allocation of the water conserved under this project.

## Conclusions of Law

- 1) The allocation of the water conserved under this project will not injure existing water rights and no conserved water is needed to mitigate injury.
- 2) The allocation of conserved water is consistent with OAR 690-05-045.
- 3) The allocation of conserved water is consistent with ORS 537.455 to 537.500 and with OAR 690-18-010 to 690-018-050.

### 5 Description of the Previous System

The applicant flood irrigated out of the Williams Whalen Ditch. The Williams Whalen Ditch was managed by a ditch association.

### 6 Description of the New System

The applicant will install a 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  horse power pump to divert water at the new pod. The location of the new pod has been identified and will be shown as part of the final proof. Included in the pump installation is an ODFW approved strainer type fish screen and a meter to control flow and usage. Water will be brought to the field through 1,200' of 1  $\frac{1}{4}$  " class 200 pvc pipe. The water will be distributed on field with a portable #65 rainbird, the system will incorporate a pattern of risers with quick coupler attachments for the Rainbird. The system will discharge 10.31 gpm when fully operating, at the limit of the new paper water right of 1/80th (.0125) cfs per acre.

### 7 Amount of Water Needed Under New System

0.023 cfs; 9.76 acre-feet.

### 8 Allocation of Conserved Water

The applicants propose that 100 percent of the conserved water from the 1.86 acres being applied for under the conserved water program, 0.014 cfs /5.94 acre-feet, be allocated to the state as a permanent instream water right.



### 9 Project Schedule

Project design was completed in April 1998.

Materials and supplies will be delivered to the property in the late summer of 1998

Installation of the new system will occur during the late summer/early fall of 1998.

The applicants will file the notice of project completion by March 31, 1999.

The applicants request that the allocation be finalized pursuant to OAR 690-18-062(3) concurrently with approval of this application and that the superseding certificate for the remaining right be issued to Hilger and a certificate for an instream right be issued for the conserved water prior to the 1999 irrigation season pursuant to OAR 690-18-062(4).

### **10** Effects of Proposed Allocation on Other Appropriators

The proposed allocation of the conserved water as an instream water right will not effect other appropriators. The water which the applicants are proposing to conserve was previously lost during conveyance and field application due to seepage and evaporation.

### **11 Planned Mitigation Measures**

No mitigation measures are necessary to avoid harm to other water rights.

### 12 Places of Use of Conserved Water Right

The applicants are proposing that all of the conserved water (0.014 cfs) be allocated to a permanent instream water right. The conserved water will not be used out-of-stream.

### 13 Stream Reach of Conserved Water Right

The reach of the instream water right will start at the existing point of diversion near RM 11 and end at RM 8. This right will be added to the instream right of 0.055 cfs created under the order for allocation of conserved water approved on November 16, 1996, found at Special Order Volume 50, Page 853.

### 14 Detailed Map

A detailed map of the areas affected by the conservation measures which meets the standards in OAR 690-11-070 is attached as Exhibit A.

### 15 **Project Costs**

Since the applicants are requesting allocation of 100% of the saved water to an instream water right, the project costs are immaterial to the allocation of conserved water.



### 16 Resolution of Other's Concerns

The project has been considered and approved by the Evans Creek Watershed Council (ECWC), which is made up of water right holders and other interested residents of the Evans Creek Basin. Exhibit B is the cover of the GWEB application submitted by the ECWC.

### 17 Irrigation District/Water Control District Approval

The conservation project is not located within an irrigation district or water control district.

### 18 Land Use Information

The place and type of use of the remaining right will remain the same as approved under Rogue River Decree No. 16115. The conserved water will be allocated to a permanent instream water right. I am writing to thank you for working with the Oregon Water Trust in developing and submitting an application for a conserved water project. I have been working with Kerry KenCairn of the Oregon Water Trust in processing this application. It is delightful to see Evans Creek residents, and the erock-itself-benefitting from this action

As you were previously informed, the CWRE-prepared map for the Williams-Whalen Conserved Water Project showed that there are currently less acres irrigated than the several paper water rights had allowed. For example, water right Certificate 32772 which is appurtenant to your land and to four other adjoining properties is for irrigation of a total of 10 acres in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 1, 7.6 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 12 and 11.9 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 12 and 11.9 acres lying north of Evans Creek in the NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 12. 
