SUBJECT: Water Right Transfer Application T-13590

Please find enclosed the Preliminary Determination indicating that, based on the information available, the Department intends to approve application T-13590. This document is an intermediate step in the approval process; water may not be used legally as proposed in the transfer application until a Final Order has been issued by the Department. Please read this entire letter carefully to determine your responsibility for additional action.

A public notice is being published in the Department's weekly publication, simultaneously with issuance of the Preliminary Determination. The notice initiates a period in which any person may file either a protest opposing the decision proposed by the Department in the Preliminary Determination or a standing statement supporting the Department's decision. The protest period will end 30 days after the Department's notice.

If no protest is filed, the Department will issue a Final Order consistent with the Preliminary Determination. You should receive a copy of the Final Order about 30 days after the close of the protest period.

If a protest is filed, the application may be referred to a contested case proceeding. A contested case provides an opportunity for the proponents and opponents of the decision proposed in the Preliminary Determination to present information and arguments supporting their position in a quasi-judicial proceeding.

IMPORTANT: Due to COVID-19, the Department's office is closed to walk-in services. The Department encourages the submission of protests by U.S. Mail. Please consider mailing early to ensure the Department receives the protest by the deadline specified above.

Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

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Findings of Fact

1. On January 4, 2021, MICHAEL GOSENSKI AND CYNTHIA S. HOBBS filed an application to change the place of use under Certificate 14632. The Department assigned the application number T-13590.
2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on January 26, 2021, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
3. On February 4, 2022, the Department sent a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-13590 to the applicants. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of March 26, 2022, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.
4. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:
 - Certificate:** 14632 in the name of IDA J. WING (perfected under Permit S-13307)
 - Use:** IRRIGATION of 2.0 ACRES
 - Priority Date:** OCTOBER 3, 1938
 - Rate:** 0.04 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of notice of this preliminary determination.

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-FIFTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated throughout the irrigation season from April 1st to November 1st of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Period of Use: APRIL 1ST TO NOVEMBER 1ST OF EACH YEAR

5. The Department received information from the applicant that describes the location of the authorized point of diversion for Certificate 14632 as follows:

6. Transfer Application T-13590 also proposes to change the place of use of the right to:

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

7. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
8. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-13590.
9. The proposed changes as conditioned would not result in enlargement of the right.
10. The proposed changes as conditioned would not result in injury to other water rights.
11. All other application requirements are met.

Determination and Proposed Action

The change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13590 appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be approved.


If Transfer Application T-13590 is approved, the final order will include the following:

1. *The change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13590 is approved.*
2. *The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 14632 and any related decree.*
3. *Water right Certificate 14632 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.*
4. *Water use measurement conditions:*
 - a. *Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion.*
 - b. *The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.*
 - c. *The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.*
5. *Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department. The water user shall maintain the headgate as required by the Department.*
6. *The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.*
7. *Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2023**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.*

8. *After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.*
