



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In your own words tell us what physical conservations measures you have made or propose to make and the reason for the change(s): The landowner has converted irrigation systems from wheel lines to pivots to irrigate a 40.7-acre portion of the authorized place of use under Certificate 83252 and a 10.6-acre portion of the authorized place of use under Certificate 83560. The more efficient pivot systems allow for the application of a lower instantaneous rate per acre of irrigated land and the use of a lower total volume of water applied during the irrigation season. The pivot systems apply 0.016 cfs/acre under the pivot pipe and 0.019 cfs/acre via the end guns, decreasing the instantaneous rate needed compared to the wheel line system (0.025 cfs/acre). The volume of water per acre of land irrigated has also been decreased from 5 AF/acre using the wheel lines to 3 AF/acre under the pivots and 4 AF/acre using the end guns. This Allocation of Conserved Water application is seeking to use a portion of the conserved water for irrigation of additional lands, a portion for quasi-municipal use at Young Life's Washington Family Ranch youth camp, and to dedicate a portion of the conserved water instream to benefit aquatic life.

Please provide sufficient detail for the Department to provide notice of the project.* During the 2020 irrigation season, the landowner converted from wheel line irrigation to center pivot irrigation on a 40.7-acre portion of the place of use for Certificate 83252. The pivot system irrigates a portion of one full pivot (in combination with Certificate 83560) and a half-pivot. Each system applies 0.016 cfs/acre under the pivot pipe and 0.019 cfs/acre via the end guns, decreasing the instantaneous rate needed compared to the wheel line system (0.025 cfs/acre). The volume of water per acre of land irrigated has also been decreased by using the more efficient pivot irrigation system.

Certificate 83252 authorizes the use of up to 1.34 cfs for irrigation of 53.5 acres, further limited to a rate of 1/40 cfs per acre (0.025 cfs/acre) and a duty of 5 AF/acre. The previous system used the full rate and duty authorized by the water right. The conversion from wheel line to center pivot systems affected 40.7 acres of the authorized place of use, which previously used 1.02 cfs and 203.5 AF of the authorized rate and volume. The new system has reduced the rate per acre needed to 0.016 cfs/acre under the pivot pipe (39.9 acres) and 0.019 cfs/acre using the end guns (0.8 acres). The volume of water used under the pivot is 3 AF/acre and under the end guns is 4 AF/acre. The rate and volume of water needed were calculated as follows:

Pivots: (0.016 cfs/acre) * 39.9 acres under pivots = 0.64 cfs

3 AF/acre * 39.9 acres = 119.7 AF

End guns: (0.019 cfs/acre) * 0.8 acres under end guns = 0.02 cfs

4 AF/acre * 0.8 acres = 3.2 AF

The maximum instantaneous rate needed is 0.66 cfs (pivots + end guns) and the total volume needed throughout the irrigation season is 122.9 AF.

In summary, this project has resulted in the following changes:

- A reduction in rate from 1.02 cfs to 0.66 cfs, for a resulting conservation of 0.36 cfs
- A reduction in volume from 203.5 AF to 122.9 AF, for a resulting conservation of 80.6 AF

The pivot system irrigates a portion of one full pivot (in combination with Certificate 83252) and a half-pivot. Each system applies 0.016 cfs/acre under the pivot pipe and 0.019 cfs/acre via the end guns, decreasing the instantaneous rate needed compared to the wheel line system (0.025 cfs/acre). The volume of water per acre of land irrigated has also been decreased by using the more efficient pivot irrigation system.

Certificate 83560 authorizes the use of up to 0.33 cfs for irrigation of 13.3 acres, further limited to a rate of 1/40 cfs per acre (0.025 cfs/acre) and a duty of 5 AF/acre. The previous system used the full rate and duty authorized by the water right. The conversion from wheel line to center pivot systems affected 10.6 acres of the authorized place of use, which previously used 0.27 cfs and 53.0 AF of the authorized rate and volume. The new system has reduced the rate per acre needed to 0.016 cfs/acre under the pivot pipe (10.4 acres) and 0.019 cfs/acre using the end guns (0.2 acres). The volume of water used under the pivot is 3 AF/acre and under the end guns is 4 AF/acre. The rate and volume of water needed were calculated as follows:

Pivots: (0.016 cfs/acre) * 10.4 acres under pivots = 0.17 cfs

3 AF/acre * 10.4 acres = 31.2 AF

End guns: (0.019 cfs/acre) * 0.2 acres under end guns = 0.004cfs

4 AF/acre * 0.2 acres = 0.8 AF

The maximum instantaneous rate needed is 0.174 cfs (pivots + end guns) and the total volume needed throughout the irrigation season is 32.0 AF.

In summary, this project has resulted in the following changes:

- A reduction in rate from 0.27 cfs to 0.17 cfs, for a resulting conservation of 0.10 cfs
- A reduction in volume from 53.0 AF to 32.0 AF, for a resulting conservation of 21.0 AF


