#### Authority

Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 536.750 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to temporarily transfer the use, place of use or point of diversion of water in the event of a declaration of drought, without complying with the notice and waiting requirements under ORS 540.520. Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 019 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating drought transfer applications.

#### Findings of Fact

- On June 6, 2022, DEBRA JANE DAVIS AND MADRAS FARM COMPANY, filed an application to temporarily change the places of use under Certificates 76714 and 94956 for the remainder of the 2022 irrigation season or the term of the Governor's declared drought, whichever is shorter. The Department assigned the application number T-14026.
- Notice of the application for transfer was published on June 14, 2022, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000.
- 3. The portion of the first right to be temporarily transferred is as follows:

Certificate:	76714 in the name of CENTRAL OREGON IRRIGATION DISTRICT (perfected under Permit S-23256)

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water right evidenced by Certificate 76714 allows the use of up to 50,000 acre-feet of water stored in Crane Prairie Reservoir, a tributary of the Deschutes River, for supplemental irrigation. The diversion rate is not specified and use is limited to the total volume of stored water to make up any deficiency in supply of the live flow water right appurtenant to specified lands.

#### Temporary Drought Transfer Review Criteria

- Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no evidence available that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 8. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights are present.
- 9. The Governor issued an executive order on March 2, 2022; declaring a state of drought emergency in Crook and Jefferson Counties and on March 16, 2022 declaring a state of drought emergency in Deschutes County due to drought and extreme weather conditions, which is still in effect and the water right proposed for transfer is on lands included in the area covered by the drought order.
- 10. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 11. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.<sup>1</sup> This finding is made through an abbreviated review recognizing that the transfer may be revoked under OAR 690-019-055(3) if injury to existing water rights is shown and cannot be mitigated to the satisfaction of the Director and injured parties.

#### Conclusions of Law

The temporary change in places of use proposed in Temporary Drought Transfer Application T-14026 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 536.750 and OAR 690-019-0055.

#### Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The temporary change in places of use proposed in Temporary Drought Transfer Application T-14026 are approved.
- 2. The former places of use shall not be irrigated as part of these water rights during the remainder of the 2022 irrigation season or until the end of the Governor's declared drought, whichever occurs first.
- 3. The approval of this temporary drought transfer may be revoked or modified if the Department finds the changes cause injury to any existing water right.
- The proposed change in place of use shall revert to the authorized place of use at the end of the 2022 irrigation season or the end of the Governor's declared drought, whichever occurs first.
- 5. The use of water at the temporary places of use authorized by this transfer shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of Certificate 76714 and 94956.
- The use of the remaining water rights described by Certificates 76714 and 94956 shall continue to be in accordance with the terms and conditions of Certificates 76714 and 94956.

On June 6, 2022, OWRD received your water right Temporary Transfer Application. The application was accompanied by \$200.00. Our receipt number 138350 is enclosed.

By copy of this letter, we are asking the Watermaster for a report regarding the potential for injury to existing water rights which may be caused by the requested change.

Except as provided under ORS 540.510(3) for municipalities, you may not **temporarily** use water at the new place of use or from the new point of diversion/appropriation until a final order approving the temporary transfer application has been issued by the Department. Additionally, pursuant to OAR 690-380-8010, the lands <u>from</u> which an irrigation water right is to be temporarily transferred and the land <u>to</u> which the right is to be temporarily transferred may not both receive water during the same season. If the temporary transfer is approved during an irrigation season and water has already been used at the currently authorized location during that season, then the temporary transfer will not take effect until the following season.

If the land is sold before the temporary transfer is approved, the buyer's consent to the temporary transfer will be required unless a recorded deed or other legal document clearly established that the water right was not conveyed in the sale.

Kate Brown declared a drought in Jefferson County (Executive Order #22-04), and in Deschutes County (Executive Order #22-07) on April 25, 2022. Debra Jane Davis owns lands in Deschutes County with Central Oregon Irrigation District (COID) certificate #94956/76714 water rights. Debra Jane Davis desires to transfer 3.92 acres of COID irrigation water off her property and to a property owned by Madras Farms Co. Madras Farms Co. owns lands with appurtenant North Unit Irrigation District (NUID) certificate #72279 irrigation water rights, both sourced from the Deschutes River. NUID rights are the most junior on the Upper Deschutes River and is further limited by reduced live flow due to the drought. This temporary drought transfer will provide Madras Farms Co. with senior water rights for the 2022 season. The transfer proposes to temporarily remove water from COID patron lands, transport the water to the end of the COID Pilot Butte Canal (PBC), and spill it into the NUID canal and delivered to NUID lands were identified on the application maps. 


