

Your fish screen was inspected on 11/6/2024. In reference to water right transfer file number T-14160 this letter confirms that a National Marine Fisheries Service criteria fish screen as approved by ODFW is located on the property near GPS coordinates: 44.879861, -117.104180.

In regard to the inspection of the fish screen located on Pine Creek the following has been determined:

- The screen located at coordinates 44.879861, -117.104180 is 7"x10" homemade screen using 3/332<sup>nd</sup> inch perforated plate.
- 2. This screen setup is approved for water use up to 184 gpm or .41 cfs.
- 3. All screen and pump configurations meet ODFW criteria at the time of inspection, any changes or modifications to the configurations will not be covered by this certification letter.
- 4. This screen is an end of pipe screen; therefore, no by-pass is required.
- Approval is contingent on the applicant performing adequate maintenance as necessary to keep the screens in working order, including periodic inspections and repairs to maintain proper function.

In the Matter of Transfer Application T-14160, Baker County FINAL ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

#### Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

#### Applicant

#### **Findings of Fact**

- On January 25, 2023, DIANA ADAMS filed an application to change the point of diversion under Certificate 10423. The Department assigned the application number T-14160.
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on February 7, 2023, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 3. On April 26, 2023, the Department sent a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-14160 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of May 26, 2023, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- On September 6, 2023, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-14160 and sent a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published in the Department's weekly notice on September 12, 2023, and in the Baker City Herald newspaper on September 12 and 19, 2023, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.
- 5. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 10423 in the name of CLAUDE OFFICER (confirmed by Pine Creek Decree) Use: IRRIGATION OF 0.81 ACRE AND DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE Priority Date: 1874 Limit/Duty: The amount of water to which such a right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed one-fortieth of a cubic foot per second per acre, measured at the point of diversion, and a total limitation of one acrefoot per acre during July, one acre-foot per acre in August, and one-half acre-foot per acre during September, of each year. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

### Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-0100(14), 690-380-4010(2) and 690-380-2110(2)]

- Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 10. A water delivery system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right was present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-14160.
- 11. The water right is subject to transfer as defined in ORS 540.505(4) and OAR 690-380-0100(14).
- 12. The proposed point of diversion diverts water from the same source of surface water as the authorized point of diversion, as required by OAR 690-380-2110(2).
- 13. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
- 14. The proposed change would not result in injury to other existing water rights.
- 15. All other application requirements are met.


### Conclusions of Law

  - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.
- 8. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before October 1, 2025. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
- After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.



#### Protests

Under the provisions of ORS 540.520(6) & (7) and OAR 690-380-4030, within 30 days after the last date of publication of the newspaper notice or the Department's weekly notice as prescribed by OAR 690-380-4020, whichever is later, any person may file, jointly or severally, a protest expressing opposition of approval of the transfer application and disagreement with this Preliminary Determination or a standing statement in support of this Preliminary Determination. If this Preliminary Determination determines that a change in point of diversion or appropriation would result in injury, the applicant may file a notification of intent to pursue approval of the transfer under OAR 690-380-5030 to 690-380-5050. - If you are the applicant, a protest fee of \$480 required by ORS 536.050; and

### **Requests for Standing**

Under the provisions of OAR 690-380-4030(5), the Department shall provide to persons who have filed standing statements as defined under OAR 690-380-0100(11) notice of any differences between the Department's Preliminary Determination and the Final Order, notice of a hearing on the application under OAR 137-003-0535, and an opportunity to request limited party status or party status in the hearing.

Requests for standing must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than 30 days after the last date of publication of the newspaper notice or the Department's weekly notice as prescribed by OAR 690-380-4020, whichever is later. Requests for standing must be in writing, and must include the following:

- The requester's name, mailing address and telephone number;
- If the requester is representing a group, association or other organization, the name, address and telephone number of the represented group;

If after hearing the Department issues a proposed Final Order finding that a change in point of diversion or appropriation will result in injury, the applicant may file a notification of intent to pursue approval of the transfer under OAR 690-380-5030 to 690-380-5050 within 15 days of receipt of the proposed order. If the Director issues a Final Order by default, the Department designates the relevant portions of its files on this matter, including all materials that you have submitted relating to this matter, as the record for purpose of proving a *prima facie* case upon default.

You may be represented by an attorney at the hearing. Legal aid organizations may be able to assist a party with limited financial resources. Generally, partnerships, corporations, associations, governmental subdivisions, or public or private organizations are represented by an attorney. However, consistent with OAR 690-002-0020 and OAR 690-137-0555, an agency representative may represent partnerships, corporations, associations, governmental subdivisions or public, or private organizations if the Department determines that appearance of a person by an authorized representative will not hinder the orderly and timely development of the record in this case.



### Required items needing your immediate attention:

- 2. Respond in writing by May 26, 2023, with acknowledgement that you agree to the proposed action and conditions.
- 3. If you find any errors, please let me know.
- REQUIRED: You must submit a Report of Ownership for the lands where the water right(s) are currently located (i.e., the FROM lands). This report:
  - a) Must be prepared by a title company;
  - b) Shall include a "prepared by" statement and the date the title company prepared the report printed on the cover sheet;
    - i. Prepared within 3 months of the Draft Preliminary Determination showing current ownership; OR
    - ii. Prepared within 3 months of recording of a water right conveyance agreement; OR
    - iii. Have a prepared date showing ownership at the time a water right conveyance agreement was recorded.

If water right conveyance agreements are involved, it is helpful to provide copies of those agreements along with the Report of Ownership.

IMPORTANT: In order for the Department to clearly understand the date that the title company prepared the Report of Ownership, the title company must indicate/state the date that they prepared the report on the coversheet and/or first page of the report.

The Watermaster has required a water measurement device(s) at the new diversion point(s) prior to diversion of water. Enclosed is a contact information sheet to assist you in pursuing additional information or approval of the required (or alternate) device(s).

This transfer will require installation of a fish screen at the new diversion point prior to diversion of water. You may not divert water prior to installation and approval of the fish screen by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). You may wish to contact the ODFW staff person listed on the enclosed contact sheet for more information about the screen and to determine a reasonable timeline.

Please note the proposed date by which all conditions must be met: October 1, 2024. If the required completion date is insufficient to comply with any of the conditions, you may request more time, at no cost to you, during this stage of processing. ### What happens next...

Once the Preliminary Determination is issued a publication period is required. You are responsible for sending a check to cover the cost of publication prior to the issuance of the Preliminary Determination and publication of notice. As outlined in OAR 690-380-4020(3), publication costs include both the direct cost of the notice and indirect processing costs (not to exceed 20% of the direct costs) for processing.

Issuance of the Preliminary Determination will occur shortly after we receive:

- 1. Your written response to the conditions and proposed action in the Draft Preliminary Determination (e-mail is acceptable); and
- 2. The Report of Ownership, including affidavits of consent from any landowners shown in the ownership report who have not signed the transfer application. The title company must indicate/state the date that they prepared the ownership report on the coversheet and/or first page of the report.

If we do not receive the items listed above by May 26, 2023, a Preliminary Determination may be issued denying the application as incomplete.

- Authority. The OWRD has been authorized pursuant to ORS 536.055 to enter into a voluntary agreement with any
  applicant, permittee or regulated entity (collectively Applicant) for expediting or enhancing a regulatory process. In
  making this agreement, OWRD shall require the applicant to pay the full cost of expedited process.
- Restrictions. Applicant and OWRD agree that this Agreement shall not be construed to restrict in any way the decisions and actions by OWRD. OWRD shall be free to exercise independent judgment consistent with existing laws and regulations.
- Effective Date and Duration. Unless otherwise terminated by non-deposit of funds by the Applicant, this Agreement shall become effective on the date on which both parties have signed the Agreement and the full deposit of the estimated cost of the proposed service.
- 4. Consideration.
  - Applicant shall pay OWRD in advance for actual costs incurred by OWRD. The estimated maximum reimbursement payable to OWRD under this Agreement is \$1,452.95. Applicant agrees to pay the full amount of \$1,452.95 to OWRD prior to commencement of any work stated in this Agreement. This payment will be placed in an account administered by OWRD and drawn upon as costs are actually incurred. By copy of this letter, we are asking the Watermaster for a report regarding the potential for injury to existing water rights which may be caused by the requested change. A review form will also be sent to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to determine if a fish screen is needed.

This application <u>may</u> require publication of a notice for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper with general circulation in the area where the water right is located. If it is determined that newspaper notice will be required, the Department will prepare the notice and notify you of the cost. 
