In the Matter of Transfer Application T-14274, Curry County FINAL ODER APPROVING A CHANGE FROM A SURFACE WATER POINT OF DIVERSION TO A GROUNDWATER POINT OF APPROPRIATION AND A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE

Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Applicant

CITY OF BROOKINGS ATTN: ANTHONY BARON 898 ELK DR BROOKINGS, OR 97415

Findings of Fact

- On July 3, 2023, CITY OF BROOKINGS, ATTN: ANTHONY BARON, filed an application for a change in point of diversion and change in place of use under Certificate 83682. The Department assigned the application number T-14274
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on July 18, 2023, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- The application indicates that a temporary transfer T-13452 was previously approved by the Department. The applicant has been using the proposed additional point of diversion (POD 2) since August 2020.
- 4. The application also indicates the POD 2 is a "caisson system with an open bottom... designed for withdrawal of surface water from the Chetco River in a similar fashion to the Ranney Collector at the City's existing authorized surface water point of diversion."

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- 5. On September 28, 2023, the Department conducted a site inspection of POD 2 and determined that the caisson system draws groundwater, in a similar fashion as a shallow well. The Department recognizes that groundwater is being drawn from POD 2 per ORS.537.515 (5). As such, the Department has determined that the proper transfer changes to be filed is a surface water to groundwater transfer for 1.0 cfs from Certificate 83682.
- On November 21, 2023, the applicant's agent was notified that the place of use identified in Table 2 under Certificate 83682, did not match the proposed "to" lands on the transfer application map.
- 7. On November 22, 2023, the applicant's agent submitted a revised transfer application Table 2 under Certificate 83682.
- 8. On January 4, 2024, the applicant's agent submitted additional information describing the caisson system.
- 9. On February 12, 2024, The Department confirmed that the caisson system appropriates groundwater, not surface water.
- On February 26, 2024, The Department issued a Draft Preliminary Determination proposing to deny the application because the application required a surface water to groundwater change.
- 11. On May 6, 2024, the agent for the applicant submitted revised pages for a surface water point of diversion (POD) to groundwater point of appropriation (POA) change and to change the place of use under Certificate 83682.
- 12. On May 6, 2024, the applicant's agent provided the Department with a revised transfer application and map illustrating a change from surface water to groundwater, the required additional fees, and a geologist report for the change in POD to POA.
- 13. On August 29, 2024, the Department sent a copy of the revised draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-14274 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of September 28, 2024, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.

- 14. On October 3, 2024, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-14274 and sent a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published in the Department's weekly notice on October 9, 2024, and in the Curry Coastal Pilot newspaper on October 9, 2024, and October 16, 2024, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notices.
- 15. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-0100(14), 690-380-4010(2), 690-380-2200 and 690-380-2110(2)]

- 18. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 19. A water delivery system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right was present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-14274.
- 20. Transfer Application T-14274 proposes to change the point of diversion from surface water to a hydraulically connected well approximately 2100 feet downstream. Because the proposed point of diversion is more than 1000 feet from the authorized point of diversion, ORS 540.531 requires the applicant to provide evidence from a licensed geologist indicating that the new point of diversion meets the requirements of ORS 540.531(2)(a(A)) to (a(C)):
 - (A). The new point of diversion appropriates ground water from an aquifer that is hydraulically connected to the authorized surface water source;
 - (B). The proposed change in point of diversion will not result in enlargement of the original water right or in injury to other water right holders;
 - (C). The use of the new point of diversion will affect the surface water source similarly to the authorized point of diversion specified in the water use subject to transfer.
- 21. A Department staff member and licensed geologist, reviewed the data and concluded that the proposed point of appropriation, a well, which is located approximately 250 feet from Chetco River, meets the criteria set forth in ORS 540.531(2)(a(A)) to (a(C)).
- 22. The water right is subject to transfer as defined in ORS 540.505(4) and OAR 690-380-0100(14).
- 23. The proposed changes, as conditioned, would not result in enlargement of the right.
- 24. The proposed changes, as conditioned, would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 25. All other application requirements are met.

Conclusions of Law:

The change of a surface water point of diversion to a groundwater point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-14274 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The change of a surface water point of diversion to a groundwater point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-14274 are approved.
- The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 83682 and any related decree.
- Approval of this transfer application does not constitute nor grant legal access onto or through another person's property for purposes of accessing the new point of appropriation or the new place of use.
- 4. Water right Certificate 83682 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
- 5. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (POA 1), together with that diverted at the original point of diversion (POD 1) shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion (POD 1).
- Water shall be acquired from the same source of surface water as the original point of diversion.
- The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
- 8. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion (new and existing).
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 9. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before October 1, 2031. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.

10. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.



Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Applicant

Findings of Fact

- On July 3, 2023, CITY OF BROOKINGS, ATTN: ANTHONY BARON, filed an application for a change in point of diversion and change in place of use under Certificate 83682. The Department assigned the application number T-14274
- Notice of the application for transfer was published on July 18, 2023, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- The application indicates that temporary transfer T-13452 was previously approved by the Department. The applicant has been using the proposed additional point of diversion (POD 2) since August 2020.
- 4. The application also indicates the POD 2 is a "caisson system with an open bottom... designed for withdrawal of surface water from the Chetco River in a similar fashion to the Ranney Collector at the City's existing authorized surface water point of diversion."

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, any person may file a protest or standing statement within 30 days after the last date of publication of the newspaper notice or the Department's weekly notice as prescribed by OAR 690-380-4020, whichever is later, of this preliminary determination.

- 5. On September 28, 2023, the Department conducted a site inspection of POD 2 and determined that the caisson system draws groundwater, in a similar fashion as a shallow well. The Department recognizes that groundwater is being drawn from POD 2 per ORS.537.515 (5). As such, the Department has determined that the proper transfer to be filed is a surface water to groundwater transfer for 1.0 cfs from Certificate 83682.
- 6. On November 21, 2023, the applicant's agent was notified that the place of use identified in Table 2 under Certificate 83682, did not match the proposed "to" lands on the transfer application map.
- 7. On November 22, 2023, the applicant's agent submitted a revised transfer application Table 2 under Certificate 83682.
- On January 4, 2024, the applicant's agent submitted additional information describing the caisson system.
- 9. On February 12, 2024, The Department confirmed that the caisson system appropriates groundwater, not surface water.
- On February 26, 2024, The Department issued a Draft Preliminary Determination proposing to deny the application because the application required a surface water to groundwater change.
- 11. On May 6, 2024, the agent for the applicant submitted revised pages for a surface water point of diversion (POD) to groundwater point of appropriation (POA) change and to change the place of use under Certificate 83682.
- 12. On May 6, 2024, the applicant's agent provided the Department with a revised transfer application and map for a change from surface water to groundwater, the required additional fees, and a geologist report for the change in POD to POA.
- 13. On August 29, 2024, the Department sent a copy of the revised draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-14274 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of September 28, 2024, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-0100(14), 690-380-4010(2), 690-380-2200 and 690-380-2110(2)]

17. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.

- A water delivery system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right was present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-14274.
- 19. Transfer Application T-14274 proposes to change the point of diversion from surface water to a hydraulically connected well approximately 2100 feet downstream. Because the proposed point of diversion is more than 1000 feet from the authorized point of diversion, ORS 540.531 requires the applicant to provide evidence from a licensed geologist indicating that the new point of diversion meets the requirements of ORS 540.531(2)(a(A)) to (a(C)):
 - (A). The new point of diversion appropriates ground water from an aquifer that is hydraulically connected to the authorized surface water source;
 - (B). The proposed change in point of diversion will not result in enlargement of the original water right or in injury to other water right holders;
 - (C). The use of the new point of diversion will affect the surface water source similarly to the authorized point of diversion specified in the water use subject to transfer.
- 20. A Department staff member and licensed geologist, reviewed the data and concluded that the proposed point of appropriation, a well, which is located approximately 250 feet from Chetco River, meets the criteria set forth in ORS 540.531(2)(a(A)) to (a(C)).
- 21. The water right is subject to transfer as defined in ORS 540.505(4) and OAR 690-380-0100(14).
- 22. The proposed changes, as conditioned, would not result in enlargement of the right.
- 23. The proposed changes, as conditioned, would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 24. All other application requirements are met.

Determination and Proposed Action

The change of a surface water point of diversion to a groundwater point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-14274 appear to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be approved.

If Transfer Application T-14274 is approved, the final order will include the following:

1. The change of a surface water point of diversion to a groundwater point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-14274 are approved.

- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 83682 and any related decree.
- 3. Approval of this transfer application does not constitute nor grant legal access onto or through another person's property for purposes of accessing the new point of diversion or the new place of use.
- 4. Water right Certificate 83682 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
- 5. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion (POA 1), together with that diverted at the original point of diversion (POD 1) shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion (POD 1).
- 6. Water shall be acquired from the same source of surface water as the original point of diversion.
- 7. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
- 8. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion (new and existing).
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 9. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2031**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
- 10. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.

Protests

Under the provisions of ORS 540.520(6) & (7) and OAR 690-380-4030, within 30 days after the last date of publication of the newspaper notice or the Department's weekly notice as prescribed by OAR 690-380-4020, whichever is later, any person may file, jointly or severally, a protest expressing opposition of approval of the transfer application and disagreement with this Preliminary Determination or a standing statement in support of this Preliminary Determination. If this Preliminary Determination determines that a change in point of diversion or appropriation would result in injury, the applicant may file a notification of intent to pursue approval of the transfer under OAR 690-380-5030 to 690-380-5050. Protests and standing statements must be received by the Water Resources Department within 30 days after the last date of publication of the newspaper notice or the Department's weekly notice as prescribed by OAR 690-380-4020, whichever is later.

Protests must be in writing and received in hard copy form with the appropriate statutory protest filing fee; protests cannot be filed by electronic mail. [OAR 690-002-0025(3) and 690-380-0100(9)]. The protest must include the following:

- The person's name, address, and telephone number;
- All reasonably ascertainable issues and all reasonably available arguments supporting the person's position by the close of the protest period. Failure to raise a reasonably ascertainable issue in a protest or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the Department an opportunity to respond to the issue may preclude consideration of the issue during the hearing;
- If you are the applicant, a protest fee of \$480 required by ORS 536.050; and

If you are not the applicant, a protest fee of \$950 required by ORS 536.050 and proof of service of the protest upon the applicant.

Requests for Standing

Under the provisions of OAR 690-380-4030(5), the Department shall provide to persons who have filed standing statements as defined under OAR 690-380-0100(11) notice of any differences between the Department's Preliminary Determination and the Final Order, notice of a hearing on the application under OAR 137-003-0535, and an opportunity to request limited party status or party status in the hearing.

Requests for standing must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than 30 days after the last date of publication of the newspaper notice or the Department's weekly notice as prescribed by OAR 690-380-4020, whichever is later. Requests for standing must be in writing, and must include the following:

- The requester's name, mailing address and telephone number;
- If the requester is representing a group, association or other organization, the name, address and telephone number of the represented group;
- A statement that the requester supports the preliminary determination as issued.

After the protest period has ended, the Director will either issue a Final Order or schedule a contested case hearing. The contested case hearing will be scheduled only if a protest has been filed under OAR 690-380-4030. In accordance with OAR 690-380-4200, notice and conduct of the hearing shall:

- Be under the applicable provisions of ORS 183.310 to 183.550, pertaining to contested cases, and the hearing shall be held in the area where the rights are located unless all parties stipulate otherwise; and
- If a protest has asserted that a water right to be transferred has been forfeited through non-use, include the notice and procedures described in OAR 690-017-0500 to 690-017-0900.

If after hearing the Department issues a proposed Final Order finding that a change in point of diversion or appropriation will result in injury, the applicant may file a notification of intent to pursue approval of the transfer under OAR 690-380-5030 to 690-380-5050 within 15 days of receipt of the proposed order. Notwithstanding 690-002-0175, if the applicant files a notification of intent to pursue approval of the transfer under OAR transfer under 690-380-5030 to 690-380-5050, the deadline for filing exceptions to the proposed order shall be 30 days after the Department

provides notice to the parties that the transfer does not meet the requirements of 690-380-5030 to 690-380-5050.

If you do not request a hearing within 30 days after the close of the protest period, or if you withdraw a request for a hearing, notify the Department or the administrative law judge that you will not appear, or fail to appear at a scheduled hearing, the Director may issue a final order by default. If the Director issues a Final Order by default, the Department designates the relevant portions of its files on this matter, including all materials that you have submitted relating to this matter, as the record for purpose of proving a *prima facie* case upon default.

You may be represented by an attorney at the hearing. Legal aid organizations may be able to assist a party with limited financial resources. Generally, partnerships, corporations, associations, governmental subdivisions, or public or private organizations are represented by an attorney. However, consistent with OAR 690-002-0020 and OAR 690-137-0555, an agency representative may represent partnerships, corporations, associations, governmental subdivisions or public, or private organizations if the Department determines that appearance of a person by an authorized representative will not hinder the orderly and timely development of the record in this case.

1 Introduction

Summit Water Resources, LLC (Summit) has prepared this technical memorandum for the City of Brookings (City) to provide hydrogeologic information in support of a change from a surface water point of diversion (POD) to a groundwater point of appropriation (POA), as required by Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 690-380-2130. Per these rules, a surface water use subject to transfer may change from the surface water (POD) to groundwater POA if the following conditions are met:

- a) The criteria of OAR 690-380-5000 are met (review criteria for all transfers).
- b) The proposed POA appropriates groundwater from an aquifer that is hydraulically connected to the authorized surface water source.
- c) The proposed POA will affect the surface water source 'similarly' to the authorized POD. 'Similarly' is defined in OAR 690-380-2130 as meaning that use of groundwater at the proposed POA will result in stream depletion of at least 50 percent of the rate of appropriation within 10 days of continuous pumping.
- d) The withdrawal of groundwater at the proposed POA is located within 500 feet of the authorized surface water source and, when the surface water source is a stream, is also located within 1,000 feet upstream or downstream of the original POD; or, if these prescribed distances are not met, the applicant shall submit evidence prepared by a licensed geologist that demonstrates that the use of the groundwater at the proposed POA will meet items a), b), and c) described above.

The location of the proposed POA is within 500 feet of the authorized surface water source, but is located greater than 1,000 feet downstream of the original POD. Therefore, this memorandum

provides supporting evidence that the use of groundwater at the proposed POA will meet the criteria described above.

2 Review and Analysis

This section provides a review and analysis of the hydrogeologic information required by OAR 690-380-2130 to support a change from a surface water point of diversion to a groundwater point of appropriation.

2.1 Criteria of OAR 690-380-5000

The criteria in OAR 690-380-5000 require that the water right to be transferred is subject to transfer and is not cancelled pursuant to ORS 540.610, the proposed transfer would not result in injury, and the proposed transfer would not result in enlargement. Certificate 83682 is a water right subject to transfer and has not been cancelled. There are no intervening PODs on the surface water source between the authorized POD and the proposed POA, and the proposed POA is downstream of the authorized POD; therefore, the change proposed by T-14274 will not result in injury to other existing water rights for the surface water source. Transfer T-14274 does not propose a change in the rate of water use or the character of water use; therefore, the proposed change will not result in enlargement. Summit expects OWRD to also evaluate these criteria as part of the transfer application review process.

2.2 Hydraulic Connection to Authorized Surface Water Source

The Chetco River, within the reach including the confluence of Mill Creek and North Fork Chetco River where the authorized POD and proposed POA are located, is as a wandering gravel-bed river characterized by active deposition and channel migration (Wallick et al., 2012). The channel bed of the active river channel, the flanking river sediment, and the gravel bars are comprised of coarse sand and gravel (Wallick et al., 2012) that sit atop of, and are bounded by, consolidated, interlayered mudstone and sandstone of the Dothan Formation (Peck and Wells, 1961). The channel of the Chetco River within this reach actively migrates back and forth between the valley walls in response to higher flows and sediment deposition (Wallick et al., 2012), resulting in a package of river deposited sediment (alluvium) between the valley walls. Formation samples of the alluvium collected from exploratory test borings completed at the location where the authorized POD was constructed indicated a unconsolidated mixture of coarse sand, small to medium gravel, and scattered cobbles with rare silt and clay (Ranney Method Western Corporation, 1988).

A map of surficial geology in the vicinity of the authorized POD and proposed POA is provided in Figure 1. Two cross sections were developed to show the occurrence, extent, and thickness of hydrogeologic units in proximity to the authorized POD and proposed POA. The location of the crosssections are shown on Figure 2, and the cross-sections are provided in Figure 3 and Figure 4.

Hydraulic connection of the alluvial aquifer (in which the proposed POA is constructed) to the Chetco River (the authorized surface water source) is demonstrated by the following:

Constant rate drawdown testing of a test well installed in the alluvium at the location where the authorized POD was constructed indicated stabilized drawdown (i.e., recharge boundary associated with the Chetco River) within 1 hour of the start of test pumping (Ranney Method Western Corporation, 1988).

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- Static water levels and stabilized pumping water levels measured in the test well during the constant rate drawdown testing corresponded with the measured trend in the stage of the Chetco River (Ranney Method Western Corporation, 1988).
- The static water level measured in the proposed POA (Figure 3) and the authorized POD (Figure 4) are approximately the same elevation as the water surface of the Chetco River at the closest adjacent point.
- The proposed POA (Figure 3) is completed in the alluvium to a similar depth as the authorized POD (Figure 4) and is located at a similar distance from the active channel of the Chetco River.

As a final note, the static water level of groundwater within the allovial aquifer, which corresponds with the water level of the Chetco River, is substantially different that the static water level of groundwater within the bedrock aquifer that lies below the allovium and forms the valley walls bounding the allovium (see Figure 3 and Figure 4). This difference in water level elevation between the allovial aquifer and the bedrock aquifer indicates that the groundwater in the allovial aquifer is not hydraulically connected to the groundwater in the bedrock aquifer.

2.3 Groundwater Use Affecting the Authorized Surface Water Source Similarly

To evaluate whether the proposed POA will affect the authorized surface water source 'similarly', the analytical stream depletion model used by OWRD to evaluate stream depletion was used. Based on the local hydrogeologic system described above, the Jenkins (1970) model is most appropriate given the coarse-grained nature of the Chetco river deposits. Input parameters for the stream depletion model are provided below in Table 2.

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Stream depletion model results are included as Appendix 1 to this technical memorandum and summarized below:

Based on the Jenkins (1970) model, stream depletion of 50 percent occurs within the first 1 hour of pumping and 97 percent occurs at 10 days of pumping, exceeding the criteria specified by OAR 690-380-2130 for determining that the proposed POA will affect the authorized surface water source 'similarly' (i.e., at least 50 percent stream depletion within 10 days of continuous pumping).

3 Conclusion

In summary, the change from a surface water POD to groundwater POA proposed by transfer application T-14274 satisfies all of the criteria of OAR 690-380-2130. Specifically:

- a) Certificate 83682 is a water right subject to transfer and has not been cancelled, and the proposed changes would not result in enlargement or injury.
- b) The alluvial aquifer in which the proposed POA is constructed is in hydraulic connection with the authorized surface water source.
- c) Stream depletion modeling based on a combination of measured aquifer parameters and conservative assumptions indicates that the proposed POA will affect the authorized surface water source 'similarly'.

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


