IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF HUMBOLT LAND & LIVESTOCK CO. FOR APPROVAL OF CHANGES IN PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER FROM TROUT CREEK

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 2659

On May 31, 1972, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Humbolt Land & Livestock Company for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion from Trout Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

By Decree of the Circuit Court for Harney County, dated February 23, 1916, in the matter of Edwin B. Hill, et al. vs. the American Land & Livestock Company, et al., a right was adjudicated to Gustave O. Schreiber (also tabulated in the names of C. E. Thomas and L. W. Walter) for use of water from Trout Creek, under a date of priority of 1884, for the irrigation of a certain 20.0 acres in E½ NW% SW% of Section 13, Township 39 South, Range 35 East, W.M.

By the said Decree a right was also adjudicated to C. E. Thomas and L. W. Walter for use of water from Trout Creek, under a date of priority of 1884, for irrigation of a certain 14.0 acres in W_2 NW4 SW4 of said Section 13.

The authorized point of diversion is located 410 feet North and 380 feet East from the Southwest Corner of the NW4 NW4 of Section 29, Township 39 South, Range 36 East, W.M., being within the NW4 NW4 of said Section 29.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the place of use and point of diversion therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof a certain 19.4 acres in SE½ SW½ (South and East of ditch) of Section 7; 0.6 acre in NW½ NE¾ (West of ditch), and 14.0 acres in SW½ SE½ (North of ditch) of Section 18, Township 39 South, Range 37

East, W.M. from a point of diversion located 20 feet North and 310 feet East from the Center Corner of Section 17, being within the SW4 NE½ of Section 17, Township 39 South, Range 37 East, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in the Burns Times-Herald, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Harney County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of September 9, 16 and 23, 1976.

Mr. Walter N. Perry, Water Resources Department, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from Trout Creek, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the diversion of water at the new point of diversion shall be limited to the water available at the old point of diversion on Trout Creek under the subject water right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be carried out prior to the diverting of water at the new point of diversion as herein confirmed:

That the diversion works shall include a weir or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster. It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1979.
