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



ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 2681

On July 28, 1972, Henry L. and Wanda G. McAlmond filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in place of use and point of diversion of water from Williams Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to George H. Collins, Mary J. John, J. H. Gotcher, J. H. Miller, George Sparlin and Albert Bigelow and recorded at page 37485, Volume 29, State Record of Water Right Certificates confirms a right to the use of not to exceed 2.25 cubic feet per second of water from Williams Creek for the irrigation of, among other lands, 11.2 acres in NE% NW%, Section 26, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of July 15, 1913. These lands are irrigated by means of Dixon-Sparlin ditch from a point of diversion located 680 feet North and 200 feet East from the SW corner of Section 35, being within the SW% SW%, Section 35, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the land above described, propose to transfer the water right therefrom, without loss of priority, to 11.2 acres in NE% NE%, Section 27, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M., and to irrigate these lands from a point of diversion to be located 250 feet South and 200 feet West from the North % corner of Section 26, being within the NE% NE%, Section 26, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

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Notice of the filing of the application was given by publication setting forth a time and place certain for hearing objections to the proposed change in point of diversion of water, if any there were, namely: at the county courthouse in Grants Pass, Oregon, on January 30, 1973, at 9:30 a.m. The notice was published in the <u>Illinois Valley News</u>, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Josephine County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of December 7, 14 and 21, 1972. The date set for hearing in said notice was not less than thirty days after the last publication of the notice.

ALL GOTTOD

Mr. Robert Steimer, Watermaster of District No. 14, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in place of use of water is approved and the water right hereinbefore described as appurtenant to 11.2 acres in NE% NW%, Section 26, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of July 15, 1913, be severed therefrom and simultaneously and without loss of priority transferred to 11.2 acres in NE% NE%, Section 27, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from Williams Creek, to-wit:

From a point located 680 feet North and 200 feet East from the SW corner of Section 35, being within the SW% SW% of Section 35, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

To a point to be located 250 feet South and 200 feet West from the North % corner of Section 26, being within the NE% NE% of Section 26, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M. for the irrigation of 11.2 acres in NE% NE%, Section 27, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of July 15, 1913, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use and the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1974.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.14 cubic feet per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices.

> That the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a wair, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that certificate of water right heretofore issued to George H. Collins, Mary J. John, J. H. Gotcher, J. H. Miller, George Sparlin and Albert Bigelow and recorded at page 37485, Volume 29, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the lands not involved in this proceeding and upon receipt of proof setisfactory to the State Engineer of application of water to beneficial use and completion of the authorized change in point of diversion, a certificate of water right shall be issued to Henry L. and Wanda G. McAlmond confirming the extent to which the water has been applied beneficially and change in point of diversion.
