## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This is to Certify, That

CARL TAYLOR AND LYNN TAYLOR

of Route 3, Hood River, State of Oregon, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE WATER BOARD of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of a tributary of Unnamed stream branch of Indian Creek Hood River for the purpose of Irrigation ~~of~~ <sup>3</sup> acres under Permit No. 5059 of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon and duly confirmed by order of the STATE WATER BOARD of Oregon, made and entered of record in the Record of Proceedings of said Board, at Salem, in Volume 1, at page 447, on the 15th day of November, 1922; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 9, 1921

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed ~~8.10~~ <sup>8.04</sup> cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. ~~The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.~~

A description of the lands under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or, if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows: ~~7 acres in the Southeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Northeast quarter of Section Four, Township Two North, Range Ten East of Willamette Meridian, in Hood River County, Oregon.~~

The right to the use of the water for irrigation purposes is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right.

accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from  
May 9, 1921  
that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes  
aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed  
0.04 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.  
The point of diversion is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 4, T. 2 N., R. 10 E., W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other  
right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second  
per acre,

and shall  
conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right  
is appurtenant, is as follows:



to confirm the remaining right not involved in the change and supersedes the  
certificate heretofore issued to Carl Taylor and Lynn Taylor recorded at  
Page 3802, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place  
of use herein described, and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies  
established by the Water Policy Review Board.

ORDER APPROVING  
TRANSFER NO. 2889

On August 21, 1973, Frank S. Buehler filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from an unnamed stream branch of Indian Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to Carl Taylor and Lynn Taylor and recorded at page 3802, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right to the use of not to exceed 0.10 cubic foot per second of water from an unnamed stream branch of Indian Creek for the irrigation of, among other lands, 4.0 acres in SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 4, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, W.M., with a date of priority of May 9, 1921. These lands are irrigated from a point of diversion located 160 rods South and 32 rods West from the Northeast corner of Section 4, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 4, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to irrigate these lands from a point of diversion to be located 280 feet North and 370 feet West from the East  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of Section 4, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 4, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, W.M.

Notice by publication as provided by ORS 540.520 was not given in connection with this application for the reason said Section provides notice is not required on an application for a change in point of diversion of water of less than one-fourth mile where there are no intervening diversions.

The lands involved herein are within the boundaries of the Hood River Irrigation District and the Board of Directors of said District approved the



proposed change in point of diversion at a regular meeting held January 16, 1974.

Mr. Bill Porfily, Watermaster of District No. 3, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from an unnamed stream branch of Indian Creek, to wit:

From a point located 160 rods South and 32 rods West from the Northeast corner of Section 4, being within the  $SE\frac{1}{4}$   $SE\frac{1}{4}$   $NE\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 4, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, W.M.

To a point to be located 280 feet North and 370 feet West from the East  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of Section 4, being within the  $SE\frac{1}{4}$   $NE\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 4, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, W.M.

for the irrigation of 4.0 acres in  $SE\frac{1}{4}$   $SE\frac{1}{4}$   $NE\frac{1}{4}$ , Section 4, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, W.M., with a date of priority of May 9, 1921, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1975.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices.

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.



It is FURTHER ORDERED that certificate of water right heretofore issued to Carl Taylor and Lynn Taylor and recorded at page 3802, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the lands not involved in this proceeding and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the State Engineer of completion of the authorized change in point of diversion, a certificate of water right shall be issued to Frank S. Buehler confirming the change in point of diversion.
