


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

ORDER AFFROVING TRANSFER NO. 2532

On June 9, 1971, Dr. William M. Soper filed an application in the office of the Water Resources Director for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Simpson Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to Arthur G. Randall and recorded at Page 11572, Volume 10, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirmed a right to the use of not to exceed 1.5 cubic feet per second of waters of Simpson Creek for development of 1.5 theoretical horsepower (not electrical) and for the irrigation of 15.0 acres in the SW2 SE2, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, W.M., with a date of priority of November 18, 1955. These lands were irrigated from a point of diversion located 1800 feet North and 150 feet West from the Southeast corner of the SW2 SE2, Section 20, being within the NW2 SE2, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, W.M.

Soper submitted an affidavit that they are the legal and equitable owners of the water right evidenced by the certificate recorded at Page 11572, and the land to which it is appurtenant, that they have abandoned any and all interest in and to the use of water for development of power and request the same be canceled, that the land actually irrigated comprised 7.84 acres in the SW¹/₄ SE¹/₄ of Section 20, and 1.09 acres in the IW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Section 29, Township 29 South, Range 14 West, W.M., and that an appropriate change be made in the State Record of Water Right Certificates to correctly reflect the acreage actually irrigated.

Dr. William M. Soper proposes to irrigate the 7.84 acres in the SW¹/₄ SE¹/₄, Section 20, and 1.09 acres in the NW¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Section 29, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, W.M., referred to in the preceeding paragraph from a point of diversion to be located 1800 feet North and 335 feet West from the Southeast corner of the SW¹/₄ SE¹/₄, Section 20, being within the NW¹/₄ SE¹/₄, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, W.M.

Notice by publication as provided by ORS 540.520 was not given in connection with this application for the reason said section provides notice is not required on an application for a change in point of diversion of water of less than one-fourth mile where there is no intervening diversion.

No objection having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from Simpson Creek, to wit:

From a point located 1800 feet North and 150 feet West from the Southeast corner of the SW2 SE4, Section 20, being within the NW2 SE2, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, W.M.

To a point to be located 1800 feet North and 335 feet West from the Southeast corner of the SW2 SE2, Section 20, being within the NW2 SE2, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, W.M.

for the irrigation of 7.84 acres in the SW2 SE2 of Section 20, and 1.09 acres in the NW2 NE2, Section 29, Township 29 South, Range 14 West, W.M., with a date of priority of November 18, 1955, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that no time need be fixed for completion as the change in point of diversion is completed and the new diversion in operation.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.89 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be carried out prior to the diverting of water at the new point of diversion as herein confirmed.

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said water master.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate heretofore issued to Arthur G. Randall and recorded at Page 11572, Volume 10, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of the change in point of diversion a certificate of water right shall be issued to Dr. William M. and Carrie Jean Soper for the appropriation of not to exceed 0.89 cubic foot per second of waters of Simpson Creek for the irrigation of 7.84 acres in the SW SE of Section 20, and 1.09 acres in the NW NE NE Section 29, Township 29 South, Range 14 West, W.N.

Dear Mr. Corrigall:

There are two completed rights, two permits and one incomplete application for change in point of diversion involved in the property of William Soper and a little more involved than giving you a description of each.

The certificate of water right recorded at page 11572, State Record of Water Right Certificates, was issued to Arthur Randall for the appropriation of 1.5 cubic feet per second of waters of Simpson Creek for irrigation of 15.0 acres and development of 1.5 theoretical horsepower (not electrical) under a priority date of November 18, 1935. The proof submitted lists a water wheel as a power source for the pump discontinued by the time the second right was perfected.

The certificate of water right recorded at page 35721 was issued to Curtis Simpson for the appropriation of 0.08 cubic foot per second of waters of Simpson Creek for irrigation of 6.4 acres under a priority date of January 2, 1959.

Dr. Soper submitted an application which was approved by permit No. R 5809 for the construction of a reservoir and three holding ponds and storage of 7.0 acre feet of waters of Simpson Creek for supplemental irrigation and frost control, being 3.5 acre feet for irrigation and 3.5 acre feet for frost control.

The secondary application was approved by permit No. 35941 for the appropriation of 2.88 cubic feet per second of waters of Simpson Creek and reservoir and three ponds for irrigation, supplemental irrigation and frost control.

18 January 18 January

Mr. Louis Prahar prepared the application and map approved by permit No. 35941 and included the existing bogs. We made the usual final proof survey before issuing certificate No. 35721 so had no conflict with it, but certificate No. 11572 was issued prior to the time this office made final proof surveys and the proof of appropriation was only supported by a sketch not in agreement with Mr. Prahar's map. There was an actual change in point of diversion under certificate No. 11572 and Dr. Soper submitted an incomplete application for approval of the change. Action on this has been withheld pending completion of an affidavit by Dr. Soper and the contract seller so the description of the first right under certificate No. 11572 can be corrected to describe the use of water actually made. Mr. Prahar had written us regarding this and I am enclosing a copy of his letter of August 25, 1971 and have marked the appropriate paragraph.

The completed rights evidenced by certificates are valid to the extent of beneficial use of water subject to forfeiture for failure to use the water for any period of five successive years.

We have had no report as to what has been done under permits No. R 5809 and 35941. The time limits for these are April 5, 1973 to begin construction, October 1, 1973 to complete construction and October 1, 1974 to complete the use of water. If these time limits were met Dr. Soper should submit proper notices and the rights could be perfected to the extent of beneficial use of water.

I see no reason why all matters I mention could not be completed by Dr. Soper and the contract seller or by a subsequent purchaser.

I cannot find any reference to your November 18, 1974 letter. Perhaps if further details are needed we should discuss the matter by telephone.

Dear Dr. Soper:

I have previously written regarding the water right evidenced by certificate 11572 for which you have requested approval of a change in point of diversion.

Mr. Louis Prahar stated that the westerly bogs as he mapped them have existed for over twenty years and Mr. Curtis Simpson constructed additional bogs after obtaining permit 26056 which was confirmed by certificate 35721.

There is no conflict for the 5.4 acres on the east side as described in certificate 35721 issued to Curtis Simpson and no action other than continued use of water need be taken.

So as to correct the record so certificate 11572 will correctly describe and locate the use of water made, I have prepared and enclose two identical affidavits. Once you indicated that you were contract purchaser so I prepared one affidavit for you and one for the contract seller. I have left a blank for the proper entry. If you now own the property, only one affidavit is required and you should insert "owner" in the blank space. The right is restricted to the extent beneficial use of water was made so this action merely corrects the record of the right. We will include the area in Section 29 not proviously described.

On receipt of the completed affidavit we can complete action on your request for change in point of diversion.

Dear Dr. Soper:

I applogize for the delay in responding to the return of your applications R-48308 and 48309. We have hed some personnel changes which have affected the handling of the more involved applications.

Mr. Louis Prahar sent on explanatory letter with the returned applications and also expressed your desire to do what is necessary to establish rights to cover your project.

The cartificate recorded at page 11572 describes the use of 1.5 cubic feet per second of waters of Simpson Creek for irrigation of 15.0 acres and development of 1.5 theoretical horsepower. The sketch which accompanied the proof end the certificate locate the land in the SMM SEM which is something different than the bogs as located by Mr. Prahar. The right is restricted to the use of water and area of use as made by the completion date of the permit. Mr. Preher states that the westerly bags have existed as he mapped them for over 20 years. He also states that Curtis Simpson filed an application for a permit for additional bogs constructed after completion of the first right. It appears from Mr. Prahar's map that the early right should be for 7.84 acres in the SWM SEM, Section 20, and 1.09 acres in the MUM NCM, Section 29, for a total of 8.93 acres. The 3.27 ecre bug in Section 20 and 2.22 acre and 1.03 acre bogs in Section 29 were constructed later eccording to our records and covered for the most part by certificate 35721 although our acreage figure is 6.4 acres.

Along with your application for approval of a change in point of diversion, we are willing to correct the certificate to describe the westerly bogs comprising 8.93 acres which includes 1.09 acres in Section 29.

Certificate 35721 is for 1/80th cubic foot per second of water per acre for 6.4 acres, so the new application can include an additional 1/80th cubic foot per second of water per acre and the difference of 0.12 acre from Mr. Prahar's map can be taken care of by increasing the adjacent proposed bog acres by 0.05 acre in Section 20 and 0.07 acres in Section 29.

We have issued permits for frost control as this may be needed before and after the normal irrigation season. High temperatures occur during the irrigation season so we do not issue permits for both heat control and irrigation. Water for cooling also results in irrigation of the crop.

I have prepared an application based on the information you submitted and records of existing rights. All acreage figures are from Mr. Prahar's map. Other than a small change in the quantity of water, the only changes are in Item 8.

If the correction is made so the earliest right covers the three westerly bogs, the application need be only for frost control for the 4.43, 1.16, 2.25, and 1.09 acres and these are listed as 7.84 acres in Section 20 and 1.09 acres in Section 29.

The 6.4 acres under permit 26056 are listed for supplemental irrigation to provide an additional 1/80th cubic foot per second of water per acre.

To agree with Mr. Prahar's map, I suggest listing 0.27 acres instead of 0.20 acre in Section 20 and 1.74 acres instead of 1.69 acres in Section 29, because certificate 34721 is for 3.2 acres not 3.27 in Section 20 and 3.2 acres not 3.25 in Section 29. It is not necessary to list acreage figures to 1/100% so the map and application can be changed if you wish.

I am not sure if Mr. Prahar included the small part of the proposed 1.84 acre bog in Section 20 in his figure of 1.84 acres. I prepared the application on the assumption that he did not so added 0.10 acre in Section 20.

If you agree with this application, it only requires signing and returning. I will then assist in the completion of your application for approval of a change in point of diversion and incorporate a request to change the description to cover the use as made.

I am returning the map and your application which is endorsed so that in order to retain its date of priority it must be returned to this office on or before February 9, 1972.

-3-Dr. Soper December 9, 1971 If you wish to submit the superseding application, the original application must also be returned. I am sending copies of the applications and map to Mr. Prahar so you will not have to mail them back and forth if you wish to consult with him before taking action. Dear Doctor Soper:

This will acknowledge your application for a permit to construct four reservoirs and store a total of 7.0 feet therein from Simpson Creek for irrigation and temperature control, two small dam data sheets and a fee of \$20 for which our receipt number 23944 is enclosed. This application has been filed and numbered R-48308.

Also acknowledged is your application for a permit to appropriate 3 cubic feet per second from Simpson Creek and three reservoirs for the irrigation of 4.87 acres and the temperature control of 19.18 acres, a map, and the fee of \$34 for which our receipt number 23945 is enclosed. This application has been filed and numbered 48309.

Also acknowledged is your application for a change in point of diversion of water from Simpson Creek and a fee of \$25 for which our receipt number 23946 is enclosed. The application has been filed as transfer 2532.

Reservoir application number R-48308 describes one reservoir area on Simpson Creek. The map clearly shows two structures on the creek. Each reservoir must be separately designated on this application.

Item number 3 on the reservoir application must separately specify the quantity of water stored in each of the five reservoirs for each use. The small dam data sheet submitted for the Simpson Creek storage area indicates a drainage area of only 0.25 acre. The drainage area of Simpson Creek above the reservoir is considerably larger than this and the small dam data sheet should be corrected.

Certificate 11572 was issued to Arthur G. Randall and describes the irrigation of 15 acres in the SW_4^1 SE_4^1 of Section 20 and the development of 1.5 theoretical horsepower. Certificate 35721 was issued to Curtis F. Simpson and describes the irrigation of 3.2 acres in the SW_4^1 SE_4^1 of Section 20 and 3.2 acres in the NW_4^1 NE_4^1 of Section 29. The total irrigation between the two rights is 21.4 acres. The map submitted shows the present irrigation of 15.45 acres. However, the 1.09 acres in the westerly part of the NW_4^1 NE_4^1 of Section 9 was never included in Certificate 11572 and must be designated as primary irrigation of this application.

The only proof of a water right is beneficial irrigation. If the 3.27 acres in the south easterly corner of the SW4 SE4 of Section 20 was in fact irrigated by May of 1939, it could be a portion of the land described by Certificate 11572 but could not then be a part of the 6.4 acres in Certificate 35721.

If you own all of the land described by the two earlier certificates and all of the land irrigated under these certificates is shown on the map, I will prepare for your signature the necessary affidavit of abandonment to clear our records of that part of the right no longer being used.

Item number 1 on application number 48309 should also include the two reservoirs on Simpson Creek as sources of appropriation. The second point of diversion on Simpson Creek must also be described in Item number 4 on this application.

The land irrigated under earlier rights is for the appropriation of live flow from Simpson Creek only. Perhaps you would wish to file for supplemental irrigation from the reservoirs on this land. If so, the map and Item number 8 on the application must separately describe the primary and supplemental irrigation.

The quantity of water allowed under Certificate 35721 was 1/80th of a cubic foot per second per acre. This is one-half of the quantity that can now be allowed for the irrigation of cranberries. Therefore, an additional 1/80th of a cubic foot per second for each acre irrigated under this certificate could be filed on at this time to make up the deficiency in the quantity of water allowed under the earlier certificate.

If the cranberries are harvested by the flooding method, this use should also be included for all lands.

A legal description of the property upon which the water will be used must accompany the application. This can be copied from your deed, title insurance policy or sales contract.

Dr. William M. Soper Page 3 July 1, 1971 The contract seller of this property must submit a statement approving your proposed change in point of diversion. I am returning your applications number R-48308 and 48309 with the map for completion and correction and endorsed that so in order to retain their dates of priority they must be returned to this office on or before August 30, 1971.
