

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed

0.02 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion; SW 1/4 SE 1/4, as projected within McKinney DLC 45, Section 14, T26S, R6W, WM; 2550 feet South and 2620 feet West from E 1/4 corner Section 14

# BEFORE THE WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR OF OREGON DOUGLAS COUNTY

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF DALE W. HALL FOR APPROVAL OF A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER FROM NORTH UMPQUA RIVER

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3626

On April 13, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Dale W. Hall for a change in point of diversion under an existing water right of record, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 43354, Volume 35, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of G. H. Harrell, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second from North Umpqua River for irrigation of 1.38 acres in SE½ SW½ of Section 14 and 0.12 acre in NE½ NW¼ of Section 23, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of May 13, 1963.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 2550 feet South and 2620 feet West from the East quarter corner of Section 14, being within the SW4 SE4 of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 90 feet South and 280 feet West from the North quarter corner of Section 23, being within the NE% NW% of Section 23, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Mr. M. John Youngquist, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled:

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the portion of the right involved in the change authorized herein NOT be included in the new certificate to be issued as provided by the order entered February 15, 1977, approving transfer application No. 3482, and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of the change in point of diversion authorized herein, a certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein confirming the change in point of diversion.
