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

ORDER

APPROVING APPLICATION 5-2

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 116-606, O. C. L. A., Wm. H. Steen of Milton, Oregon, on November 14, 1941, filed in the office of Chas. E. Stricklin, State Engineer, an application for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Dry Creek, a tributary of Pine Creek, in Umatilla County, Oregon.

By decree of the Circuit Court for Umatilla County, Oregon, dated March 17, 1924, a water right was allowed Wm. H. Steen for the irrigation of 11.9 acres in the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 and 11.5 acres in the SE_4^1 NW_4^1 , Section 26, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W. M., with a priority of 1882, through the Steen Ditch which, it appears, diverts from Dry Creek 610 feet south and 577 feet east of the northwest corner of the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 , Section 35, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W. M., being within the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 of said section.

In accordance with Section 116-606, O. C. L. A., notice of filing of said application and time for hearing was duly published, and within ten days prior to the date set for hearing in said notice protests against the allowance of said application were filed with the State Engineer by R. H. Lee, Andrew Zessin, Harold Harder, Minna E. Still, and J. N. York.

The date of the hearing as set forth in the published notice was postponed to February 4, 1942, and the place of the hearing transferred to the City Hall in Milton, Oregon. On this date, the applicant and the objectors appeared at the City Hall in Milton and introduced oral and documentary evidence in support of their respective claims.

The objections to the approval of the application are based upon the following:

I

"That the objectors right is for domestic purposes and is by law superior to the rights of the applicant to take water from said creek for agriculture purposes.

II

"That the applicant forfeited his right to use water from said creek for agriculture purposes for the reason that he has not used the same for more than five years.

III

"That the applicant will use part of the water secured from said creek on other land of the applicant not described in the application.

IV

"That the proposed change of point of diversion and installing of pumping system will permit the applicant to take more water from said creek than he has ever used under supposed water right and will prevent objector during certain months using the right he has for domestic purposes."

The water right of the applicant has been adjudicated by the Circuit Court for Umatilla County, Oregon, and the presumption is that such right continues in existence until a court of competent jurisdiction has otherwise determined. No such determination has been made of this right. The application is only for the approval of a change in the point of diversion. The approval by the State Engineer would not in any way modify or change the provisions in the court's decree as to the place of use, rate or quantity of water diverted, or the priority of the applicant's right. The only question for consideration by the State Engineer is will the change in point of diversion result in injury to existing rights.

The lands of all the objectors are located below the lands of the applicant.

It appears that water for irrigation of the lands of the applicant from the point of diversion from Dry Creek was carried in a concrete pipe for a distance of some 700 or 800 feet and from the pipeline in a ditch for about three-fourths mile to the lands irrigated. The lands irrigated by the applicant are in a relatively narrow strip about one-half mile in length, lying east and adjacent to Dry Creek. The topography is uneven, sloping to the creek. It appears that the applicant plans to install a sprinkler system, using a pump to divert the water. In order to save in pipe, it is proposed to have a portable pumping plant and pipe-line, the diversion being within the E_2^1 NW_4^1 , Section 26, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W. M.

After careful consideration of the evidence submitted in the matter, it appears that the approval of the application of Wm. H. Steen for a change in point of diversion would not be an injury to existing rights as contemplated by Section 116-606, O. C. L. A.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the present point of diversion of water from Dry Creek for the irrigation of 11.9 acres in the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 and 11.5 acres in the SE_4^1 NW_4^1 , Section 26, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W. M., as determined by the decree of the Circuit Court for Umatilla County, Oregon, dated March 17, 1924, under the name of Wm. H. Steen, which point is 610 feet south and 577 feet east of the northwest corner of the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 , Section 35, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W. M., be changed downstream to within the E_2^1 NW_4^1 , Section 26, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W. M.



that the amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed One acre foot per acre during any thirty-day period, nor three acre feet per acre during the irrigation season beginning April 1st and ending October 1st.

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3679

On May 20, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Victor M. McLind for a change in point of diversion under an existing water right of record, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 5538, Volume 6, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Wm. H. Steen, as modified under the provisions of an administrative order entered February 6, 1942 approving transfer application No. S-28, describes a right to use of water from Dry Creek for irrigation of a certain 7.5 acres in SE% NW% of Section 26, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1882.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located within the NEX NWX of said Section 26.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion, without loss of priority, to a point located 1838 feet South and 1795 feet East from the Northwest corner of Section 26, being within the SE% NW% of said Section 26.

Mr. William I. Profily, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change

in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the appliation should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install head-gates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order the certificate of water right heretofore issued to Wm. H. Steen and recorded at page 5538, Volume 6, State Record of Water Right Certificates, be canceled, and in lieu thereof a new confirming certificate of water right be issued to the applicant herein.
