

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

This Is to Certify, That

ELDON R. FRINK

Route 2, Box 128, Dallas , State of Oregon , has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE ENGINEER of Oregon, of a right to the use of the waters of Little Luckiamute River and Teal Creek a tributary of Luckiamute diver for the purpose of irrigation of 50.4 acre under Permit No. of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from May 2, 1949, for 0.38 c.f.s., July 12, 1949, for 0.50 c.f.s. and September 15, 1949, for 0.08 c.f.s. 0.33; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes

aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.96 cubic foot per second, 0.63

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the SW4 SW4, SE4 SW4, NW4 SE4, SW4 SA4, as projected within Smith D.L.C. No. 43, Section 26, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 21 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year; 0.13 c.f.s. to be diverted from Teal Creek when available and any deficiency in the available supply in Teal Creek is to be made up by diversion from Little Luckiamute River, providing that the total quantity diverted from both streams shall not exceed 1/50th c.f.s. for each acre irrigated

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3577

On March 10, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Kenneth Gardner for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion from Little Luckiamute River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 21278, Volume 15, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Eldon R. Frink, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.13 cubic foot per second, with a date of priority of May 2, 1949; 0.17 cubic foot per second, with a date of priority of July 12, 1949; and 0.03 cubic foot per second, with a date of priority of September 15, 1949, for the irrigation of a certain 7.5 acres in NE¼ SW¼, 11.0 acres in NW¼ SW¼, 3.8 acres in SW¼ SW¼, and 3.7 acres in SE¼ SW¼ of Section 26, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 1780 feet North and 3430 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 26, being within the NW4 SE4 of Section 26, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the place of use and point of diversion therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof a certain 8.6 acres in NE¹/₄ NW¹/₄, 0.3 acre in NW¹/₄ NW¹/₄, 1.3 acres in SW¹/₄ NW¹/₄, and 15.8 acres in SE¹/₄ NW¹/₄ of Section 36, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M., from a point of diversion located 430 feet North and 2560 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 25, being within the SE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ of Section 25, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in the Polk County Itemizer-Observer, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Polk County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of May 25; June 1 and 8, 1977.

Mr. Benjamin E. Monroe, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.33 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right heretofore issued to Eldon R. Frink and recorded at page 21278, Volume 15, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.

Bear Mr. Gardner:

The notices of completion of works and use of water under the provisions of the orders of the Water Resources Director approving water right transfer applications Nos. 3574, 3575, 3576 and 3577, for changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from Little Luckianute River, were received and, in line with the general practice of this office, a survey will be made at a later date.

After the survey, proof may be made and certificate of water right issued covering the actual use of water as found by the engineer. (In case of irrigation, any lands described in the order that have not been irrigated will be automatically eliminated from the water right.)

In the meantime, the order will be evidence of the water right in question as long as the authorized beneficial use of water is continued.
