Findings of Fact

1. On June 1, 2023, Bo Jiang, filed an application to change the point of appropriation under Permit G-18601. The Department assigned the application number T-14254.
2. On March 24, 2023, the Department approved an assignment of Permit G-18601 from Holly J. Dunning and Kyle L. Dunning to Bo Jiang.
3. Notice of the application for the permit amendment was published in the Department's weekly notice on June 6, 2023, pursuant to ORS 540.520(5).
4. The right to be amended is as follows:

Permit:	G-18601 in the name of Bo Jiang
Use:	IRRIGATION of 95.8 ACRES
Priority Date:	MAY 12, 2020
Quantity:	1.2 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND
Rate/Duty:	The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.
Period of Use:	March 1 through October 31
Source:	WELL 2 and WELL 3 in FRAZIER CREEK BASIN

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

5. Permit Amendment Application T-14254 proposes to move the authorized point of appropriation for WELL 3 with approximate distances from the existing points of appropriation as follows:

6. The application proposes to change the point of appropriation for a portion of Permit G-18601, specifically 62.41 acres. The applicant did not include any information in the application or on the application map to indicate which lands (the FROM lands) currently authorized under Permit G-18601 will be served by the new proposed well (POA 3), therefore the application is incomplete.

Permit Amendment Review Criteria

7. The change would not result in injury to other water rights.
8. On October 31, 2023, the Department determined the proposed point of appropriation (POD 3) does not develop groundwater from the same aquifer as the authorized points of appropriation, as required by OAR 690-380-2110(2). Existing POAs, including the only constructed well BENT 56496, are authorized to produce from alluvium. The proposed POA is planned to be 50 feet deep and produce from basalt, though basalt is not mapped in the area. Based on geologic mapping and well log reports for wells in the area of the proposed POA, any production is anticipated to be from marine sedimentary rocks of the Spencer

Formation. These older, more compacted rocks produce only small quantities of groundwater as compared to the younger Holocene alluvium and Willamette Silt that onlap these older rocks. If constructed, the proposed POA would not produce from the same aquifer as the authorized POA it is replacing, as the alluvial sediments do not exist at the proposed location.

9. The change does not enlarge the permit.
10. The change does not alter any other terms of the permit.
11. The application is incomplete because the applicant did not include any information in the application or on the application map to indicate which lands (the FROM lands) currently authorized under Permit G-18601 will be served by the new proposed well (POD 3). Therefore, all other application requirements are not met.


Conclusions of Law

1. The change in point of appropriation proposed in Permit Amendment T-14254 is denied.

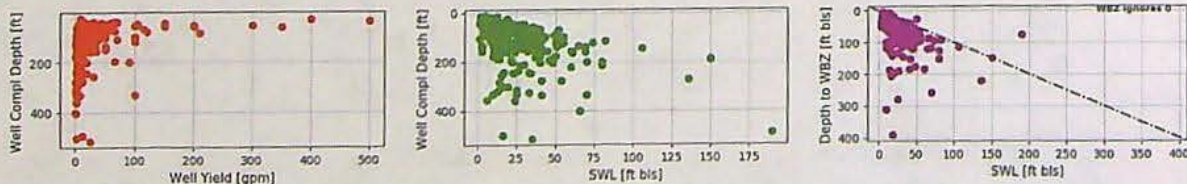

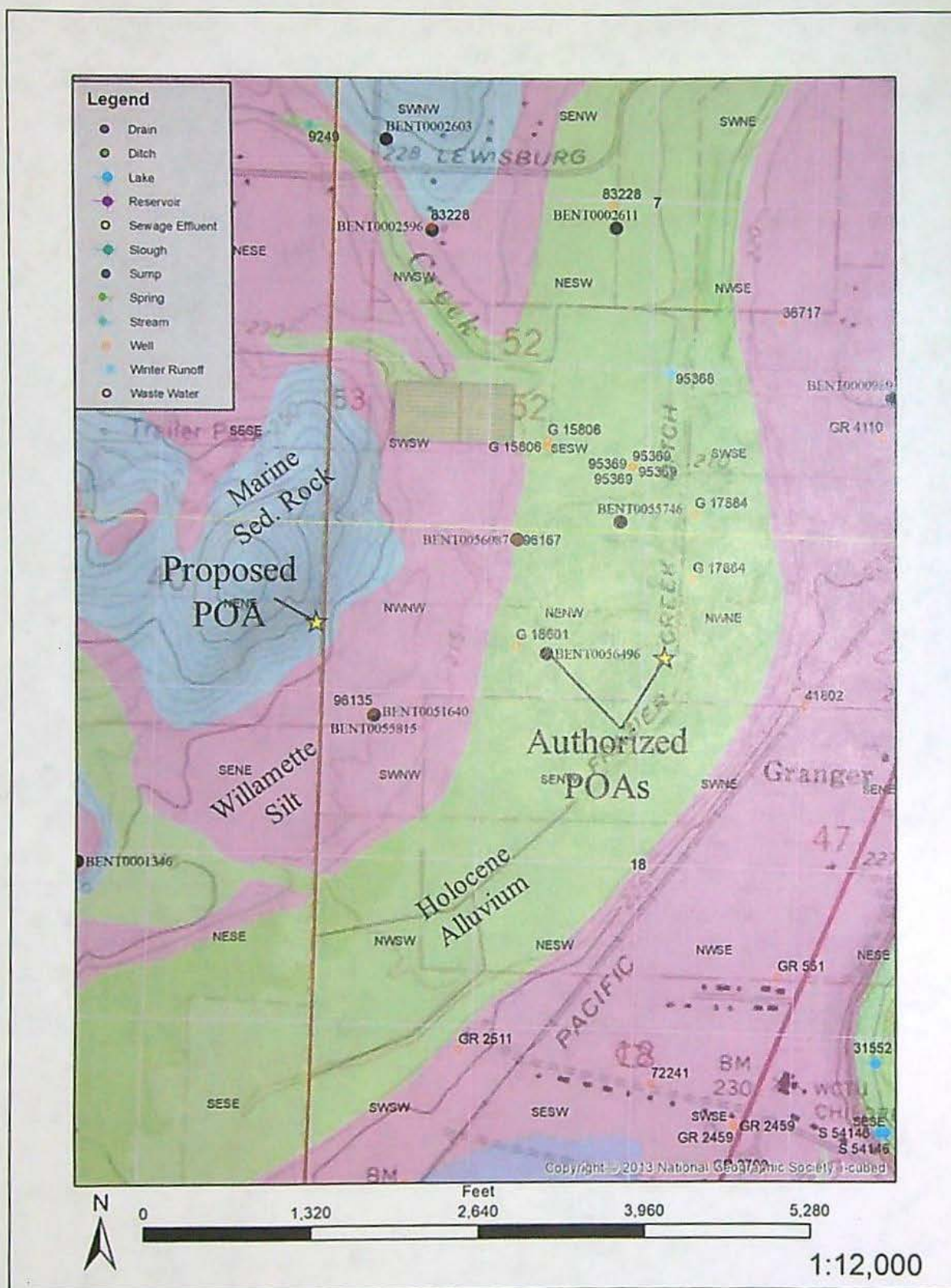

If the applicant wishes to construct a well for domestic supply at this location, however, production may be adequate and the use would be considered exempt and not require a water right.



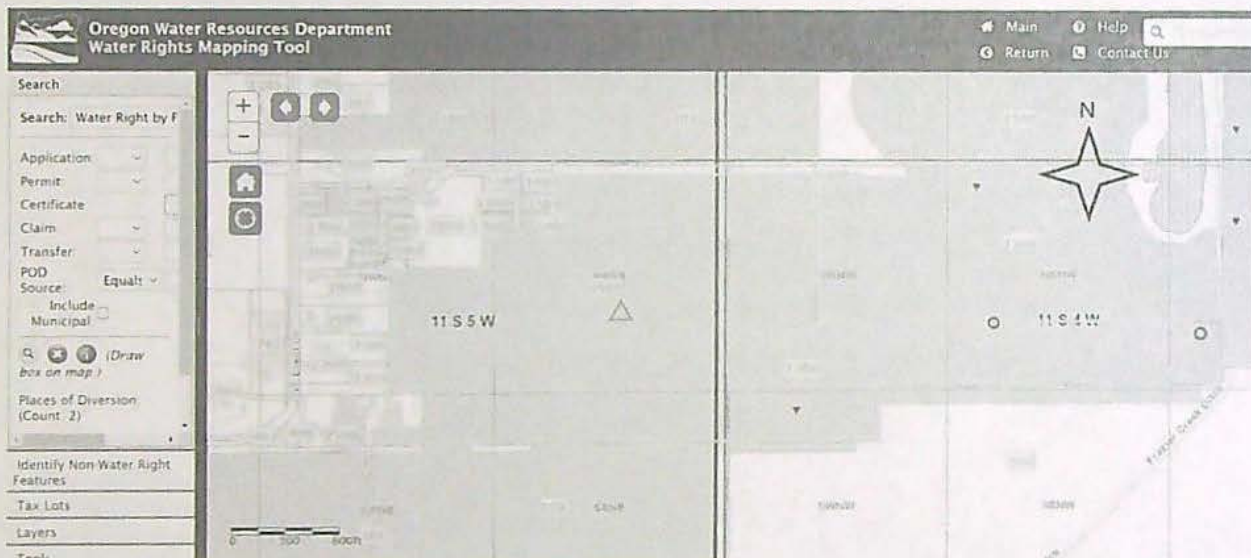

I'm applying for a permit amendment for my water permit G 18601 (https://apps.wrd.state.or.us/apps/wr/wrinfo/wr_details.aspx?snp_id=208258). The amendment is proposed to transfer one of the two existing PODs (Point of Diversion) from tax lot 114180001300 to 11513A001900 (both of these two tax lots are under my name).

In detail, the two existing PODs are POD 1 (aka WELL 2) and POD 2 (aka WELL 3):

- POD 1: We've drilled a well on the location of POD 1 (well ID L 143923) last year 2022. No change needed for POD 1 in this amendment.
- POD 2: this is the POD I'd like to transfer to tax lot 11513A001900, which is on the west side of the original location.

In the attached application map, the RED circle is the original location of POD 2, and the BLUE triangle is the proposed location.



The reason that I'm requesting this is that I'm applying for a building permit with Benton County on tax lot 11513A001900 (we have a second dwelling right here), which requires a direct water supply on the same land zone (11513A001900 is on UR5 zone, while tax lot 114180001300 where the two existing PODs locate on is EFU zone). In addition, these two existing PODs are both on the east side of the farm, while the west side of the farm doesn't have an irrigation supply nearby. Transferring one of them over to the west side will make the irrigation system much easier and affordable for us. We'd highly appreciate if you could consider this special situation and approve our request.

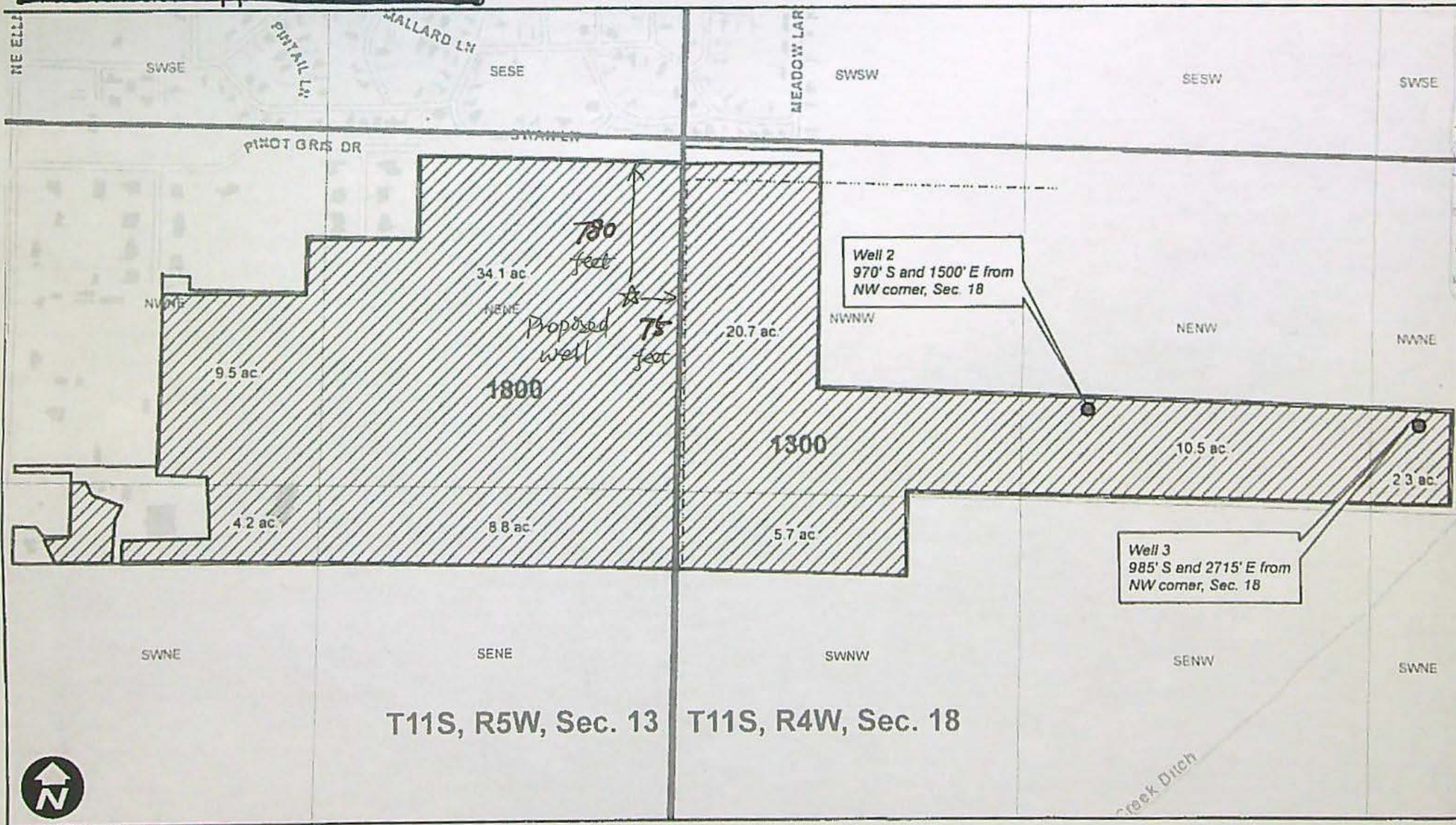
