Authority

Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.211 establishes the process in which a water right permit holder may submit a request to change the point of diversion and/or place of use authorized under an existing water right permit.

Findings of Fact

1. On August 9, 2023, John McCaw Jr., filed an application to change the points of diversion and to change the place of use under Permit S-54549. The Department assigned the application number T-14304.
2. On December 30, 2022, the Department approved an extension of time for completion of construction and complete application of water to October 1, 2023.
3. On December 8, 2023, the Department approved an extension of time for completion of construction and complete application of water to October 1, 2025.
4. Notice of the application for the permit amendment was published in the Department's weekly notice on August 22, 2023, and in the Rogue River Press newspaper on October March 5 and 12, 2025, pursuant to ORS 540.520(5).

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

5. On August 20, 2023, the Department contacted the agent for the applicant via phone regarding deficiencies in the application, specifically the proposed "TO" lands are not contiguous with the "FROM" lands, pursuant to ORS 537.211(4)(b): (4) The holder of a water right permit may change the point of diversion, change the point of appropriation, change the point of diversion to allow the appropriation of ground water or use the water on land to which the right is not appurtenant if: (b) For a proposed change in the place of use of the water, the land on which the water is to be used is owned or controlled by the holder of the permit and is contiguous to the land to which the permit is appurtenant.
6. On December 18, 2023, the Department met with the agent for the applicant via conference call regarding the deficiencies in the application. The agent for the applicant agreed to provide the Department with amended application pages and an amended application map.
7. On February 23, 2024, the Department followed up via email with the applicant for the agent, again requesting amended application pages and an amended application map. The Department set a deadline of March 8, 2024, for receipt of the amended application pages and amended application map.
8. On March 8, 2024, the Department contacted the agent for the applicant via email regarding deficiencies in the amended map. The Department set a deadline of March 15, 2024, for submittal of another amended map.
9. On March 14 and 15, 2024, the agent for the applicant provided amended application pages and maps.
10. On May 28, 2024, the Department contacted the agent for the applicant via email and phone regarding deficiencies in the amended table 1 provided on March 14 and 15, 2024, specifically, the review of the application is incomplete because the descriptions of the authorized point of diversion (POD) locations are incorrect, and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) was unable to complete their review of Permit Amendment T-14304.
11. On June 13, 2024, the agent for the applicant provided an amended Table 1, satisfying the deficiencies.
12. On July 5, 2024, the Department received the completed ODFW review of Permit Amendment T-14304.
13. On October 23, 2024, the Department contacted the agent for the applicant via email regarding a deficiency in the amended application submitted June 13, 2024, specifically the checkbox indicating a change in place of use under Permit Amendment T-14304 was unchecked. The Department corrected the application page by marking the correct checkbox and sent the page to the applicant via email. The agent for the applicant agreed to the changes made on the application page, satisfying the deficiency and allowing the Department to move forward with an approval of Permit Amendment T-14304.

14. On December 19, 2024, the Department contacted the agent for the applicant via email regarding deficiencies with application pages (Table 2) and the application maps, specifically the totals of the "FROM" and "TO" lands are inaccurate and do not reflect the entirety of Permit S-54549. The Department requested amended application pages and maps to satisfy the deficiency.
15. On January 13, 2025, the agent for the applicant requested the Department review the amended pages (Table 2) and maps before a finalized version was submitted. The Department responded to the agent's request advising that the map was accurate, however, the amended pages (Table 2) totals were still inaccurate and did not correctly match the maps.
16. On February 4, 2025, the Department sent a follow-up email to the agent for the applicant again requesting the finalized versions of the amended pages (Table 2) and maps.
17. On February 11, 2025, the Department sent a follow-up email to the agent for the applicant again requesting the finalized versions of the amended pages (Table 2) and maps.
18. On February 13, 2025, the Department received amended pages (Table 2) and maps. The application pages (Table 2) received on this date still had inaccurate totals. The Department corrected the inaccurate totals on March 6, 2025. These corrected and amended pages (Table 2) along with the amended maps received satisfied the deficiency.
19. The permit to be amended is as follows:

Priority Date: APRIL 11, 2007
Quantity: 385.0 ACRE-FEET EACH YEAR
Rate/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second and 4.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.
Period of Use: April 1 through October 31
Source: LOST CREEK RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-8142, a tributary of ROGUE RIVER.

22. Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screen is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screen. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost-share funds

Permit Amendment Review Criteria

23. The changes would not result in injury to other water rights.
24. The proposed place of use is owned and/or controlled by the permit holder.
25. The changes do not enlarge the permit.
26. The changes do not alter any other terms of the permit.
27. The proposed place of use is contiguous to the authorized place of use.

Conclusions of Law

The change in points of diversion and change in place of use proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-14304 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.211.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:


1. The change in points of diversion and change in place of use proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-14304 are approved.
2. Approval of this permit amendment application does not constitute nor grant legal access onto or through another person's property for purposes of accessing the new point of diversion or the new place of use.
3. Permit S-55537, in the name of JOHN MCCAOW JR, is issued to replace Permit S-54549, and incorporates the amendments approved by this order and the extensions of time. Permit S-54549, in the name of JOHN MCCAOW JR, is no longer of any force or effect.
4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion (POD 3) shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion (POD 1 and POD 2).
5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each new point of diversion, with the exception that water rights issued to the Bureau of Reclamation or an irrigation district (or similar entity) are not subject to this condition.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion and shall provide to the OWRD a written statement from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) that the installed screen meets the state's criteria, or that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

7. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original points of diversion.
8. The former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as part of this permit.
9. All other terms and conditions of Permit S-55537 remain the same.

This Permit supersedes S-54549.

Permit Amendment T-14304 conditions:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion (POD 3) shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion (POD 1 and POD 2).

Water use measurement conditions:

- a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each new point of diversion, with the exception that water rights issued to the Bureau of Reclamation or an irrigation district (or similar entity) are not subject to this condition.
- b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion and shall provide to the OWRD a written statement from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) that the installed screen meets the state's criteria, or that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary.

The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original points of diversion. The former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as part of this permit.

Extension of Time Final Order (approved December 8, 2023) conditions:

This will be the last extension of time granted for Permit S-54549. Any future extensions of time request shall be denied.

Original Permit Conditions:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at each point of diversion. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion while by-pass devices provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screen and by-pass devices are to be in place and functional and approved in writing by ODFW prior to diversion of any water. The permittee may submit evidence in writing that ODFW has determined screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary.

The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish, unless the permittee has requested and been granted a fish passage waiver by the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission. The permittee is hereby directed to contact an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Fish Passage Coordinator, before beginning construction of any in-channel obstruction.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract Number 079E101581, or satisfactory replacement, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant or landowner, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area in accordance with ODFW's Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Policy OAR 635-415. For purposes of mitigation, the ODFW Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Goals and Standards, OAR Chapter 635, Division 415, Section 030, shall be followed.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream waters decreases to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

Completion of construction and complete application of the water to the use was to be made on or before October 1, 2023. By Extension of Time Final Order dated December 8, 2023, the completion of construction and application of water was extended to on or before October 1, 2025.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).

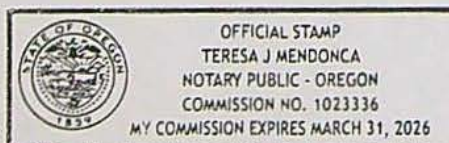

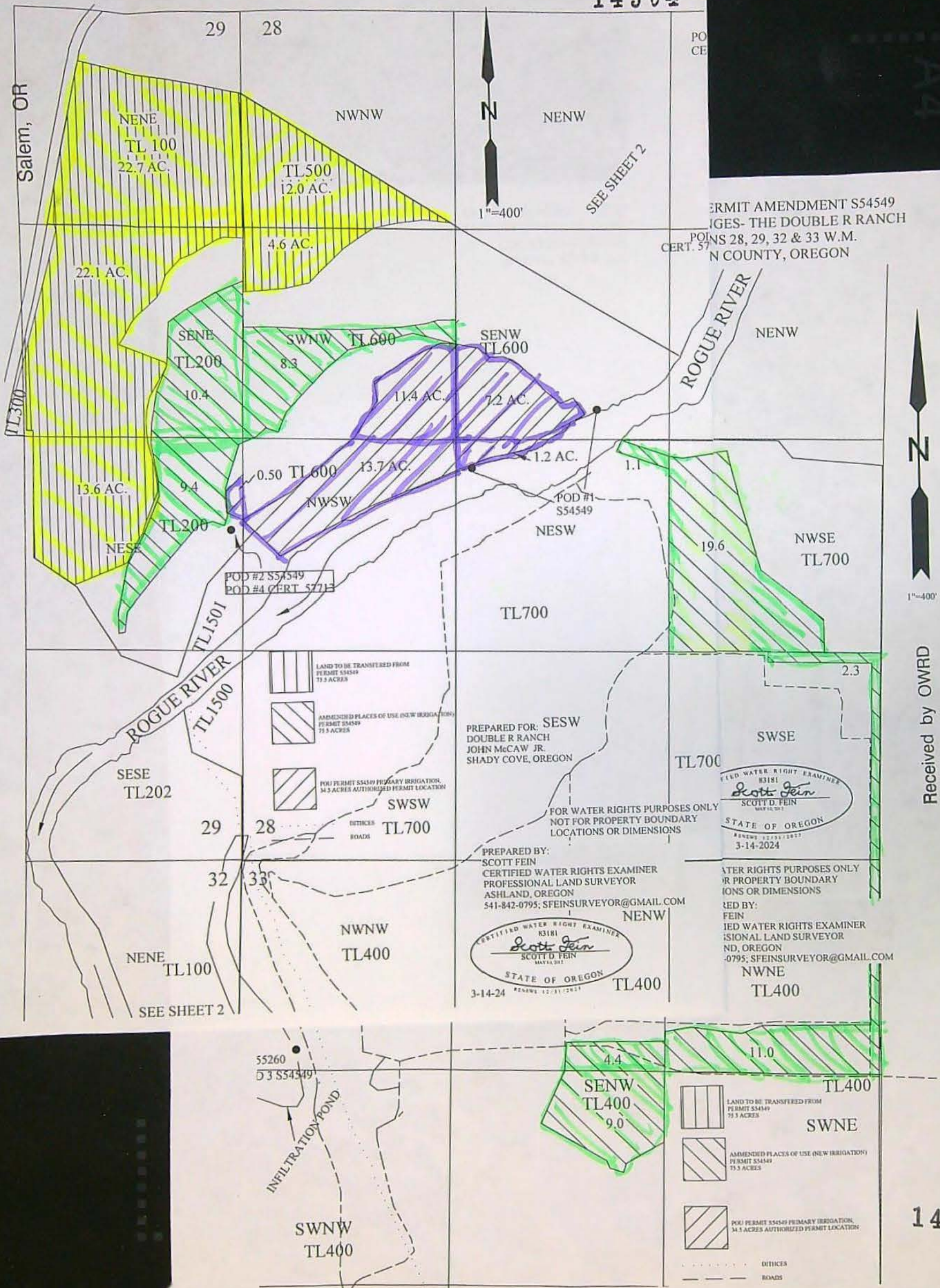

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director at each point of diversion. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion while by-pass devices provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screen and by-pass devices are to be in place and functional, and approved in writing by ODFW prior to diversion of any water. The permittee may submit evidence in writing that ODFW has determined screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary.

The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish, unless the permittee has requested and been

granted a fish passage waiver by the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission. The permittee is hereby directed to contact an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Fish Passage Coordinator, before beginning construction of any in-channel obstruction.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract Number 079E101581, or satisfactory replacement, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant or land owner, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

Where two or more water users agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation in the use of water and such agreement is placed in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system does not infringe upon such prior rights of any water user not a party to such rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area in accordance with ODFW's Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Policy OAR 635-415. For purposes of mitigation, the ODFW Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Goals and Standards, OAR Chapter 635, Division 415, Section 030, shall be followed.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream waters decreases to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

Completion of construction and complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2013. If the water is not completely applied before this date, and the permittee wishes to continue development under the permit, the permittee must submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merit of the application.

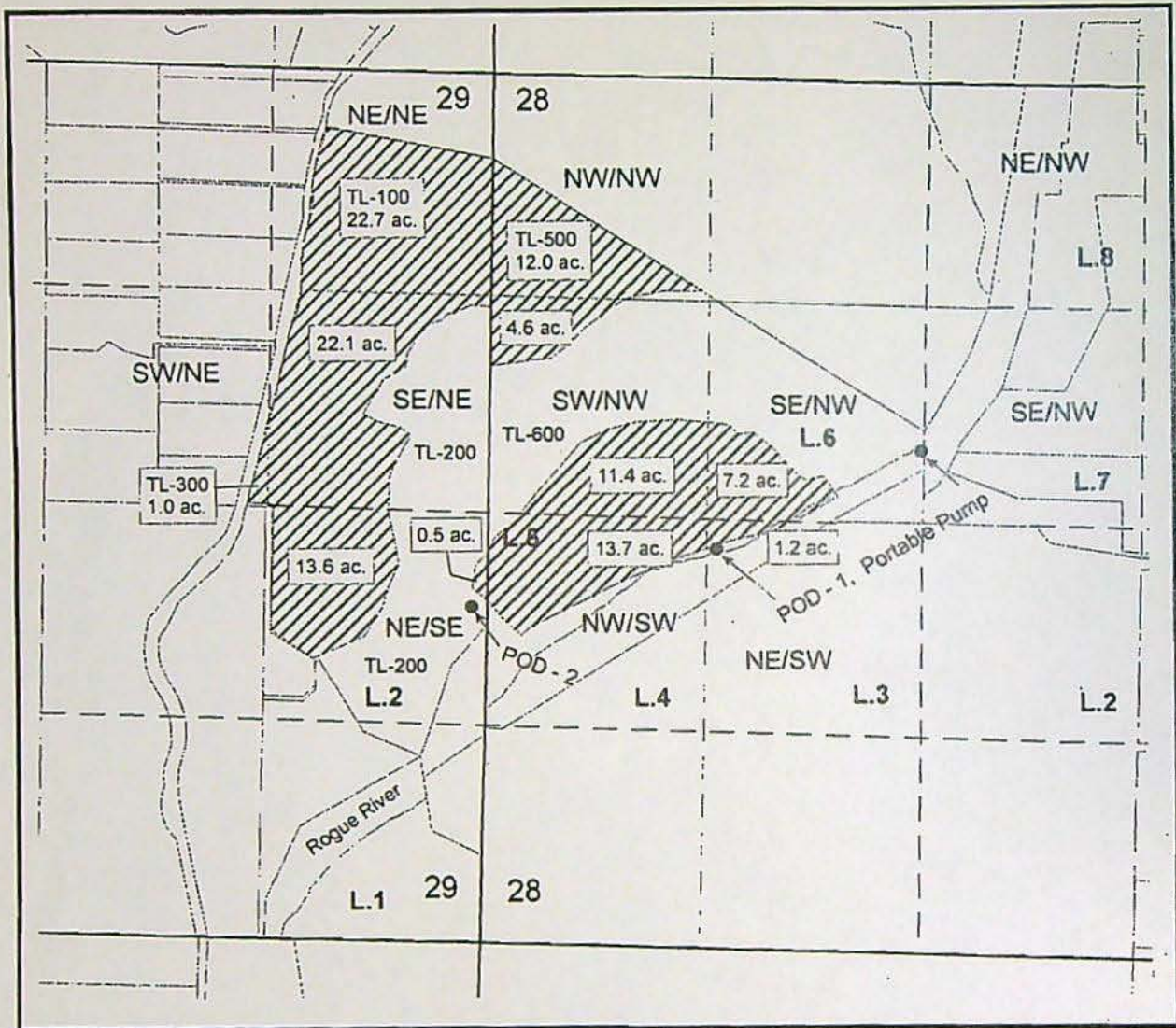

Currently I am the caseworker assigned to Permit Amendment T-14304 for John E. McCaw Jr. c/o Orca Bay Capital.

This application and map have gone through changes and I want to make sure that you both have an opportunity to review this application in its entirety. The original application proposed a change in place of use to non-contiguous land which is not allowed under the Statute (statute below for your reference). Attached are revised versions of the maps and Table 2 from the application, along with the original application in its entirety and the original map, so you can see the changes that were made by the applicant. If you have any questions, please let me know. Have a great week!

ORS 537.211 - Issuance of permit if application approved (4)(5)(9)

- (4) The holder of a water right permit may change the point of diversion, change the point of appropriation, change the point of diversion to allow the appropriation of ground water or use the water on land to which the right is not appurtenant if:
 - a) The use of water on land to which the right is not appurtenant, the change of point of diversion or the change in point of appropriation does not result in injury to an existing water right;
 - b) **For a proposed change in the place of use of the water, the land on which the water is to be used is owned or controlled by the holder of the permit and is contiguous to the land to which the permit is appurtenant;**
 - c) All other terms of the permit remain the same, including but not limited to the beneficial use for which the water is used and the number of acres to which water is applied;
 - d) Prior approval is obtained from the district if the water is transported or conveyed by an irrigation district organized under ORS chapter 545, a drainage district organized under ORS chapter 547, a water improvement district organized under ORS chapter 552, a water control district organized under ORS chapter 553 or a district improvement company or a corporation organized under ORS chapter 554;
 - e) The holder of the permit provides written notice to the department at least 60 days before making any changes to the lands, point of diversion or point of appropriation described in the permit;
 - f) The holder of the permit complies with the publication requirements of ORS 540.520 (Application for change of use, place of use or point of diversion) (5), if applicable;
 - g) Diversion is provided with a proper fish screen, if requested by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife; and
 - h) For a request to transfer the point of diversion to allow the appropriation of ground water, the proposed change meets the standards set forth in ORS 540.531 (Transfer of surface water point of diversion to ground water) (2) or (3).
- (5) Notwithstanding the requirements of subsection (4)(b) of this section, the holder of a water right permit may change the place of use of all or any portion of water under the permit to land that is not contiguous to the land to which the permit is appurtenant if:
 - a) The change to noncontiguous land is in furtherance of mitigation or conservation efforts undertaken for the purposes of benefiting a species listed as sensitive, threatened or endangered under ORS 496.171 (Definitions for ORS 496.171 to 496.182) to 496.192 (Effect of law on commercial forestland or other private land) or the federal Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 to 1544), as determined by the listing agency; and
 - b) All other requirements of subsection (4) of this section are met.

(9) As used in this section, "contiguous" includes land separated from the land to which a water right is appurtenant by roads, utility corridors, irrigation ditches or publicly owned rights of way.
