

NORTH POWDER M. AND M. MILL RACE DITCH: - That the Mill Race Ditch of the North Powder Milling and Mercantile Company, a corporation, incorporated under the laws of the State of Oregon, taps North Powder River at a point on the right bank in the SE4 NE4, of Section 28, Tp. 6 S. R. 39 E. W. M. diverting the waters of North Powder River down to the flouring mill of said company, for the purpose of producing and developing power for the operation of said mill, and that said ditch has a maximum carrying capacity of thirty five and five-tenths (35.5) second feet, or fourteen hundred and twenty (1420) miner's inches. That in the year 1870, the predecessors in interest of said company commenced, and within two years thereafter, completed the construction of a flouring mill on the left bank of North Powder River, in Union County, Oregon, and diverted water from the river at a point about one mile west of the Mill site, through a Mill Race constructed for that purpose, and made an appropriation of the waters of said stream to the extent of one thousand (1000) inches of said waters, miner's measurement, under six inch pressure, or twenty-five (25) second feet, that thereafter and within a reasonable time, said predecessors put the amount so appropriated to beneficial use, for the development of said power and operation of said mill.

That on the 12th day of January, 1898, at a regular term of the Circuit

Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Union, in the certain suit wherein the

North Powder MillingCompany, a predecessor of said above named corporation, was

plaintiff, and one W. A. Coughanour, claimant to the waters of Anthony Creek herein,

and another, were defendants, a decree was entered wherein and whereby it was determined

and decreed that said plaintiff was the owner of one thousand (1000) inches of water,

miner's measurement, under six inch pressure, of the natural flow of said worth forces alver, and its tributaries, above the diversion point of said will Race, to be used for the purpose of generating power for the operation of said will at any and all seasons of the year; and said defendant was forever inhibited and enjoined from in any manner diverting from the channel of Anthony Creek, or North Powder River, at any point or points above the head of plaintiff's mill race, any of the waters flowing in said stream, when such diversion would have effect of preventing one thousand (1000) inches of water from reaching the head of plaintiff's Mill Race, as then located, in the natural channel of North Powder River, unobstructed, for the use of plaintiff and its said Mill; that upon appeal to the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, from said decree, the same was affirmed in all things.

That from the conclusion of law and findings of fact in said suit, and said decree, and the opinion of the Supreme Court therein, as well as the proofs of the various parties herein, and the record and testimony in this proceeding, it is found that on October 4th, 1880, the predecessors in interest of said Coughanour, defendant in said suit, posted at a point on the left bank of Anthony Creek about eleven (11) miles above the head of said Mill Race, and filed for record in the office of the County Clerk of said Union County, a notice of appropriation, subscribed by them, to the effect that they intended to, and would appropriate two thousand (2000) inches of the waters of said creek, to be diverted at said point and conducted in ditches and flumes, to the town of North Powder, to be used for agricultural, mining and mechanical purposes; and that the said predecessors of said claimant, immediately thereafter commenced the construction of that certain ditch, known herein and heretofore referred to as the Coughanour Ditch, and the same was thereafter and in March, 1886, completed, and the waters of said Creek diverted and conducted through said ditch down to and upon said lands, now owned by Coughanour; that said Coughanour is now the owner of about one thousand three hundred and sixty (1360) acres of lands of an arid character, requiring for the profitable cultivation thereof, the application of water during the irrigation season; and of which lands, over one thousand (1000) acres appear to be susceptible of irrigation with the waters diverted through said ditch; that said Coughanour raises, and has raised, with the aid of said waters so diverted; valuable crops of grass, hay, grain, fruits, and vegetables; but that the larger portions of said lands are cultivated to crops of grain of various kinds, and particularly wheat; and said lands are summerfallowed each succeeding year, or every other year, so that about one-half of the said grain lands so summerfallowed are irrigated the same year; that the irrigation season for wheat and other grains grown upon said lands, commencing subsequent to the 15th day of/each year, and terminates prior to July 1st of each year, that said lands were first irrigated in the year 1687; that by a gradual increase in the irrigated area of lands, about eight hundred (800) acres of said lands were reclaimed and irrigated prior to the year 1900; and that in the year 1900 and by gradual increase thereafter, until the year 1909, about three hundred and forty-eight (348) acres were added to the cultivated and reclaimed area of lands.

That since the year 1880 and prior to 1900, many intervening rights of

appropriation have been initiated, both from said Anthony Creek and from said North Powder River; and that the irrigation of said additional lands, commencing in the year 1900, was the initiation of a new and distinct right of appropriation as of the year 1900,

That S. W. Holmes, and his predecessors, have since the year 1888, diverted and used the waters flowing from said Mill Race, and into the tail race thereof, through a ditch known as the Sanders Ditch, for the irrigation of one hundred and seven and one-half (1072) acres of his said lands, more particularly described in the order of determination herein; that mid lands were reclaimed and irrigated within a reasonable time since the year 1888, but that said claimant has no rights of appropriation of the waters of North Powder River, by virtue of said use, but his right of use is confined to the waters flowing in said tail race, down to the head of said ditch.

That for the proper irrigation of the lands belonging to the said S. W. Holmes, one inch to the acre is required until July 1st, and thereafter,, one-half inch to the acre is sufficient, and that said claimant is entitled to one hundred and seven and one-half inches of said tail race waters until July 1st, and thereafter to fifty-four (54) inches.

CONTEST OF C. E. DAVIS AND OTHERS AGAINST ANDREW LUN: - That within the time permitted by law, C. E. Davis, A. E. Davis, W. J. Welch, W. S. Doherty, E. H. Pratt, P. L. Smith and Chris Johnson, claimants herein, filed a statement of contest against the rights claimed by Andrew Lun herein; and the same was duly and regularly set for hearing; upon notice to all parties thereto, given according to law; that the same came regularly on for hearing upon the 28th day of July, 1911, at the hour of ten o'clock A. M. pursuant to such notice, at the City Hall in the City of North Powder, Union County, Oregon, and testimony therein was taken, and a record thereof made and filed in this proceeding.

That from the testimony taken in said contest, and from the evidence herein; and exhibits introduced, it is found and determined:

1. That the defendant, Andrew Lun, is the owner and in possession of about fifteen (15) acres of land along the east side of the E2 of the NW2 of Section 28; also all that part of the NW4 of Section 27, lying southeast of the railroad, and being about one hundred and fifty (150) acres; also all that part of the SE4 of the SW4 of Section 22, lying southeast of the railroad, and being about twenty-five and six-tenths (25.6) acres; also all that part of the SW4 SW4 of Section 22, lying southeast of the railroad and being about two (2) acres; also all that part of the NW4 SE4 of Section 22, lying southeast of the railroad and being about eleven and six-tenths(11.6) acres; all of the NE4 SE4 of Section 22; and also three (3) acres in the southeast corner of the SE4 NE4 of Section 22; also all of the SW4 SE4 of Section 22, excepting four (4) acres in asquare located in the Southeast corner thereo f; all of said property being situated in township 6 S. R. 59 E. W. M., and in Union and Baker Counties, Oregon; that

On October 31, 1946, John W. Davis and William E. Davis of North Powder, Oregon, filed an application for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from North Powder River, pursuant to the provisions of Section 116-606, O. C. L. A.

By decree of the Circuit Court for Union County, Oregon, dated May 1, 1916, in the matter of the determination of the relative rights to the waters of North Powder River, and its tributaries, a water right was recognized in the name of S. W. Holmes from Powder River with a date of priority of 1887 for the irrigation of $259\frac{1}{2}$ acres, as follows:

35 acres in NW¼ NE¾

The above lands are irrigated by means of the Harlan-Sanders ditch, the point of diversion of said ditch being located approximately 865 feet north and 2216 feet west from the southeast corner of Section 28, and being within the SW4 SE4, said Section 28, Township 6 South, Range 39 East, W. M.

John W. Davis and William E. Davis, owners of the above described land, proposes to use the Jacobson ditch for the irrigation of the lands in Sections 24 and 26, and to continue the use of the Harlan-Sanders ditch for the irrigation of the lands in Section 23. The point of diversion of the Jacobson ditch is located approximately 145 feet north and 3148 feet west from the southeast corner of Section 28, and being within the SE¹₄ SW¹₄, said Section 28, Township 6 South, Range 39 East, W. M.

Notice by publication, as provided by Section 116-606, O.C.L.A., was not given in connection with this application for the reason that said section provides that in applications for a change in point of diversion of less than one-fourth mile and where there are no intervening diversions between the old diversion of the applicant and his proposed new diversion, no notice shall be required to be published.

No objections having been filed and it appearing from a report submitted by Mr. Floyd Willis, Watermaster of District No. 14, that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion of water from North Powder River, to-wit:

From the point of diversion of the Harlan-Sanders ditch, located approximately 865 feet north and 2216 feet west from the southeast corner of Section 28 and being within the SW_4^1 SE_4^1 , said Section 28, Township 6 South, Range 39 East, W. M.,

To the point of diversion of the Jacobson ditch, located approximately 145 feet north and 3148 feet west from the southeast corner of Section 28, and being within the SE_4^1 SW_4^1 , said Section 28, Township 6 South, Range 39 East, W. M.

for the irrigation of 37 acres in the NW_4^1 SW_4^1 , Section 24; $23\frac{1}{2}$ acres in the

 NE_4^1 , NE_4^1 , $38\frac{1}{2}$ acres in the NW_4^1 , NE_4^1 , 34 acres in the SE_4^1 , NE_4^1 , and 40 acres in the NE_4^1 , NW_4^1 , Section 26, Township 6 South, Range 39 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1887, be and the same is hereby approved.

of the State Engineer, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from September 21, 1928;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 5.09 cubic feet per second.

The point of diversion is located in the "E4SE1" of Section 22 , TownshipS , Rang 59E , W. M. The use hereunder for irrigation shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation.

A description of the lands irrigated under the right hereby confirmed, and to which such right is appurtuant (if for irrigation or any other purpose), is as follows: 40 acres in the SW4NE4, 37 acres in the SE4NE4, 40 acres in the WE4SE4, 40 acres in the NW4SE4, 25 acres in the SW4SE4, Section 23, and 40 acres in the SW4SE4, Section 23, and 40 acres in the SW4SE4, Section 24, Township 6 South, Range 39 East, Willamette Meridian, in Baker County, Oregon.

Nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to require the North Powder Hilling and Mercantile Company to operate its mill or canal.

The right to the use of the water for any purpose is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

After the expiration of fifty years from the date of this certificate or on the expiration of any federal power license issued in connection with this right, and after not less than two years notice in writing to the holder hereof, the State of Oregon, or any municipality thereof, shall have the right to take over the dams, plants and other structures and all appurtenances thereto which have been constructed for the purpose of devoting to beneficial use the water rights specified herein, upon condition that before taking possession the State or municipality shall pay not to exceed the fair value of the property so taken, plus such reasonable damages, if any, to valuable, serviceable and dependable property of the holder of this certificate, not taken over, as may be caused by the severance therefrom of the property taken in accordance with the provisions of section 5728, Oregon Laws.

DECREE OF CORRECTED MANDATE

Now on this 3rd day of June, 1934, the above entitled matter comes on for the making and entry of decree on the corrected Mandate of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon in the above entitled cause, plaintiff appearing by his attorneys, Hallock, Donald and Banta, of Baker, Oregon, defendant, Gerald Peterson, appearing by his attorneys, Hubbard & Godwin, of Baker, Oregon, and the defendant, Charles E. Stricklin, appearing not, either in person, or by counsel, and it appearing to the Court:

That this is a suit in equity in connection with which there was heretofore and on the 11th day of January, 1933, entered by the above entitled court a certain
decree from which the above named defendant, Gerald Peterson, appealed to the Supreme
Court of the State of Oregon, that thereafter and following consideration of said appeal
by said Supreme Court said court caused to be made, filed and transmitted to the Clerk of
the above entitled court a certain Mandate and said Mandate was later recalled and a
corrected Mandate duly made by said Supreme Court on the 22nd day of May, 1934, and thereafter, on May 31st, 1934, duly transmitted to and filed with the Clerk of the above entitled court, and that said corrected Mandate was and is in words and figures as follows,
to-wit:

(Heading and title omitted)

The Court on May 1st, 1934, having granted a motion on recalling mandate in this case, and the Mandate having been returned by the Clerk of Baker County and now being in possession of the Clerk of this Court, it is, therefore, ordered that the decree and mandate of this court be corrected to read as follows:

This cause at Pendleton on October 31st, 1933, having been duly tried, argued and submitted upon and concerning all questions arising upon the transcript record and evidence and then reserved for further consideration, and the court having fully

considered all said questions as well as suggestions of counsel in their argument and briefs, finds there is error as alleged.

It is, therefore, CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND DECREED that the decree of the court below in this cause rendered and entered be and the same is in all things reversed and set aside:

The Court having fully considered the allegations of the parties, and the evidence adduced, finds that the equities of the case are with the appellant and that plaintiff has not made out a case entitling him to equitable relief; it is, therefore, CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND DECREED that the decree of the Court below be and the same is hereby reversed and set aside, and the injunction against defendants is hereby dissolved.

It is further ORDERED AND DECREED that the defendant, Gerald Peterson, be declared to be entitled to the right to the use of the waters of North Powder River, a tributary of Powder River, for the purpose of irrigating the lands described in his water right certificate, except during the months of July and August of each year. Such right is limited to the amount actually and beneficially used for said purposes, not to exceed 3.09 cubic feet per second, is limited to one eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation, with a date of relative priority of September 21, 1928, the point of diversion being located in the NE2SE2 of Section 29, township 6 S., Range 39, E., W.M., with right to be in accordance with the water right certificate issued to said defendant by the State Engineer, of date November 25, 1931.

It is further ORDERED AND DECREED that neither the North Powder Milling and Mercantile Company, nor the plaintiff, nor the upper irrigators from the North Powder River, have a right to change the place of use of the 25 second feet of water awarded to the Milling Company for power purposes to a place of use above the mill canal, or change the character of use from one of power purposes or a non-consuming use at the mill, to one for the purpose of irrigating the lands of the plaintiff and the upper irrigators, which would consume all, or nearly all, of such water, so as to deprive defendant, Peterson, of the waters to which he is entitled by virtue of his appropriation, namely, 3.09 second feet at the head of his ditch limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation, except during the months of July and August of each year.

It is further ORDERED AND DECREED that if after satisfying Peterson's needs, the Milling Company desires to make an arrangement with the upper irrigators for the change of use and place of use of the balance of the 25 second feet awarded to the Milling Company, and it can be done without prejudice to the rights of others, proper application should be made to the State Engineer in accordance with the provisions of Section 47-712, Oregon Code, 1930.

It is further ORDERED AND DECREED that if it so desires, the Milling Company may, for short periods of time when it does not desire, or need, to use all or any part of

the water to which it is entitled, allow the Watermaster to distribute its waters to the other users in accordance with their respective rights, but this arrangement must not interfere with the rights of Peterson, or must be done after his rights have been supplied.

This decree shall be construed in accordance with the opinion filed herein.

It is further ORDERED AND DECREED that the appelant recover of and from respondent his costs and disbursements in this court taxed at \$235.50.

It is further ORDERED that this cause be remanded to the court below from which the appeal was taken, with directions to enter a decree in accordance herewith.

Now, Therefore, based upon said corrected Mandate, it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the decree of the above entitled court made and entered in this cause on the 11th day of January, 1933, and hereinabove more particularly referred to is in all things reversed and set aside and the injunction recitals therein contained are hereby dissolved.

It is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the defendant, Gerald Peterson, be declared to be entitled to the right to the use of the waters of North Powder River, a tributary of Powder River, for the purpose of irrigating the lands described in his water right certificate, except during the months of July and August of each year. Such right is limited to the amount actually and beneficially used for said purposes, not to exceed 3.09 cubic feet per second, and is limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation, with a date of relative priority of September 21, 1928, the point of diversion being located in the NELSEL of Section 22, Tp. 6 S., R. 39 E., W.M., and such right to be in accordance with the water right certificate issued to said defendant by the State Engineer, of date November 25, 1931.

And it is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that neither the North Powder milling and Mercantile Company, nor the Plaintiff, nor the upper irrigators from the North Powder River, have a right to change the place of use of the 25 second feet of water awarded to the Milling Company for power purposes to a place of use above the mill canal, or change the character of use from one for power purposes or a non-consuming use at the mill, to one for the purpose of irrigation of the lands of plaintiff and the upper irrigators, which would consume all, or nearly all, of such water, so as to deprive defendant Peterson of the water to which he is entitled by virtue of his appropriation, namely, 3.09 second feet at the head of his ditch, limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation, except during the months of July and August of each year.

And it is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that if, after satisfying Peterson's needs, the Milling Company desires to make an arrangement with the upper irrigators,

for the change of use and place of use of the balance of the 25 second feet awarded to the Milling Company, and it can be done without prejudice to the rights of others, proper application should be made to the State Engineer in accordance with the provisions of Section 47-712, Oregon Code, 1930.

And it is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that if it so desires, the Milling Company may, for short periods of time when it does not desire or need to use all or any part of the water to which it is entitled, allow the watermaster to distribute its water to the other users in accordance with their respective rights, but this arrangement must not interfere with the rights of Peterson, or must be done after his rights have been supplied.

And it further appearing to the court that Respondent has fully paid and discharged appellant's cost bill in the Supreme Court,

It is further ORDERED AND DECREED that Appellant's Cost Bill in the Supreme Court in the sum of \$235.50, is, and the same is hereby declared and decreed to be paid and discharged in full.
