Authority

Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.211 establishes the process in which a water right permit holder may submit a request to change the point of appropriation and/or place of use authorized under an existing water right permit.

Findings of Fact

1. On April 30, 2020, CITY OF ST. PAUL, ATTN: MIKE DOLAN filed an application for an additional point of appropriation under Permit G-17743. The Department assigned the application number T-13430.
2. On October 2, 2015, the Department approved an extension of time for Permit G-15273, for complete application of water to October 1, 2059.
3. On February 5, 2017, the Department issued a Final Order (Special Order Volume 103, Page 939), approving an additional point of appropriation. The Department subsequently issued superseding Permit G-17728, describing the changes.
4. On March 14, 2017, the Department issued a Correcting Final Order (Special Order Volume 104, Page 146), and subsequently issued superseding Permit G-17743.
5. On August 2, 2019, the Department approved a Final Order (Special Order Volume 113, Page 799), approving a Water Management and Conservation Plan (WMCP), authorizing the City of St. Paul to divert 0.67 cubic foot per second (cfs) of water out of the total permitted 1.25 cfs under Permit G-17743.
6. Notice of the application for the permit amendment was published in the Department's weekly notice on May 12, 2020, pursuant to ORS 540.520(5). No comments were filed in response to the notice.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 and OAR 690-01-0005 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

7. Permit Amendment Application T-13430 proposes an additional point of appropriation approximately 0.2 mile from the existing points of appropriation to:

Permit Amendment Review Criteria

8. The change would not result in injury to other water rights.
9. The change does not enlarge the permit.
10. The change does not alter any other terms of the permit.

Conclusions of Law

The additional point of appropriation proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-13430 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.211.

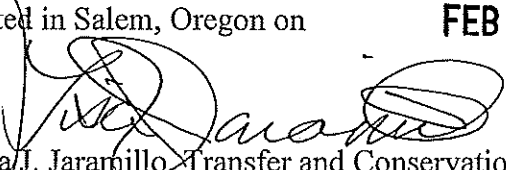
Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The additional point of appropriation proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-13430 is approved.
2. Permit G-18504, in the name of CITY OF ST. PAUL, is issued to replace Permit G-17743, and incorporates the amendments approved by this order, the extension of time, and the Water Management and Conservation Plan. Permit G-17743, in the name of CITY OF SAINT PAUL, is no longer of any force or effect.
3. The combined quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of appropriation (Rodeo Well), together with that diverted at the old points of appropriation (Well 2 and New Well), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation (Well 2 and New Well).
4. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original points of appropriation.
5. The City of St. Paul Water Management and Conservation Plan is approved and shall remain in effect until **August 1, 2029**, unless this approval is rescinded pursuant to OAR 690-086-0920.
6. The limitation of the diversion of water under **Permit G-17743** established in the Final Order approving an Extension of Time for Permit G-17743 (*issued on October 2, 2015*) remains unchanged. Subject to other limitations or conditions of the permit, therefore, the City of St. Paul remains authorized to divert only up to **0.67 cfs (out of the total permitted 1.25 cfs)** of water under Permit **G-17743**.
7. The City of St. Paul shall submit an updated plan meeting the requirements of OAR Chapter 690, Division 086 within **10 years** and no later than **February 1, 2029**.

8. The City of St. Paul shall submit a progress report containing the information required under OAR 690-086-0120(4) by **August 1, 2024**.
9. The deadline established herein for the submittal of an updated Water Management and Conservation Plan (consistent with OAR Chapter 690, Division 086) shall not relieve the City of St. Paul from any existing or future requirement(s) for submittal of a Water Management and Conservation Plan at an earlier date as established through other final orders of the Department.
10. All other terms and conditions of Permit G-18504 remain the same.

This superseding permit is issued to describe an amendment for an additional point of appropriation proposed under Permit Amendment Application T-13430 and approved by Special Order Vol. 118, Page SD, entered February 18, 2021, an amendment for an additional point of appropriation proposed under Permit Amendment Application T-12471 and approved by Special Order Vol. 103, Page 939, entered February 15, 2017, and correcting order approved by Special Order Vol. 144, Page 146, entered March 14, 2017, and extensions of time for complete application approved October 2, 2015, and Final Order approving a Water Management and Conservation Plan, approved by Special Order Vol. 113, Page 799, entered August 2, 2019. This permit supersedes Permit G-17743.

The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

Permit Amendment T-13430 Conditions:

The combined quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of appropriation (Rodeo Well), together with that diverted at the old points of appropriation (Well 2 and New Well), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point(s) of appropriation (Well 2 and New Well).

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original points of appropriation.

Permit Amendment T-12471 Conditions:

The combined quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (New Well), together with that diverted at the old point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original points of appropriation.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or other suitable measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the right.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall develop a plan to monitor and report the impact of water use under this permit on water levels within the aquifer that provides water to the permitted wells. The plan shall be submitted to the Department within one year of the date the permit is issued and shall be subject to the approval of the Department. At a minimum, the plan shall include a program to periodically measure static water levels

within the permitted well (s) or an adequate substitution such as water levels in nearby wells. The plan shall also stipulate a reference water level against which any water-level declines will be compared. If a well listed on this permit (or replacement well) displays a total static water-level decline of 25 or more feet over any period of years, as compared to the reference level, then the water user shall discontinue use of, or reduce the rate or volume of withdrawal from, the well (s). Such action shall be taken until the water level recovers to above the 25-foot decline level or until the Department determines, based on the water user's and/or the Department's data and analysis, that no action is necessary because the aquifer in question can sustain the observed declines without adversely impacting the resource or senior water rights. The water user shall in no instance allow excessive decline, as defined in Commission rules, to occur within the aquifer as a result of use under this permit.

Extension of Time Conditions:

Development Limitations

Appropriation of any water beyond 0.67 cfs up to 1.25 cfs under Permit G-15273 shall only be authorized upon issuance of a final order approving a Water Management and Conservation Plan (WMCP) under OAR Chapter 690, Division 86 that authorizes access to a greater rate of appropriation of water under the permit consistent with OAR 690-086-0130(7). The required WMCP shall be submitted to the Department within 3 years of this Final Order. The amount of water used under Permit G-15273 must be consistent with this and subsequent WMCP's approved under OAR Chapter 690, Division 86 on file with the Department.

The deadline established in this Extension Final Order for submittal of a WMCP shall not relieve a permit holder of any existing or future requirement for submittal of a WMCP at an earlier date as established through other orders of the Department. A WMCP submitted to meet the requirements of this final order may also meet the WMCP submittal requirements of other Department orders.

Water Management and Conservation Plan Conditions:

The City of St. Paul Water Management and Conservation Plan is approved and shall remain in effect until August 1, 2029, unless this approval is rescinded pursuant to OAR 690-086-0920.

The limitation of the diversion of water under **Permit G-17743** established in the Final Order approving an Extension of Time for Permit G-17743 (issued on October 2, 2015) remains unchanged. Subject to other limitations or conditions of the permit, therefore, the City of St. Paul remains authorized to divert only up to **0.67 cfs (out of the total permitted 1.25 cfs)** of water under Permit G-17743.

The City of St. Paul shall submit an updated plan meeting the requirements of OAR Chapter 690, Division 086 within **10 years** and no later than **February 1, 2029**.

The City of St. Paul shall submit a progress report containing the information required under OAR 690-086-0120(4) by **August 1, 2024**.

The deadline established herein for the submittal of an updated Water Management and Conservation Plan (consistent with OAR Chapter 690, Division 086) shall not relieve the City of St. Paul from any existing or future requirement(s) for submittal of a Water Management and Conservation Plan at an earlier date as established through other final orders of the Department.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the wells shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate such interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

The wells shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water-level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

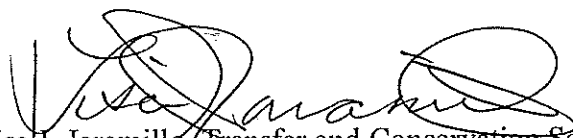
The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

The original permit was issued November 6, 2002. Completion of construction and complete application of the water to the use was to be made on or before October 1, 2007. By Extension of Time Final Order dated October 2, 2015, the deadline for complete application of water to the use was extended to October 1, 2059. If beneficial use of permitted water has not been made before this date, the permittee may submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merit of the application.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Application History

Permit G-15273 was issued by the Department on November 6, 2002. The permit called for complete application of water to beneficial use by October 1, 2007. On June 29, 2015, the City of St. Paul submitted an application to the Department for an extension of time for Permit G-15273. In accordance with OAR 690-315-0050(2), on August 11, 2015, the Department issued a Proposed Final Order proposing to extend the time to fully apply water to beneficial use to October 1, 2059. The protest period closed September 25, 2015, in accordance with OAR 690-

315-0060(1). No protest was filed.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Department adopts and incorporates by reference the findings of fact in the Proposed Final Order dated August 11, 2015.

At time of issuance of the Proposed Final Order the Department concluded that, based on the factors demonstrated by the applicant, the permit may be extended subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

1. Development Limitations

Appropriation of any water beyond 0.67 cfs up to 1.25 cfs under Permit G-15273 shall only be authorized upon issuance of a final order approving a Water Management and Conservation Plan (WMCP) under OAR Chapter 690, Division 86 that authorizes access to a greater rate of appropriation of water under the permit consistent with OAR 690-086-0130(7). The required WMCP shall be submitted to the Department within 3 years of this Final Order. The amount of water used under Permit G-15273 must be consistent with this and subsequent WMCP's approved under OAR Chapter 690, Division 86 on file with the Department.

The deadline established in this Extension Final Order for submittal of a WMCP shall not relieve a permit holder of any existing or future requirement for submittal of a WMCP at an earlier date as established through other orders of the Department. A WMCP submitted to meet the requirements of this final order may also meet the WMCP submittal requirements of other Department orders.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The applicant has demonstrated good cause for the permit extension pursuant to ORS 537.630, 539.010(5) and OAR 690-315-0080(3).

ORDER

The extension of time for Application G-14300, Permit G-15273, therefore, is approved subject to conditions contained herein. The deadline for applying water to full beneficial use within the terms and conditions of the permit is extended from October 1, 2007 to October 1, 2059.

Authority

OAR Chapter 690, Division 086, establishes the process and criteria for approving water management and conservation plans required under the conditions of permits, permit extensions and other orders of the Department. An approved water management and conservation plan may authorize the diversion and use of water under a permit extended pursuant to OAR Chapter 690, Division 315.

Findings of Fact

1. The City of St. Paul submitted a Water Management and Conservation Plan (plan) to the Water Resources Department (Department) on December 27, 2018. The plan was required by a condition set forth in the final order issued on October 2, 2015 approving an extension of time for Permit G-17743 (*formerly Permit G-15273*).
2. The Department published notice of receipt of the plan on January 8, 2019, as required under OAR Chapter 690, Division 086. No comments were received.
3. The Department provided written comments on the plan to the City on March 4, 2019. In response, the City submitted a revised plan on May 22, 2019.
4. The Department reviewed the revised plan and finds that it contains all of the elements required under OAR 690-086-0125 and OAR 690-086-0130.

Conclusion of Law

The Water Management and Conservation Plan submitted by the City of St. Paul is consistent with the criteria in OAR Chapter 690, Division 086.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Now, therefore, it is **ORDERED**:

Duration of Plan Approval:

1. The City of St. Paul Water Management and Conservation Plan is approved and shall remain in effect until **August 1, 2029**, unless this approval is rescinded pursuant to OAR 690-086-0920.

Development Limitation:

2. The limitation of the diversion of water under **Permit G-17743** established in the Final Order approving an Extension of Time for Permit G-17743 (*issued on October 2, 2015*) remains unchanged. Subject to other limitations or conditions of the permit, therefore, the City of St. Paul remains authorized to divert only up to **0.67 cfs** (*out of the total permitted 1.25 cfs*) of water under Permit G-17743.

Plan Update Schedule:

3. The City of St. Paul shall submit an updated plan meeting the requirements of OAR Chapter 690, Division 086 within **10 years** and no later than **February 1, 2029**.

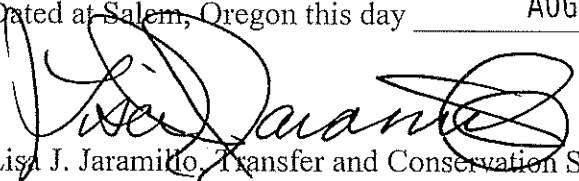

Basic description of the changes proposed in this transfer: The applicant proposes to add 1 APOA ("Rodeo Well"/MARI 65671) to Permit G-17743, which authorizes up to 1.25 cfs for Municipal Use from September through June annually. Permit G-17743 allows for use of water year-round from authorized POA which exclude the upper water-bearing zone between 60 and 87 ft below land surface (bls). The proposed APOA (MARI 65671) is sealed to a depth of 198 ft bls.

The application identifies authorized POA 2, "New Well", as MARI 68037, which is an abandonment log for a 25-ft deep "8[-inch] Clay cased waterwell" ~500 ft northwest of the authorized POA 2 location under Permit G-17743. A letter from Owen McMurtrey of GSI Water Solutions dated March 9, 2020 (which accompanied Limited License Application LL-1822) stated that the "New Well" was never completed. This review assumes that authorized POA 2 ("New Well") was never completed and would be located as indicated in Permit G-17743 and on the application map for T-13430.

Permit G-17743 indicates that authorized POA 2, "New Well", is in the NW ¼ of the SE ¼ of Section 9, Township 4 South, Range 2 West. However, the "Measured Distances" for POA 2 on the permit correspond to a location in the SE ¼ of the NE ¼ of Section 9 Township 4 South, Range 2 West.

The reduced intervening distance will likely result in an increase in interference with MARI 17253.

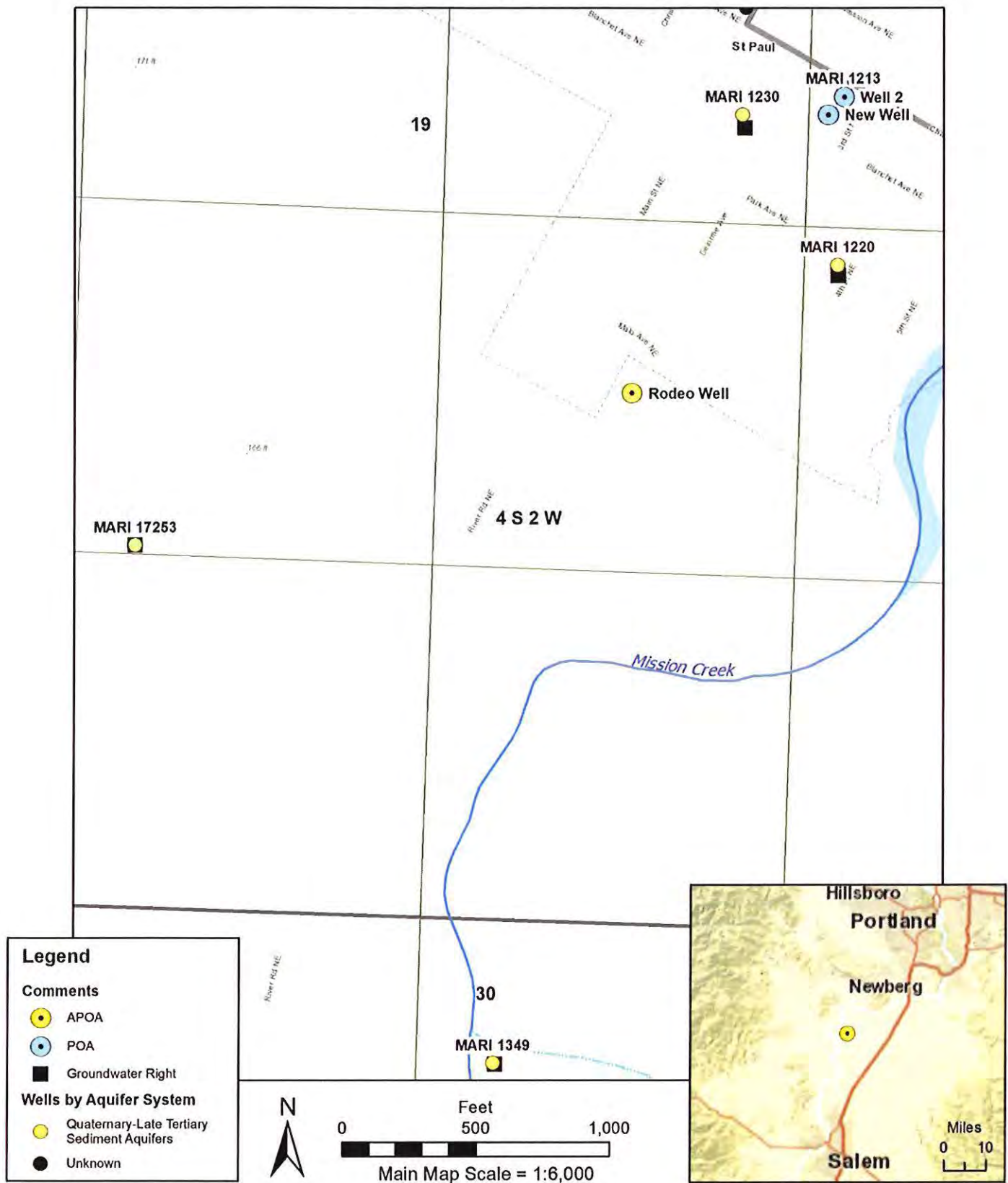

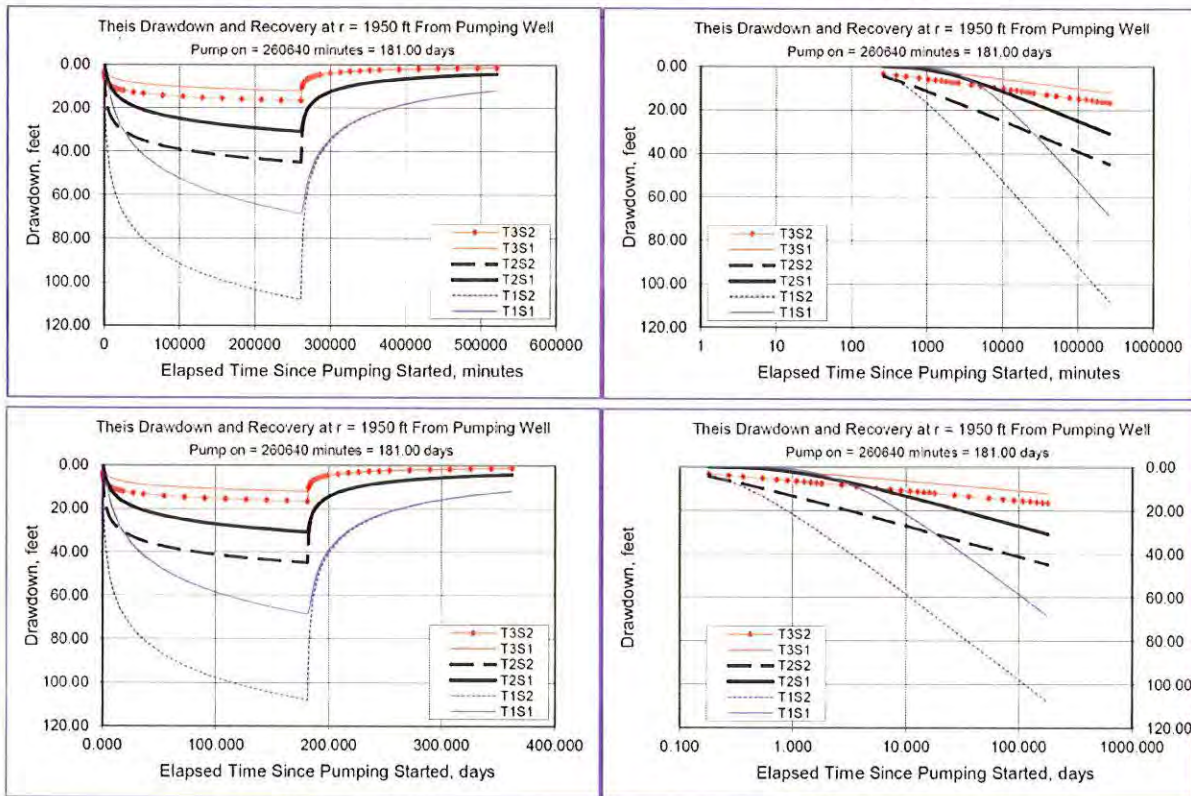

This permit supersedes Permit G-17728.

Permit Amendment T-12471 conditions

The combined quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (New Well), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order, shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The water user shall develop a plan to monitor and report the impact of water use under this permit on water levels within the aquifer that provides water to the permitted wells. The plan shall be submitted to the Department within one year of the date the permit is issued and shall be subject to the approval of the Department. At a minimum, the plan shall include a program to periodically measure static water levels within the permitted wells or an adequate substitute such as water levels in nearby wells. The plan shall also stipulate a reference water level against which any water-level declines will be compared. If a well listed on this permit (or replacement well) displays a total static water-level decline of 25 or more feet over any period of years, as compared to the reference level, then the water user shall discontinue use of, or reduce the rate or volume of withdrawal from, the wells. Such action shall be taken until the water level recovers to above the 25-foot decline level or until the Department determines, based on the water user's and/or the Department's data and analysis, that no action is necessary because the aquifer in question can sustain the observed declines without adversely impacting the resource or senior water rights. The water user shall in no instance allow excessive decline, as defined in Commission rules, to occur within the aquifer as a result of use under this permit.

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STANDARD CONDITIONS

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the wells shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

The wells shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

Please accept my apologies for the delay in responding to your recent letter requesting special standards for the use of concrete instead of cement grout as sealing material in large diameter wells that provide excessive seepage at the drill hole wall and the outside casing of the well. You are hereby granted special permission to use concrete instead of cement with the following provisions and conditions:

- 1) Concrete shall consist of clean, hard, durable aggregate, and not less than five sacks of Portland cement per cubic yard of concrete. The maximum size of the aggregate shall not exceed 3/4 of an inch.
- 2) If the well to be sealed is not dry, concrete shall be placed in the seal zone upward in one continuous lift.
- 3) In the event the bore hole space to be sealed is dry, concrete shall be placed through a tremie pipe to prevent segregation of the aggregate and cement mixture and to prevent bleeding.
- 4) The space between the sealing surfaces of all casings and between all cements and the bore hole shall exceed 3-inches or more.

Special standards to construct a well as described above shall not be applied to all wells constructed in such a manner. Each well shall have special standards on the well reports of a well log.

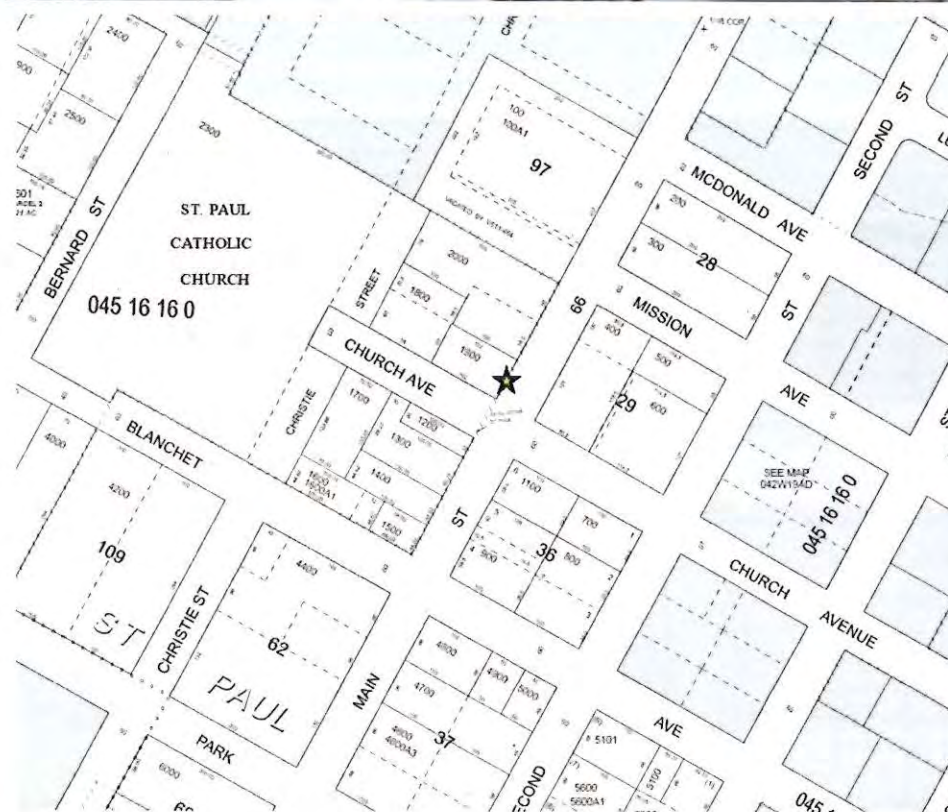
