1.4 **Subject Water Rights.** Lessors propose to lease all of the water right listed in 1.3, above.

- 1.5 **Validity of Rights.** Lessors attest that the subject water right is legally valid by having been beneficially used according to the terms of the right within the last five years and, if the right is for irrigation, on all lands indicated in *Exhibit D*.
- 1.6 Lease. Lessors agree to lease the water right listed in 1.4 for instream use for the term of this Agreement through Lessee to Trustee, the Oregon Water Resources Department, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 537.348(2) and OAR 690-77-077.
- 1.7 **Suspension of original use.** During the period of the lease, the owner agrees to suspend use of water allowed under the subject water right and under any water right that is supplemental to the subject water right.
- 1.8 **Water use reporting.** The Trustee agrees to fulfill legal obligations related to water use reporting.

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2.1 **Public Use.** The public use served by the amount, timing and location of the instream use provided for under this lease is:

2.2 **Instream use created by lease.** The instream use to be created is described as follows:

No. 8161

Mosier Creek, tributary to Columbia River in the Hood Basin

Location: Point at RM 4.7 (point of diversion)

Priority date: 1892 and 1898

Use: Described in Section 2.1, above

Total volume: 15 acre feet

Rate: .083 cfs

Period of use: March 1 to October 1

Conditions to prevent or mitigate injury, if any: The rate of the water right has been

adjusted as follows to meet seasonal duty restrictions:

The instream flow will be allocated beginning July 1 and continuing until October 1, or until such time that the total duty for the irrigation season is met.

- 2.3 **Term of lease.** This Lease shall commence on March 1, 1998 (not before the date of final execution by the parties) and continue through October 1, 1999.
- 2.4 **Compensation**. Lessors have agreed to lease the water right herein to the Oregon Water Trust for cash and other considerations and for the benefit of the people of the state of Oregon.
- 2.5 **Flow protection.** The Trustee will regulate use of water from the source, subject to prior appropriation and the agency enforcement guidance, to assure the water is delivered to the point of diversion, so long as flow is sufficient to meet the demand under priority date of the new instream use (see Section 2.2). No party is required to continuously measure the flow of the waterway described in Section 2.2.

Optional Provisions

- 2.6 **Additional monitoring.** Lessee does not intend to manage and participate in the protection of the instream use.
- 2.7 **Modification or termination provisions.** None

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- Watermaster review. By signature below, the watermaster for the district where the subject water right is located verifies that:
- 3.1 Lessors are currently entitled to appropriate water under the water right described in Section 1.4.

WATER RIGHT LEASE AGREEMENT

- 3.2 A suitable control is in place so that WRD staff may regulate use of water under the subject right to ensure water is not diverted or applied on lands to which subject right is attached.
- 3.3 Allocation of water to the new instream use described in Section 2.2 during the term of this lease is not reasonably expected to cause injury to other rights to use water from the same source.
