3.1 Accuracy. The Undersigned Lessor(s) and Lessee(s) declare that, to the best of their knowledge and belief, the information contained in this application is true, correct and complete. If after the lease order is signed, any information is determined to be false, the lease order may be modified or terminated. The lease only exercises the water rights being leased, for the term of the lease. It shall not be construed to overcome any claim that the water right may otherwise be subject to forfeiture for nonuse pursuant to ORS 540.610 during the period of time prior to the execution of the lease.

- Lease. Lessor(s) and Lessee(s) agree to lease the water rights listed in Section(s) 1.5 for 3.2 instream use for the term of this lease through Lessee to the Trustee, the Oregon Water Resources Department, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 537.348(2) and OAR 690-077.
- 3.3 Precedent. If a right which has been leased is later proposed to be leased again or transferred to an instream use under ORS 537.348 and OAR 690-077 a new injury review shall be required, and a prior lease shall not set a precedent for the amount of water to be

	leased or transferred instream.
3.4	Suspension of original use. During the period of the lease, the water right holder agrees to suspend use of water allowed under the subject water rights and under any water right that is supplemental to the subject water rights.

under Permit No. 34809 and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Oregon; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from December 8, 1969

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the stream. The point of diversion is located in the Lot 2 (NW4 NE4), Section 13, T. 23 S., R. 8 W., W. M., 480 feet South and 850 feet East from the N4 corner of Section 13.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited toone-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2½ acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year,

conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.





#### CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

EDWARD J. COOLEY P.O. BOX 642 ELKTON, OREGON 97436

confirms the right to use the waters of MEHL CREEK AND AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributaries of the UMPQUA RIVER, for PRIMARY IRRIGATION OF 2.5 ACRES, SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 1.4 ACRES AND DOMESTIC USE FOR TWO FAMILIES.

This right was perfected under Permit 46290. The date of priority is AUGUST 12, 1980. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.061 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.01 CFS FROM THE UNNAMED STREAM WHEN AVAILABLE WITH ANY DEFICIENCY IN SUPPLY AT THE UNNAMED STREAM TO BE MADE UP BY DIVERSION OF WATER FROM MEHL CREEK FOR DOMESTIC USE FOR TWO FAMILIES, 0.031 CFS FROM MEHL CREEK WHEN AVAILABLE WITH ANY DEFICIENCY IN SUPPLY AT MEHL CREEK TO BE MADE UP BY DIVERSION OF WATER FROM THE UNNAMED STREAM FOR IRRIGATION OF 2.5 ACRES, AND 0.02 CFS FROM THE UNNAMED STREAM FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 1.4 ACRES OF its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

NW% NE%, SECTION 13, T 23 S, R 8 W, W.M.; MEHL CREEK - 620 FEET SOUTH AND 860 FEET EAST; UNNAMED STREAM - 1250 FEET SOUTH AND 600 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM THE NORTH % CORNER OF SECTION 13.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a

diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
