

Dear Water Resources,

I am writing this letter to you in order to explain why my neighbors and I are requesting a transfer of surface irrigation water rights into pond maintenance water rights. These rights, dating back to 1888, were adjudicated in 1926. At that time, the sitting judge decided that we had so much water in the Metolius River valley we did not need any extra or "carrying" water allocated to convey our water rights through the diversion. Therefore, the only water we have is that which is allocated to the ten of us, with a very small amount for stock watering rights.

In 1991, the Metolius Meadows Development in which we live had to reallocate all of our water rights. The water master at the time could not have foreseen the current salmon restoration project and the impact it would have on our water rights. He assured me that we would always be allowed to have water running through our diversion year round. Therefore, he did not advise me to transfer any Metolius Meadows surface water rights into maintenance water rights for the pond you see in the photos. If I had known about pond maintenance water rights, I would have requested the transfer at that time. We also were not required to install a headgate on our diversion as the unused water flows back into Lake Creek. These decisions have now become a major issue with the salmon restoration project under way.

I have included several photographs to show you that we have diligently used this pond not only for irrigating our properties, but also as the only source of water (from the in-ground trough) for the horses, and as a wildlife area for all the birds, waterfowl, and native wildlife in the area to use freely. The Great Blue Heron visits frequently, as do the otters. The Canada Geese nest nearby and bring their goslings to swim and feed in the pond every spring. We also have four mated pairs of Wood Ducks every spring, along with Hooded Mergansers, Mallards, and Barrow's Goldeneye ducks. Deer have given birth to fawns close to the pond in the willows. We have frequent visits from raccoons, an occasional river mink, muskrat, and beaver.

Last fall we closed off the diversion at Lake Creek and began dredging the pond in preparation for lining it. The diversion has sat empty all winter. As you can see in the photos, some water remained in the pond over the winter. This water is an accumulation of groundwater, rain, and snowmelt over the winter. It appears that we have a water table that is several inches above the bottom of the pond, but not enough to keep the pond filled to the point of flowing through the culvert and down the rest of the canal. It is also not enough water to fill the horse trough, but enough to pose a danger as a muddy pit for the neighbors to walk by in the wintertime.

We have obtained a written approval from our homeowners' board to make the transfer of water for pond maintenance. I have had many conversations with our local Water Master Jeremy Giffin, Mathias Perle of Upper Deschutes Watershed Council, Ted Wise of Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and Michelle Sims, our surveyor. Everyone has been very helpful and supportive of what we are attempting to do. It is everyone's hope that we will be able to keep our diversion full of flowing water year-round. It would be most unfortunate to have to close it off for nine months of the year.

Dear Ann:

This letter is to confirm the Board of Directors approval at the meeting December 12, 2008 to aid you, and the homeowners you were representing, with our cooperation in your efforts to protect your personal water rights diverted from Lake Creek. The Board agrees to grant you the necessary easement to install the piping for your whole diversion from Lake Creek to the lower pond. We also grant permission for you to fill in the upper pond and line the lower pond.

When the final and exact location of your piping is determined the Board is recommending a formal easement agreement be drawn up with the proposed easement location, and the benefiting homeowners and lots involved named. With the aid of your surveyor for the legal descriptions, and hopefully an attorney to draw up the agreement you will be responsible for the creation of the document. When the agreement is completed, the Board will review it, and if satisfactory, sign it and have it recorded in Jefferson County. This will not only clarify for the Association where the easement is, but be recorded for your protection in perpetuity with your land. If any of you ever transfer the ownership of your properties this will be a valuable and necessary document for the new owners.

Please call me with any questions, and continue to keep me and the board apprised of your progress.

This Agreement is in association with the diversion retrofit project on Lake Creek, hereinafter called "the Project" at the diversion on Lake Creek in Camp Sherman, hereinafter called "the Diversion." The Project includes the design, construction, installation and maintenance of a new diversion structure at the Diversion, including a fish screen, fish passage and headgate.

WHEREAS, the Water Users are interested in maintaining the infrastructure necessary to divert their allotted water rights at the Diversion while simultaneously providing fish passage and fish screening, and keeping operation and maintenance costs to an absolute minimum.

WHEREAS, the UDWC, in support for the Oregon Plan for Salmon and Watersheds and in collaboration with the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board, wishes to cooperate with the Water Users to provide fish passage, fish screening and a new headgate at the Diversion.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the above premises, the parties agree as follows:

I. PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT. The agreement is to facilitate a partnership effort between the parties in the Project and define specific obligations of the Water Users and the UDWC in the completion of the Project.

- II. PROJECT GOAL. The goal of the Project is to design, construct, install and maintain a new diversion structure at the Diversion that provides fish screening, fish passage and an operational headgate. Specific objectives include:
 - A. Complete an engineering design for a new headgate and fish screen at the Diversion;
 - B. Complete an engineering design for a replacement of the existing in-stream push up dam that will allow permanent, year-round upstream and downstream fish passage while simultaneously supporting continued function of the Diversion.
 - C. Construct the new headgate, screen and push up dam replacement during the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) 2010 in-water work period.
 - D. Permanently maintain the Project to ensure proper function of the new fish screen, headgate and push-up dam replacement.

III. TERM OF THE AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall commence on the date of last signature and expire on December 31, 2010.

IV. SPECIFIC OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES.

- A. The Water Users agree to:
 - 1. Work collaboratively with the UDWC throughout the design and construction of the Project;
 - 2. Grant permission to the UDWC staff, its consultants, funders and agency partners to visit the Diversion and implement the Project at mutually agreed-upon times;
 - 3. Upon successful construction of the headgate, fish screen and push-up dam replacement, adopt sole responsibility to perform long-term maintenance of the Project;
 - 4. Adopt sole responsibility, financial and otherwise, to complete any needed improvements to the irrigation distribution system located on the landward side of the new headgate;
 - 5. Not intentionally dismantle, remove, disturb or cause to be non-functional the headgate, fish screen and push-up dam replacement for a minimum period of 10 years following project completion.
 - 6. Designate Ann Ingham as a representative of the Water Users for all Project-related communications with the UDWC; and
 - 7. Acknowledge that the Project is being developed and implemented as a partnership between the Water Users and the UDWC in all communications regarding the Project, including communications with the media, funders, public and other parties.

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D. This agreement may be terminated if the UDWC and Water Users are unable to obtain the necessary local, state or federal grant funds to implement the Project. If adequate funding is not secured, the Landowner will not be responsible for funding the implementation of the Project.

VI. LIABILITY

- A. Each party agrees that it will be responsible for its own acts and the result thereof and will not be responsible for the acts of the other party and results thereof.
- B. The Water Users shall defend, save, hold harmless and indemnify the UDWC, its officers, employees and agents from and against all claims, suits, actions, losses, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses of any nature whatsoever, including, but not limited to attorneys fees, court and arbitration costs, resulting from, arising out of, or relating to the activities arising from this agreement.
- C. The UDWC shall defend, save, hold harmless and indemnify the Water Users, its officers, employees and agents from and against all claims, suits, actions, losses, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses of any nature whatsoever, including, but not limited to attorneys fees, court and arbitration costs, resulting from, arising out of, or relating to the activities arising from this agreement.
- D. Each party acknowledges that it is not acting as the other's agent or partner, nor are the parties acting in a joint venture. As such, neither shall be liable for the debts or obligations of the other.
