Dear Mr. Caudle:

We are enclosing herewith for completion, final proof in connection with the incomplete water right represented by your Permit No. 17802 granting a right to the use of 0.31 cfs of the waters of North Fork Coquille River for irrigation of 25 acres.

The data contained in the proof, which is based on an inspection and survey of your project made by a representative of this department, defines the extent to which your water right has been completed within the terms of your Permit. The proof should be dated and signed by you on the second sheet under the Affidavit of Appropriator and returned to this office.

Upon receipt of the proof, properly executed and accompanied by the statutory fee of \$1, a Certificate of Water Right will be issued confirming the rights thereunder and, after being recorded in the records of Coos County, will be forwarded to you.

In the interest of economy and due to the fact that your completed project was examined by a representative of this department, it is not necessary that your signature be made before a Notary Public, nor that the signatures of witnesses be affixed to the proof.

Dear Mr. Caudle:

In response to your letter of March 31, please be advised that there are no steps required by you in regard to your water right as evidenced by Permit No. 17802 except to continue to use the water for the irrigation of the 25 acres.

As was explained in our letter of October 2, 1947, a survey will be made in order to determine the extent that beneficial use has been made of the water, after which the certificate may be issued.

Since a great number of final proof surveys are before this office, considerable time may elapse before this survey can be made. However, the permit which you hold is valid evidence of the right in question until such time as the certificate can be issued.
