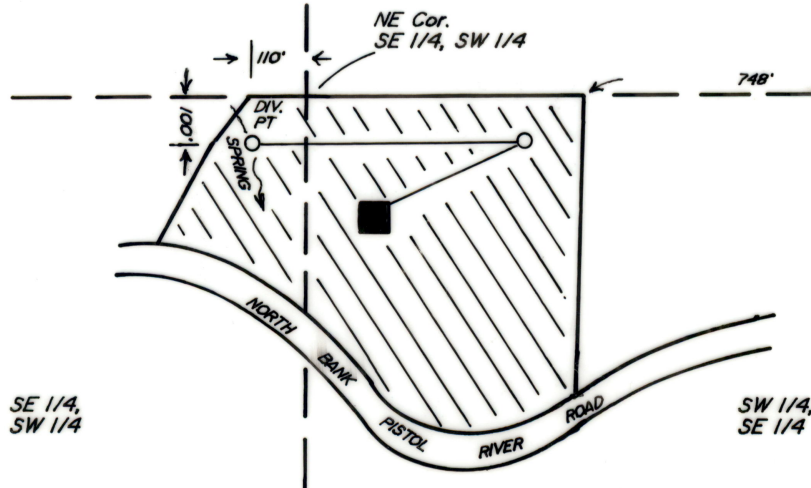

Curry County, Oregon**

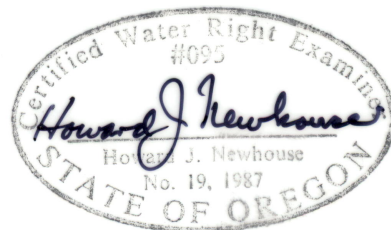

The diversion point remains the same as described in Application 71117. The system has been altered as shown and described. The water was measured at the overflow of the 500 gal. holding tank on Dec. 15, 1998. It was done with a 3 gal. milk pail and stop watch. The amount came to 13248 gal. per day or 0.02 cu. ft. Besides the one domestic water use the remainder is used to irrigate the additional acreage for a tree farm. This includes an orchard, trees of liquid amber, Douglas Fir, White Fir, spruce, etc. Moveable garden hose and sprinklers are utilized.

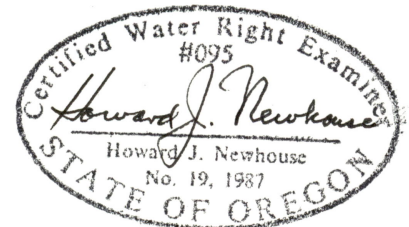
The currant system still uses the 30 gal. collection tank buried in the spring bed. Gravity feeds through a one in. plastic pipe, 150 feet, more or less, to a 500 gal. holding tank which has a 1/2 H.P. submersible pump and a 20 gal. pressure tank housed inside a 3x2 ft. shed. Then the pressure feeds through a 2 in PVC pipe to two 2500 gal. tanks, the second tank has a ball float to turn off and on the first pump. The second tank also has another 1/2 HP submersible pump that runs a 44 gal. pressure tank inside a 6x8x8 ft. laundry room and thence to the house.

The above information was obtained by a field survey Dec. 15, 1998 and is a true and accurate opinion by the WRE.

Dear Mr. & Mrs. Walker

Reference is made to our recent streamflow measurement on Pistol River and your 1991 water use permit allowing the use of water from a spring for domestic use and 11 acres of irrigation.

Pistol River was recently measured and the flow was determined to be below the required Instream Water Right(IWR).

Under the terms of your permit, when water is not available to satisfy senior rights, in this case, the IWR, it shall be necessary that you discontinue your irrigation water use, effective immediately. This regulatory action does not affect your ability to use water for human consumption within a dwelling.

Staff will be making field inspections as early as 22 July in order to ensure compliance. Should you have questions, please get in touch.

At the spring site water is diverted into two 36 in. x 3 ft. x 3 ft. concrete tile. A 3/4 H.P. submersible pump (electric) sends the water up through a one inch PVC line to a 1500 gallon storage tank. Thence by gravity to the house. Sprinkling will be done from faucets.

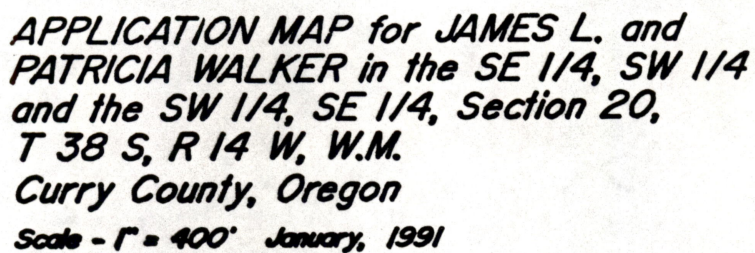

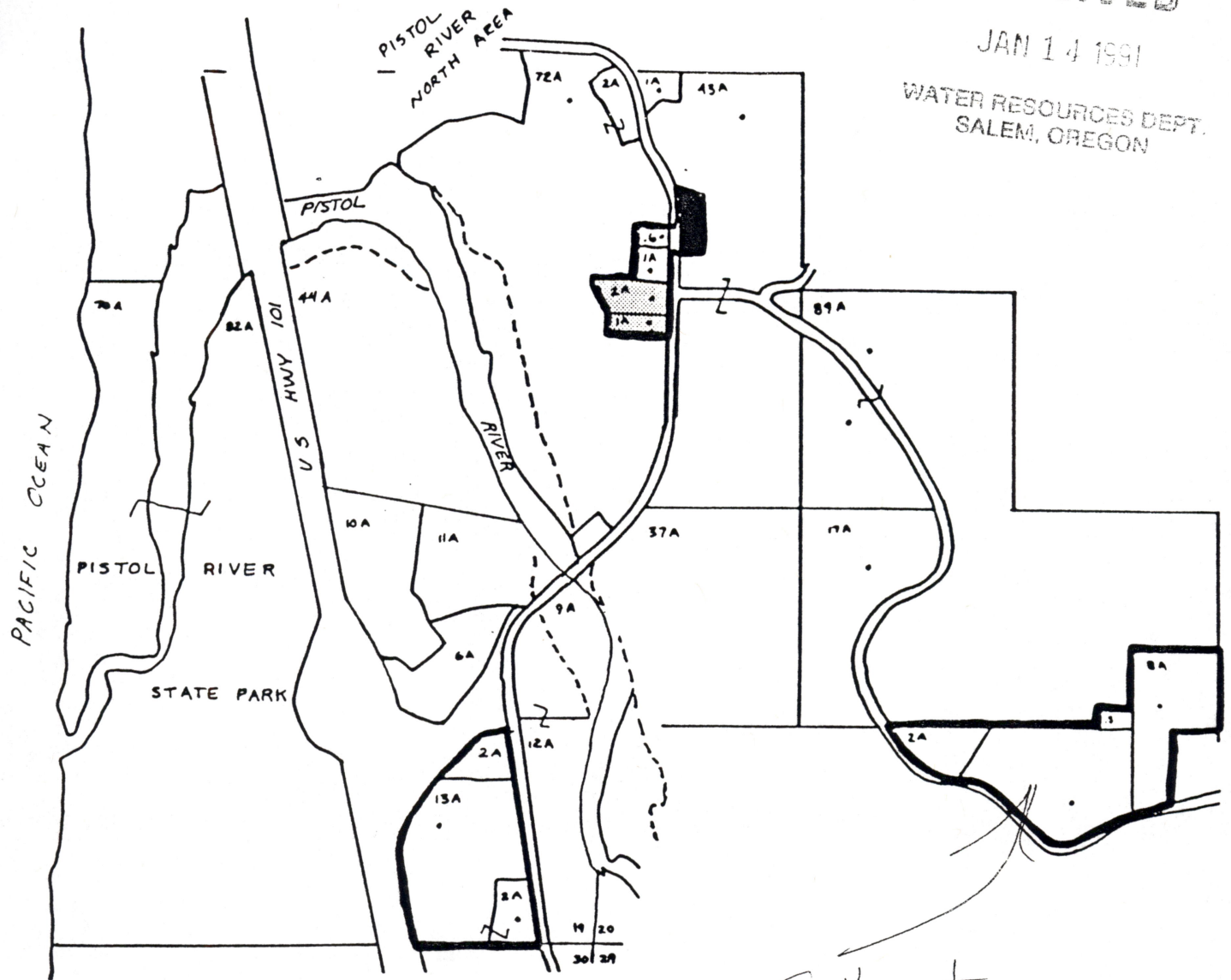

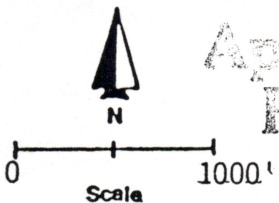

- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The permittee shall also install a fishway at the obstruction that will provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screens and fishways are to be in place, functional, and approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife before diversion of any water.


The Department received the attached letter from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife amending their position regarding the need for fish screening and passage.



This letter is written in response to your letter of 12-30-93 concerning the current status of our application of water use permit as well as several subsequent conversations by telephone since that date with Karen Cox of your Department.

We have three areas of concern pertinent to the proposed permit conditions.

1. Water Meter.

At the time of application no meter or any other measuring device was required or suggested. When discussed we were told no meter would be necessary. Bruce Sund, Water Master, from Grant's Pass checked the spring and property prior to our application and clarified this and all other questions.

2. Public Interest Review.

The "next phase of processing" including a Public Interest Review of our proposed water use sixty days in duration, including publication, has already occurred. There were two protests, one by Oregon Trout. Then we met with biologists from Oregon State Department of Fish and Wildlife out of Goldbeach, 97444. They determined that the flow from our spring did not join the river beyond the critical point---- the essence of the protest. They subsequently overrode the biological concerns and gave their approval for this aspect of the application. The Public Interest Review has been completed.

3. The dates proposed under permit conditions (4 ABC) are impossible for us to meet. Patti has had radical surgery at U.S.C. Norris Cancer Hospital for renal cell carcinoma (kidney cancer) with

metastasis to four lymph nodes. We found it necessary to delay moving to keep the proximity to U.S.C. for post-operative care. Actually, Patti is back at her teaching position in Biology and we intend to move as soon as we can. If signed by us the stipulation of completion of the water system by 10-1-96 at a time we are not present to protect or utilize it would cause us to fail to comply with this provision and may result in cancellation of the permit. To sign an agreement we cannot possibly keep would be dishonest on our part and potentially negate our already large expenditures for this permit.

We would like to suggest a different time frame based on medical necessity.



Dear Mr. Holliday,

We are responding to your letter of October 20, 1995 and December 1, 1995 as well as our lengthy telephone conversation prior to December, 1995.

Our Points of concern and objection are as follows:

(1) Metering of Water. We were specifically told by Bruce Sund, Water Master for the Pistol River area out of Medford (at that time), that a meter would not be required. He gave us his word. To us, that is not only a matter of honor but as representative of the Oregon Water Resources Department, his word is a commitment. We wish to remind you that at the time of our application and for years afterward, metering was not required by state law. Your department was severely backlogged and subsequent delay moved us into a time frame which also evidenced new law.

The initial expense of a meter and it's maintenance is inappropriate in this permit because it lies immediately adjacent to Pistol River and entirely within it's watershed. It is not in the public interest to require such a costly device-when it was not required at the time of application and your spokesperson, the Water Master, gave his word for the

department that it would not be required.


We await your consideration of our objection to Section A, page 2 of the Draft Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters-specifically in reference to the installation of a meter.

(2) Time Frame. The dates of the time frame for completion are impossible for us to meet. We must mention that we intend to file for an extension of time for completion of the delivery system within one year of issuance of the permit. This is necessary because our move to Pistol River is delayed by my wife's cancer and the necessity of remaining close to her comprehensive cancer center. It is difficult to set dates when we cannot anticipate the progression (or lack of it) of her illness.

We appreciate your kind responses, both in writing and by telephone to our inquiries and your effort to process this application.

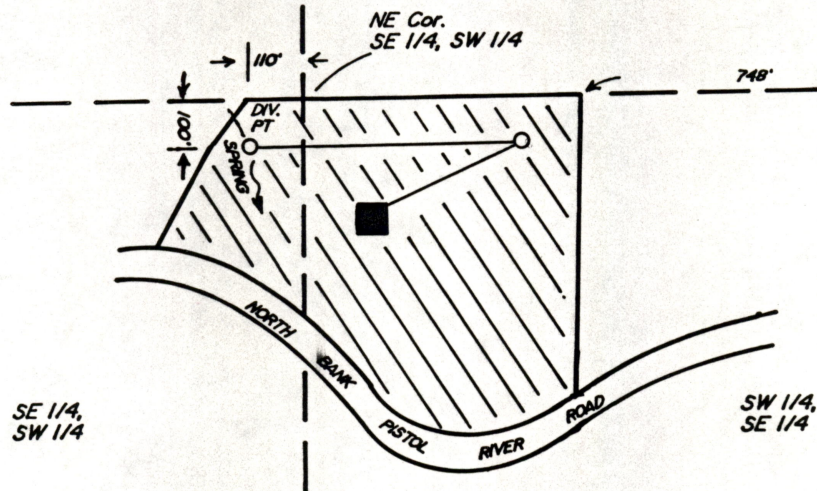

T 38 S, R 14 W, W.M.

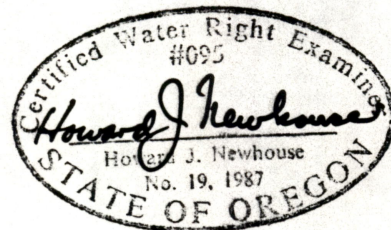

Final Order

Application History

On January 14, 1991, JAMES L & PATRICIA L WALKER submitted an application to the Department for a water use permit. The Department issued a Proposed Final Order on November 21, 1995. The protest period closed January 5, 1996, and no protest was filed.

An interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on declining fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality, Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff. The interagency team recommended that additional limitations or conditions of use be imposed on this application as follows:

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion. The permittee shall also install a fishway at the obstruction that will provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screens and fishways are to be in place, functional, and approved by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife before diversion of any water.


The period of use has been limited to December 1 through April 30 for domestic use, and March 1 through April 30 for irrigation, limiting use to human consumption only from May 1 through November 30

The proposed use would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest, but the Department's continuing evaluation reveals that the Proposed Final Order requires modification to include the condition as listed above.

Order

The application therefore is approved with the above modifications to the Proposed Final Order, and Permit Number 52256 is issued as limited by the conditions set forth in the permit.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Water Use Request

1. JAMES L WALKER AND PATRICIA L WALKER requested use of 0.143 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND of water for DOMESTIC USE FOR ONE FAMILY AND IRRIGATION OF 11.05 ACRES from A SPRING, A TRIBUTARY OF PISTOL RIVER within the South Coast Basin.
2. The area of proposed use is in Curry County within SECTION 20 TOWNSHIP 38 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.
3. The water delivery system is described by the applicant as follows: At the spring water is diverted into a 36 inch by 3 feet by 3 feet concrete tile. A 3/4 horsepower electric submersible pump sends water through 1 inch PVC pipe to a 1500 gallon storage tank then flows by gravity to house.
4. The request was made in Application S-71117 which was received by the Water Resources Department on January 14, 1991.

Affected Waters

1. A SPRING, A TRIBUTARY OF PISTOL RIVER is not within or above a State Scenic Waterway.
2. ODFW has not informed the Department of the presence of game fish at the described point of diversion.
3. There are senior water rights on A SPRING, A TRIBUTARY OF PISTOL RIVER and on downstream waters.

Department Actions

1. The application was determined to be complete and not defective.
2. A technical review of the application was completed and a report of the results of that review was mailed to the applicant on December 30, 1993.

3. The technical review determined:
 - a. Domestic use and Irrigation is allowed under the South Coast Basin Program.
 - b. The use is not prohibited by Statute.
 - c. Water is available for further appropriation (at a 50 percent exceedance probability) for the period **year round for Domestic use and March 1 through October 31 for Irrigation.**
 - d. The use would not injure existing water rights.
4. The report of technical review listed these determinations and disclosed a number of conditions and restrictions that would likely be included in the permit if issued. These conditions and restrictions are listed in the attached draft permit.

Assessment

1. In proceeding with evaluation of Application S-71117, the following criteria were found to be relevant by the Department.
 - a. The South Coast Basin Program (OAR Chapter 690, Division 517)
 - b. The Curry County Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance
 - c. The amount of water available in A SPRING, A TRIBUTARY OF PISTOL RIVER
 - d. The established rate and duty for the proposed use
 - e. Pending, senior applications and existing water rights of record
 - f. Comments received

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. Based upon continued evaluation, the Department finds the determinations of the technical review remain valid.
2. Period of allowed use: YEAR ROUND FOR DOMESTIC USE AND IRRIGATION FROM MARCH 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31.
3. The Department finds that no more than 0.143 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.138 CFS FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.005 CFS FOR DOMESTIC would be necessary for the proposed use. The amount of water requested, 0.143 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, is allowable.

4. Curry County Planning Department staff completed the Department's Land Use Information Form and indicated thereon that the land use associated with the proposed use is compatible with the Curry County Comprehensive Land Use Plan.
5. The proposed use would not conflict with existing water rights, and, if exercised in accordance with law, rule, and the proposed conditions would not result in injury to existing water users.
6. The proposed use complies with all other rules of the Commission.
7. Pursuant to Chapter 416, Oregon laws, 1995, enacted by the 68th Oregon Legislative Assembly, and given the findings listed above, a rebuttable presumption has been established that the use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if exercised in the manner described in the attached draft permit.
8. Therefore, the proposed use, as conditioned, and described in the attached draft permit, would not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Walker,

Following our discussion on December 1, 1995, I researched the two areas of concern that you had. First was the issue of metering and second was time extensions. I discussed these issues with several staff in our Department and the following conclusions were determined.

Metering is required for any use of more than 0.1 cubic foot per second and your application requested 0.143 cubic foot per second. Thus, metering is required by state law on your application. You may protest this part of your permit at no cost. There is no more I can do for you in this area. During 1993 the issue of whether meters would be required or not was undecided. The Watermasters did not want metering to be required on all permits and the Department did. That is probably why you were informed that no meter would be required on your application. I looked at your file again and the letter you sent on January 15, 1994, is in the file and does reflect your concern on metering.

The second issue of concern is time extensions. I talked with Dallas Miller, (503) 378-8455 Ext. 272, who is the person handling time extensions on permits. The conclusion of our discussion was that the construction of your water delivery system must begin within one year of issuance of a permit. There is no way to change this. However, there can be an extension of time for completion of the delivery system, but these can only be applied for after the one year allowed for the construction of the system. The extensions are in 1 year increments. There can also be time extensions on the one year allowed for use of water. These extensions are also to be applied for at the end of the allotted time period and in one year increments.

This letter informs you of the current status of your application for a water use permit and accompanies the Satisfactory Report of Technical Review For Water Use Permit(s). We apologize for the delay in transmitting this information and Report to you and for any inconvenience the wait may have caused you.

The enclosed Report of Technical Review is the Department's summary of a specialized analysis of various legal and scientific aspects of your application and proposed water use. We are required by the state of Oregon's administrative rules (in OAR 690-11-160) to conduct this official technical review of each application submitted to the Oregon Water Resources Department for a water use permit. This process was designed to insure that your application receives a fair evaluation and to secure protection of existing water rights and of the public at large.

AS THE RESULT OF OUR TECHNICAL EVALUATION, WE HAVE DETERMINED THAT YOUR APPLICATION SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE TECHNICAL REVIEW.

The Department will now move your application to the next phase of processing. This phase includes a public interest review of your proposed water use. No final action may be taken on your application until the public interest review is completed.

You should also note that the Report of Technical Review describes conditions currently anticipated which may limit the water use proposed in your application.

If you wish to object to any of the analyses contained in the Report, you must submit your objection to the Department in writing within 60 days of the date of mailing of this Report or by the date specified below. Your objection must allege that the technical review is defective and you may also submit evidence which demonstrates that your proposed water use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Copies of the Report of Technical Review will be distributed to all persons who have filed comments or otherwise expressed an interest in the water use proposed in your application. Interested parties must also submit their objections within the prescribed objection period. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

6. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of the permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, penalties, or cancellation of the permit.
7. The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.
8. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
9.
