Dear Madam:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 11, advising that you wish to transfer such water rights as exist in excess of those appurtenant to the following described tracts:

The enclosed form of application for a change in place of use has been partially filled in from information available in this office. It will be necessary, however, that you answer questions numbered 12 and 17 and sign the application before a Notary Public. You should also attach a resolution of your Board authorizing you to execute such application for transfer on behalf of the district.

If you desire to transfer these water rights to the lands of the district as a whole, such lands should be described under question No. 12. To lessen the expense, it is suggested that the district select lands now owned by the district which do not have water rights.

Transfer fees on the latter procedure would amount to \$22.00, while fees in connection with the former method would amount to approximately \$120.41.
