Dear Mr. Marshall:

I believe the present owner of lands described in certificate recorded at page 712 could request that a new certificate be issued describing the right for the area you believe correct. You should support the request with more evidence of error than I cite in my letter to Mr. Parker. Among other things should be an affidavit from the owner of the land describing the use of water now and claiming that the use has always been made in the same manner. An affidavit from someone having personal knowledge of what was installed when the right was initiated would help.

Mr. Parker said in his letter that L. A. Clark on June 24, 1909 was the owner of lands located in NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, and perhaps it would be well to determine the owner of the lands in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ for the same time.

I am not personally familiar with this situation so can only suggest that you file what proof you can assemble to support the claim there was an error. It would be necessary to support the claim as to the extent of use as it is easily possible that there are several places added onto the pipeline in the intervening years.

Dear Mr. Parker:

There are three rights of record for appropriation of water from a spring in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 7. Although the distances differ slightly, it is probable that the three describe the same spring you are interested in.

The certificate issued to Lewis A. Clark and recorded at page 712, State Record of Water Right Certificates describes the appropriation of water from a spring located on the application map as 316 feet south and 110 feet east from the NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 7, Township 2 North, Range 8 East. The map shows a pipeline leading through the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 7 but the place of use is listed as the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$. What is the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ is designated on the map as the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$? I assume this error was carried through and the certificate is probably in error. The use is for domestic purposes and the quantity of water is that which can be put to beneficial use not exceeding 0.25 cubic foot per second, with a date of priority of June 24, 1909.

The certificate recorded at page 512 describes the appropriation of not to exceed 0.14 cubic foot per second from Government Spring and a spring east of Government Spring for irrigation and domestic use. The place of use is indicated as three acres in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 7, Township 2 North, Range 8 East. The application map which also accompanied the proof, locates Government Spring 275 feet south and 125 feet east from the NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, of Section 7. The other spring is not located by distance but according to the map it is about 900 feet east of the first spring referred to as Government Spring. Apparently the irrigation was by ditch and a ram was used for domestic purposes, with a priority date of July 29, 1909. The application states "the

appropriation to be made by an enlargement of use of water from said spring by former owner." The application also recognized a right of J. P. Lucas who filed an application on August 26, 1909.

The certificate recorded at page 719 was issued to J. P. Lucas describing the appropriation of not to exceed 0.13 cubic foot per second from a spring located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 7 for the irrigation of two acres in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, and domestic use, with a date of priority of August 6, 1909. The map submitted with the application locates the spring 275 feet south and 125 feet east from the NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$. The place of use is listed on the proof form as being the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 7.

Gentlemen:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo with reference to water rights from Government springs located in the SW NE Sec. 7, T. 2 N. R. 8 E. It would appear that certain rights were initiated prior to the enactment of the water code. Under the permit issued to Melissa E. Hill we find the following note: "The appropriation to be made by the enlargement or extension of ~~existing appropriation~~ or use of water from said spring by a former owner who used the water for domestic and irrigation used.***** The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is all of the spring except a 2 inch pipe line owned by J. P. Lucas in all about $\frac{1}{4}$ cubic foot per second.****" Melissa E. Hill filed application No. 205 on July 29, 1909, and secured a water right certificate No. 512 covering the use of 0.14 second feet of water for the irrigation of 3 acres and domestic use.

Lewis A. Clark filed an application on June 24, 1909, prior to the filing of Melissa E. Hill, and secured a water right certificate for 0.25 second feet of water for domestic use.

Jay P. Lucas filed an application No. 258 on August 26, 1909, and secured a water right certificate for 0.13 second feet of water for the irrigation of 2 acres and domestic supply.

You will understand that our records are complete only since February 24, 1909, and it is probable that there were certain rights in the name of Lucas and Melissa E. Hill prior to February 24, 1909, of which we have no record.

A statute was passed at the 1913 session of the Legislature providing that 5 years non use of water would constitute abandonment and it is probable that non use of water for a shorter period of time would not constitute abandonment. In view of the fact that all permittees have secured final water right certificates it would appear

that they could not at this time enlarge their pipes so as to increase their appropriations without first securing a permit from this office to enlarge their works and increase their appropriation.

and ditches?


If the title owners of said mentioned land or
