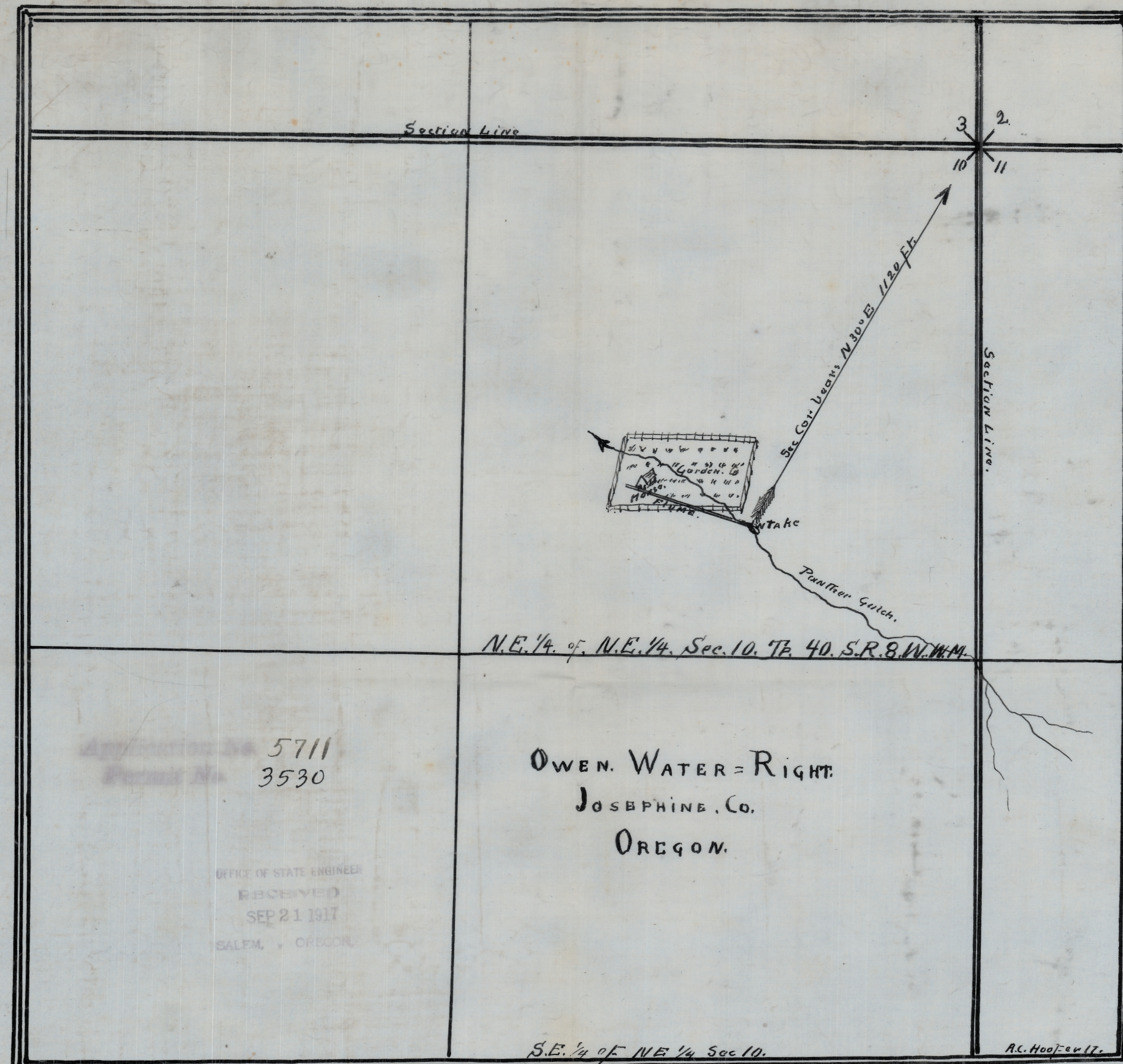

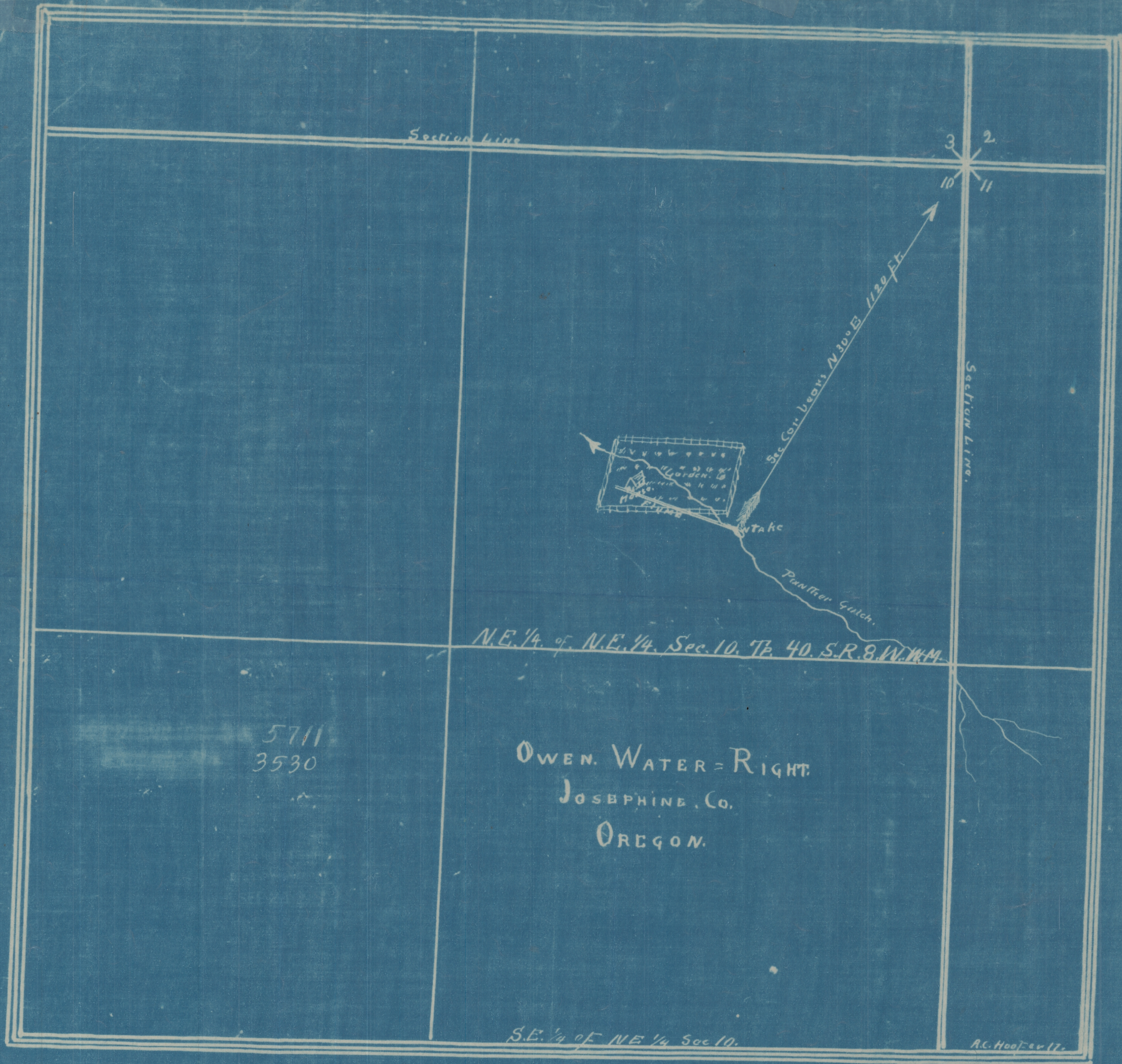

Dear Sir:

Enclosed please find my official receipt No. 5470 for \$3.00, which amount was transmitted with your application for permit to appropriate water for domestic and irrigation purposes. I am also in receipt of map and tracing. This application has been numbered 5711 and is returned herewith for completion, balance of fees and maps.

Under question No. 4 should be given the location of the point of diversion within some forty acre tract, and the point of termination of the flume should be given within some forty acre tract under question No. 5. The number of acres to be irrigated in each forty acre tract should be listed under question No. 9. Questions No. 12, 13, 14 and 15 should also be answered. In addition to the \$3.00 examination fee which you have transmitted there is due a \$5.00 recording fee for domestic use, and at the rate of 15¢ per acre for each acre to be irrigated. I am also returning the map and tracing in order that the application and maps may be made to correspond.

In order to retain its original date of priority, this application completed and accompanied by the balance of fees and required maps should be returned to this office on or before September 29, 1917.
