Dear Ms. Ratcliffe:

GSI Water Solutions, Inc. is submitting the enclosed permit application to use stored surface water for irrigation, on behalf of Brad and Bethany Ford (Applicants). The Applicants are requesting authorization to use up to 25 acre-feet of stored water from Mount Pisgah Reservoir for irrigation of 158.4 acres.

Permit R-13073 authorizes the storage of water in Mount Pisgah Reservoir. Permit S-53746 currently authorizes the use of surface water for maintenance of the reservoir, and the use of stored water from the reservoir for irrigation of a portion of the proposed place of use. The Applicants have, however, submitted a claim of beneficial use for only the reservoir maintenance portion of that permit. In other words, they are not requesting a certificate for the portion of the permit authorizing the use of stored water for irrigation purposes.

Three applications are being submitted to replace the irrigation portion of Permit S-53746 (this application, and two application being filed by the David and Bette McKibben Trust.) If needed, the Applicants will voluntarily cancel the irrigation portion of Permit S-53746 simultaneously with the issuance of permits for the three applications being submitted that request authorization to use the stored water from Mount Pisgah Reservoir for irrigation purposes.

The permit application fee will be mailed to OWRD after we receive the temporary number for this application. The fee was calculated as follows:

\$610 - Base application fee
\$820 - Rate fee of \$41/acre-foot for 20 acre-feet
\$7 - Rate fee of \$1.40/acre-foot for 5 acre-feet
\$610 - Permit recording fee

The Applicants will use drip irrigation in order to conserve water. The Applicants will limit the use of stored water to the amount needed for beneficial use, not to exceed 25 acre-feet. The Applicants will install a flow meter to measure water diverted from Mount Pisgah Reservoir, if required by OWRD. The proposed use of stored water is not expected to cause damage to public uses of surface water.

The Applicants are requesting a water use permit to use up to 25 acre-feet of stored water from Mount Pisgah Reservoir for irrigation of 158.4 acres. The Applicants are a holder of Permit R-13073, which authorizes the storage of water in Mount Pisgah Reservoir.

The Applicants have notified the other holder of Permit R-13073, David McKibben, of their intention to file this permit application. The Applicants are aware that David McKibben will be filing two other permit applications to use the remainder of the stored water from Mount Pisgah Reservoir for irrigation purposes.

Brad Ford is also a holder of Permit S-53746, which authorizes the use of water from Middle Fork Ash Creek for maintenance of the reservoir, and the use of stored water from Mount Pisgah Reservoir for irrigation of a portion of the proposed place of use. A claim of beneficial use has been filed for only the reservoir maintenance portion of Permit S-53746, and not for the use of stored water for irrigation purposes. This application is requesting a permit that will replace the irrigation portion of Permit S-53746 on the proposed place of use. The holders of Permit S-53746 will work with OWRD and, if needed, will voluntarily cancel the irrigation portion of that permit simultaneously with the issuance of a new permit for this application and the two other applications that request authorization to use the remainder of the stored water from Mount Pisgah Reservoir for irrigation purposes.

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.

- C.
