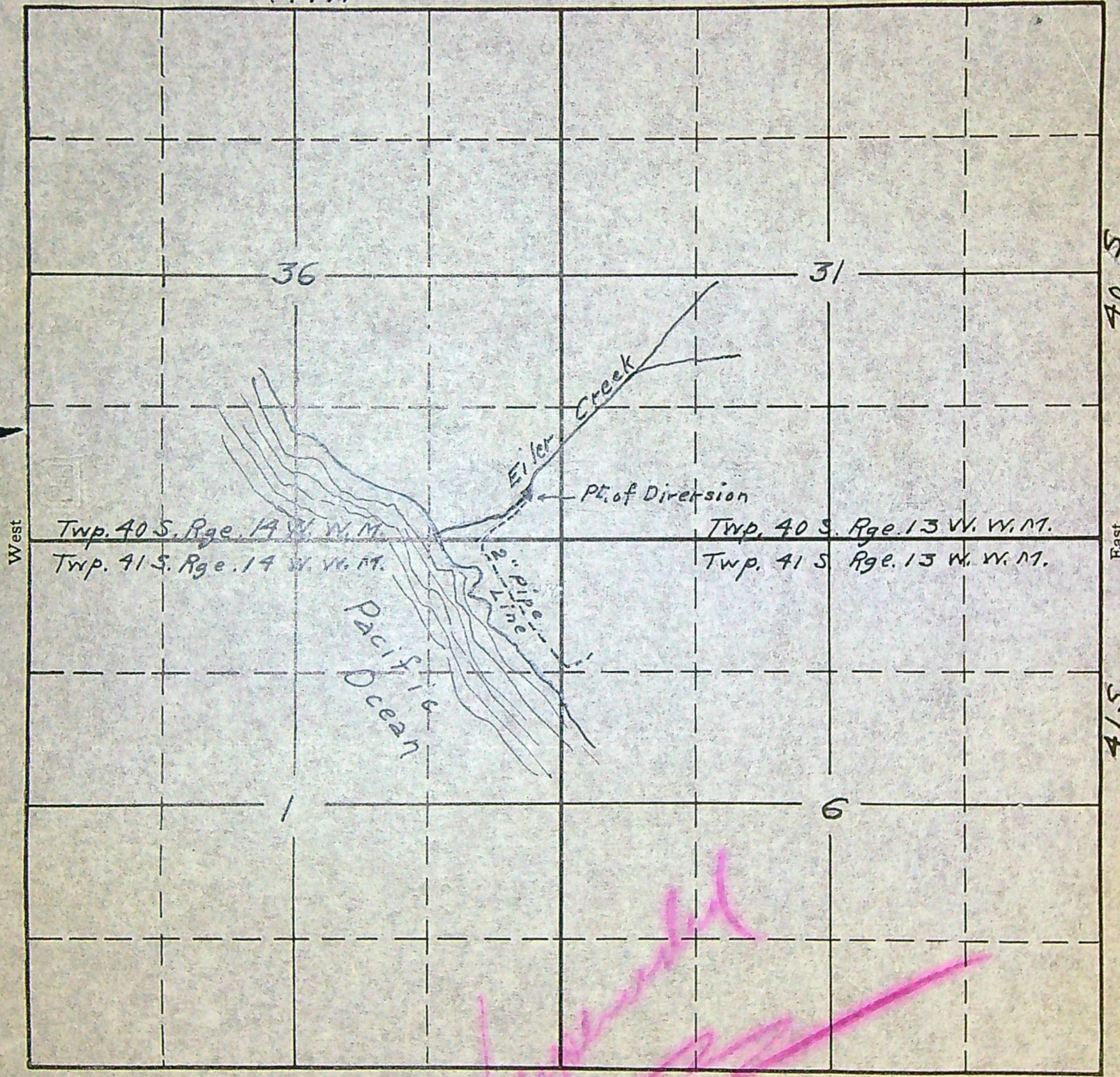

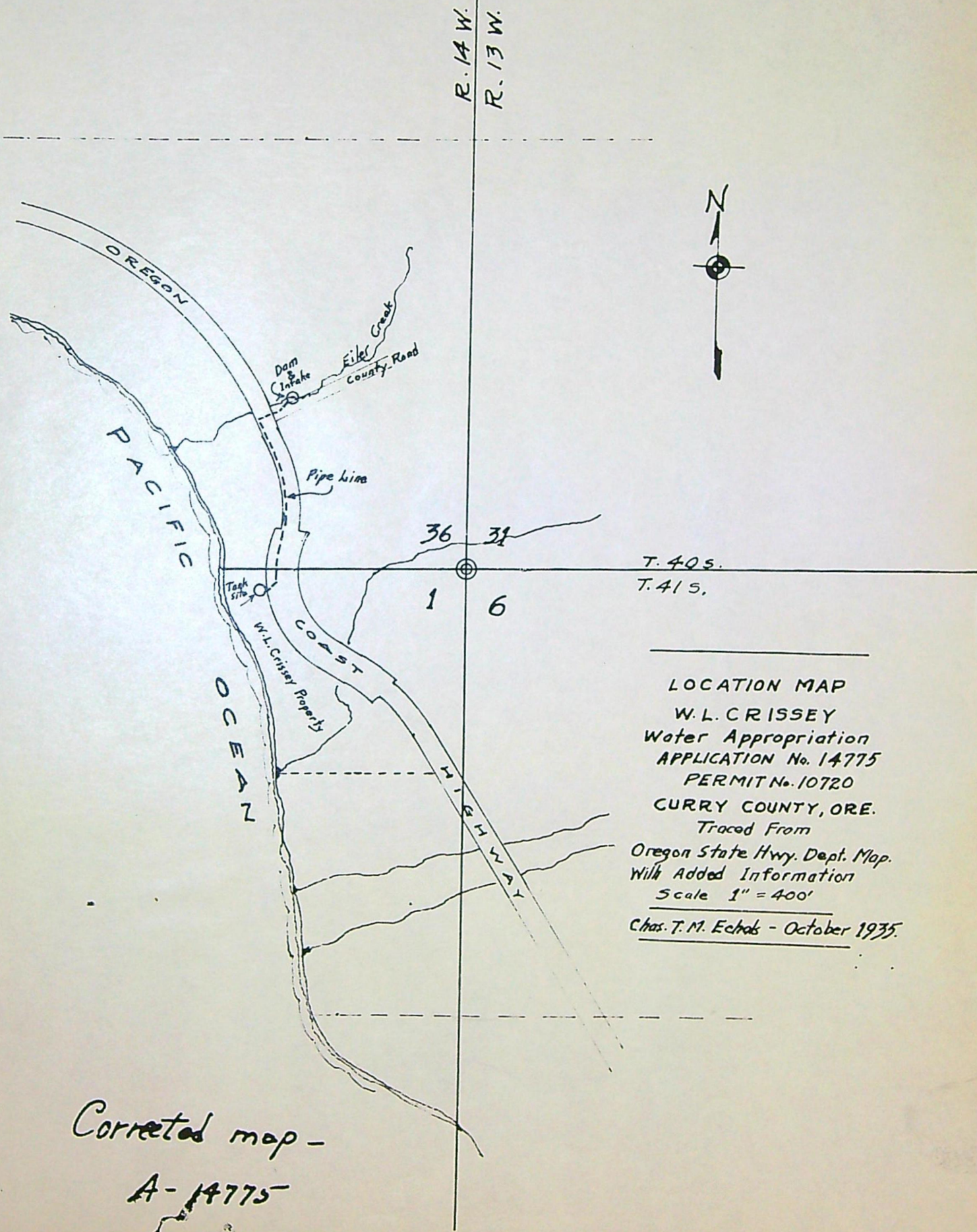


Replying to your letter dated March 24, 1948, in which you state that your client has purchased the right to use 25% of the water to which Mr. Crissey is entitled under his permit.

Our records show that W. L. Crissey of Brookings, Oregon, on October 11, 1932, filed an application with the State Engineer for the appropriation of water from Eiler Creek for domestic use. This application was approved on November 10, 1932 and on January 30, 1936 a Certificate of Water Right was issued which is on record in the county clerk's office of Coos County in the name of W. L. Crissey. The quantity of water set forth in the certificate is 0.078 cubic foot per second, but as you are aware this is only the maximum limitation. The quantity of water which Mr. Crissey or his successor-in-interest would be entitled to is the quantity which at the time of final proof made by him had been placed in beneficial use. Any new use of water which would increase the flow of that time would constitute an enlargement and it would be necessary to initiate a new right in order to comply with Oregon laws.

As you are aware, under Oregon laws no one owns the water but only the right to use a specific quantity for some beneficial purposes. If your client purchased 25% of the waters which the Crisseys were entitled to use, then Crissey must discontinue using that portion which he sold.

In connection with final proof, Mr. Crissey submitted a new map showing the location of the lands to which a water right is appurtenant.

I have your letter of March 25th concerning the above mentioned application and thank you for the information contained therein. Is there any way to your knowledge whereby my client, Mr. A. E. Anderson, could have a certificate of water right issued directly to him for the one-fourth of the water allocated to Mr. Crissey under his water right certificate? There is no controversy between Mr. Anderson and Mr. Crissey but Mr. Anderson would naturally prefer to have a separate certificate if this could be arranged by splitting up Mr. Crissey's existing certificate into two. Mr. Anderson, of course, would be prepared to present you with Mr. Crissey's written assignment to him of one-fourth of the water to which Mr. Crissey is entitled under his certificate.

Dear Mr. Stricklin:

Some years ago, your office issued to W. L. Crissey of Brookings, Oregon a water appropriation permit bearing number 10720 relating to the appropriation of the waters of Eiler Creek.

Subsequently, Archie Anderson and Florence Anderson, his wife, purchased from Mr. and Mrs. Crissey a portion of their property upon which it was intended that this water was to be used. The deed from Mr. and Mrs. Crissey to the Andersons is dated May 16, 1944.

Subsequently, under date of July 31, 1946, Mr. and Mrs. Crissey granted to Mr. and Mrs. Anderson the right to use 25% of the waters to which the Crisseys were entitled under their Permit No. 10720.

Mr. and Mrs. Anderson have asked me to check into this matter for the purpose of determining just where they stand with reference to this water right. They are most anxious to make sure that they have the absolute right to the use of 25% of the water to which Mr. Crissey is entitled under his permit.

I do not have available to me a copy of Mr. Crissey's permit. I do not know how much water is granted by this permit. Neither am I certain as to the status of this permit. It would seem to me that final proof should have been made under the permit and a certificate issued before this time.

I shall appreciate your advising me of the status of the permit and I should like to have a copy of the same.

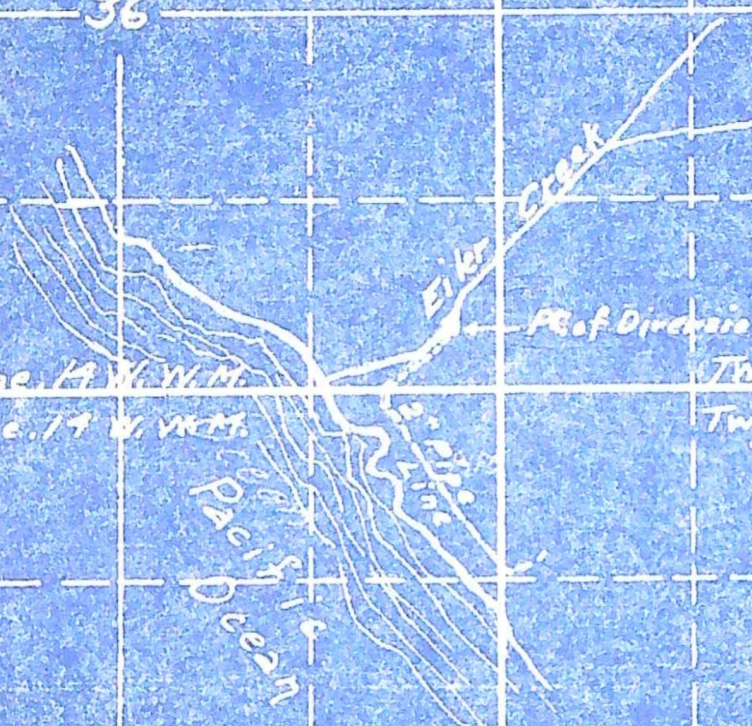

Dear Mr. McClary:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 20, in which you inquire concerning the procedure to be followed to safeguard your 5% interest in the water right represented by Permit No. 10720 in the name of W. L. Crissey.

The right covered by Permit No. 10720 has been confirmed by issuance of Certificate No. 11379 granting a right to the use of 0.078 C.F.S. from Eiler Creek for Domestic use on Lot No. 1 (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$), Section 1, Township 41S, Range 14W W.N.

As provided by Oregon Law, water and water rights in this state are appurtenant to the land and I believe that if you are the legal owner of a part of the subdivision described above, and if you hold an instrument of transfer of a certain per cent of the water right in question, your right to the use, for domestic purposes, of a certain part of the water described in the certificate, on a part of the property described, will be safeguarded if you will have the instrument of transfer recorded in the records of the County in which the site of the involved appropriation is situated.

It would appear from the description of the termination of the pipe line and the map submitted with the application that the location of the place of use is evidently in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Township 41 South, Range 13 West, W. M., and if you will authorize me to do so, I will add this to the application, after which it may be placed in line for approval and issuance of a permit.
