This is in reply to your letter of December 31st stating that the construction work is already completed and that the water was applied on June 20, 1935, under your Permit No. 11489.

Your letter does not state whether or not all of the lands were irrigated, but I presume so, and I am therefore enclosing a form for your convenience in submitting proof. If all of the lands were not actually irrigated during the past summer, you should not make proof at this time as you have until October 1, 1937, to completely apply the water. If, however, all of the lands have been irrigated, proof should be submitted so that a certificate can be issued.

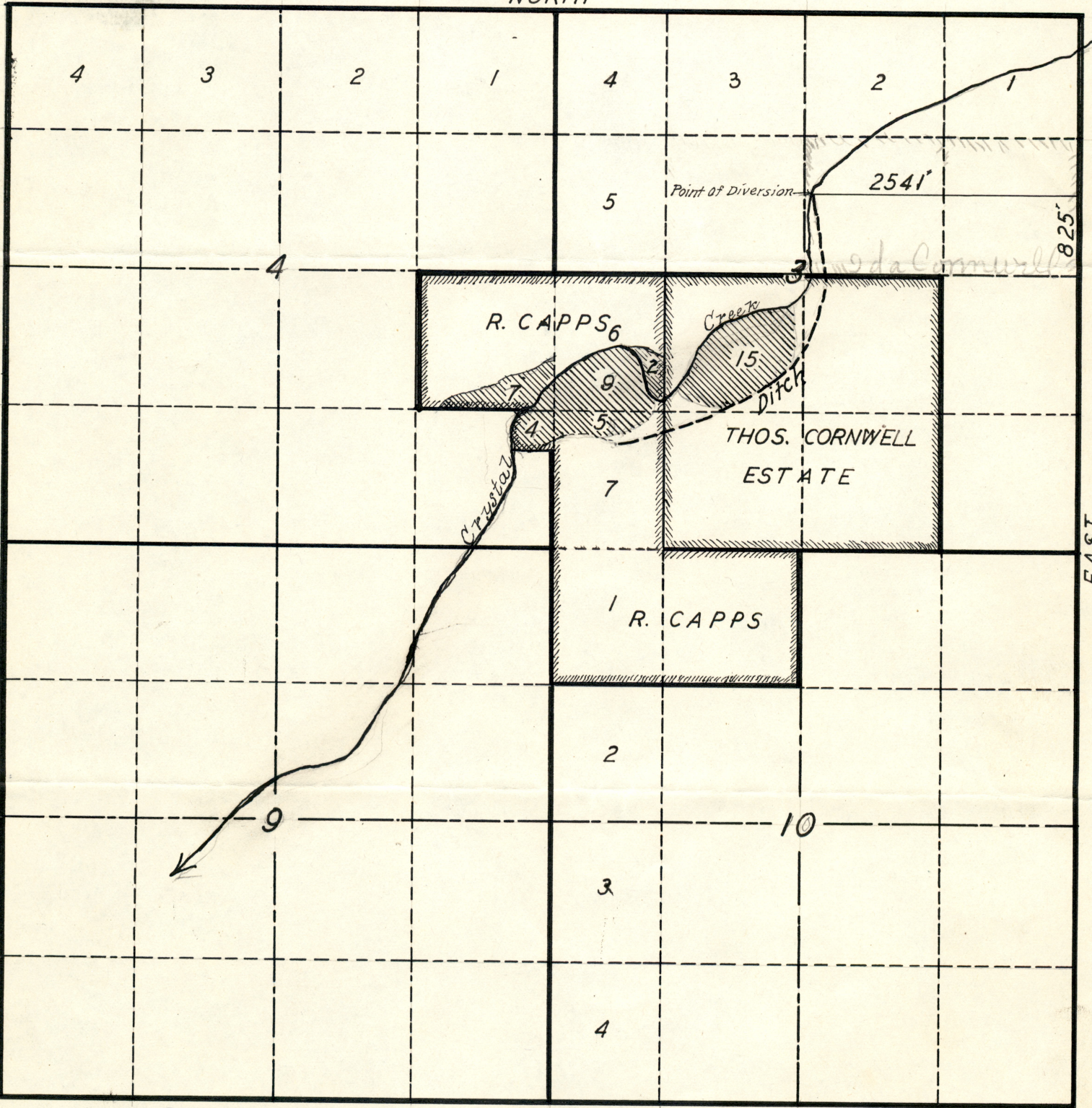
