Yamhill County, Oregon.

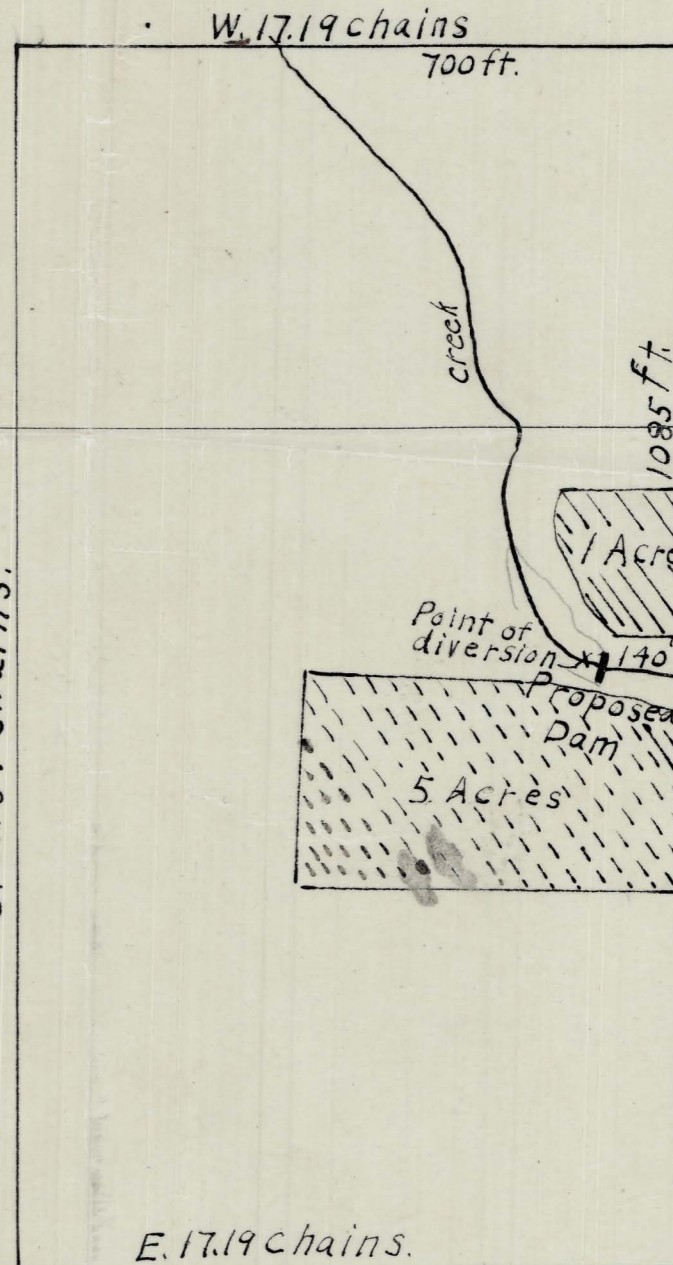
