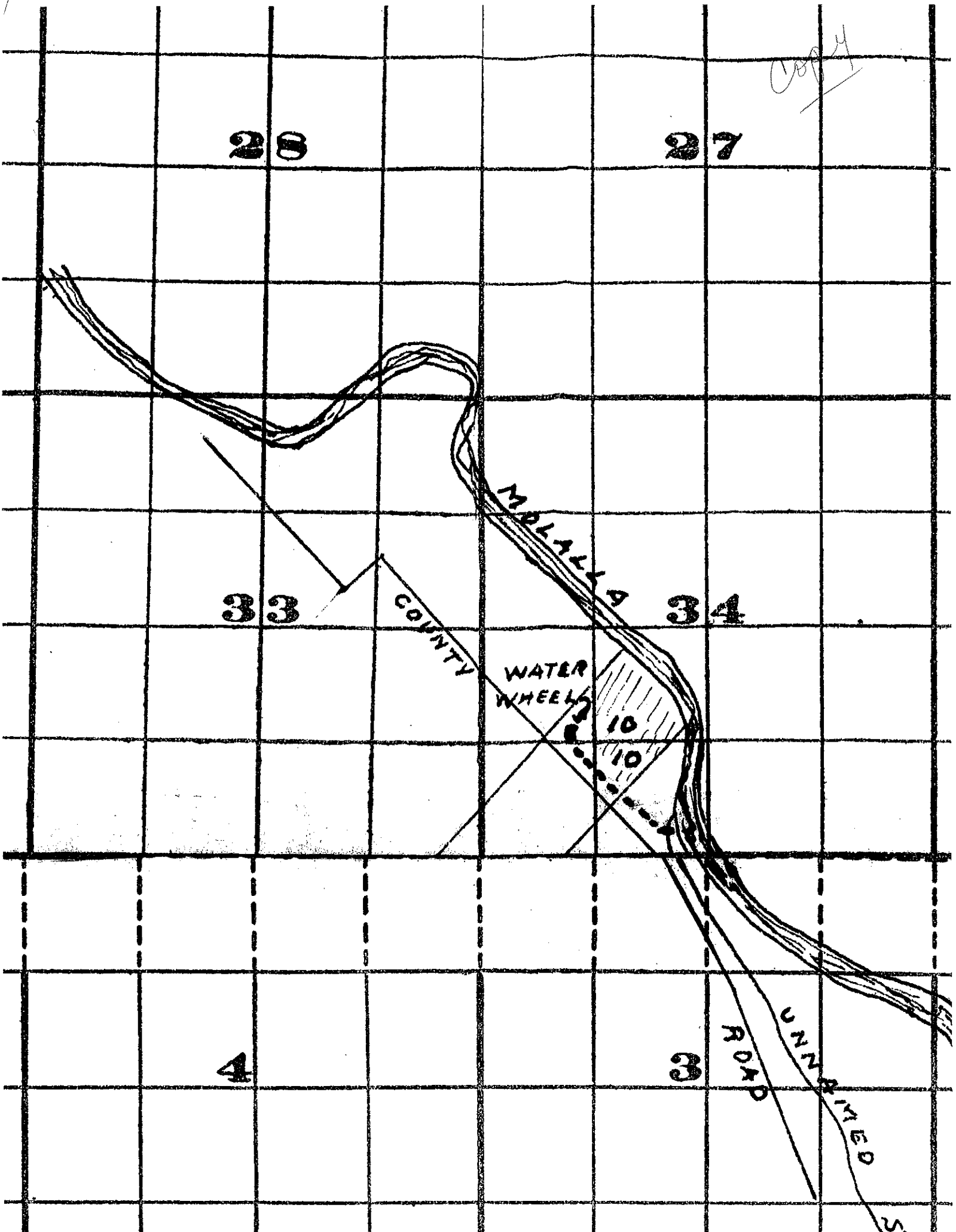

SUBJECT: Freeman Farms (Molalla River Misc.)
Permits 5340, 5740, 10767, 12147

On Sept. 29, 1980 I spoke with Mr. Wayne Lee, foreman of Freeman Farms. Mr. Lee told me that he has been with Freeman Farms for just over two years.

I asked Mr. Lee what the source of water is for irrigation. He said all the land is irrigated from the ditch that runs through the place in a North Easterly direction. This water is diverted from the unnamed stream (ditch) referred to on the map for application 8235 permit 5340 certificate 6668. The water is run down an open ditch and under the county road (Wiles Rd.) into a concrete catch basin. The water is pumped from there onto the land Northeast of the road. There is an old pond below the concrete catch basin. This pond is dry and appears to have been dry for a number of years. This irrigation includes land in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 34, T4S R2E. There is no irrigated land, from this source in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ or SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 34 T4S R2E. It does not appear that there has ever been any irrigation in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ or SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ on the Freeman place. See photo DFK 3D 159, DFK 3LL 59.

I asked Mr. Lee if any water was used from the unnamed stream which parallels the county road (Wiles Rd). and cuts across the Freeman place just East of the irrigated land in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 34 T4S R2E. He said no water is being used from that unnamed stream.

This is the unnamed stream shown on the map for application 14802 permit 10767 certificate 11713.

There is no way to get water from this stream into their irrigation system. There is in fact at least one farm road across what appears to be an old ditch that could have been used to bring water from this unnamed stream to the old pond below the existing catch basin.

I then asked Mr. Lee if there was any use of water from any of the springs referred to in application 8667 permit 5740 certificate 6676 and application 16249 permit 12147 certificate 11757. He said the springs were not being used. The domestic water and water for the barns comes from a well.

The irrigation system as it is now set up does not allow use of water from any source other than the unnamed stream shown on the map for application 8235 permit 5340 certificate 6668.

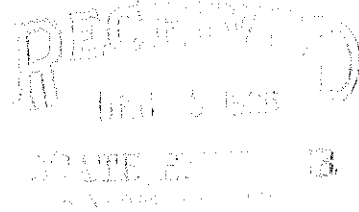

Dear Sir:

Your letter of November 27 referring to our water permit No. 10767 was received by the writer at San Francisco tonight.

Inasmuch as we only have the water over about half the ground that we figured on, we think the proper thing for us to do is to fill out the application for extension that you have kindly attached to your letter and we hope it will have favorable consideration by your office.

After all the effort and money we have spent on this matter we are certainly interested in keeping it up and we think you know what the situations are in the farming line and that we want to do this work as economically as possible and with the help we now have on the ranch along with the other line of work we are trying out.

Answering the last paragraph in your letter of November 27 with the reference to the use of water for the development of power, will say we have this part of our line up all finished and it has been working for the last 18 months. We have an Overshot 5 foot water wheel working steadily night and day running a 500 gallon an-hour pump and putting water up in a 3000 gallon tank about 60 feet in the air for domestic use and for sprinkling the garden and watering the stock.

We think if checking up on this, you will find we have made quite a little headway on our permit, but as stated in former letter we have had hard luck lining up the ditch.

We hope the above answers your letter in a satisfactory manner and that we will hear favorably from you in the way of an extension and thanking you in advance, we remain.

That I am the owner and holder of Permit No. 10767 to appropriate the public waters of the state of Oregon.

Under the terms and conditions of said permit, complete application of water was required to have been made by Oct. 1, 1935.

That I have heretofore made application of water under said permit to the following extent:

Completed work for full application of power to drive pump for irrigation and domestic use

Gentlemen:

This is in reply to your letter of November 26th, pertaining to your Permit No. 10767, in which you state that the ditch has been constructed and the water has been applied to the land, but that you have had difficulty with the ditch caving in because of the nature of the ground.

Your letter does not indicate clearly whether or not all of the necessary works have been constructed or the water applied to the entire acreage described under the permit. If the works have all been constructed and the water has been applied to all of the lands, I believe that you are entitled to make proof and receive a certificate even though it may be necessary for you to make repairs to the ditch.

However, if all of the works have not been constructed or the water has not been applied to all of the lands, you should submit an application for an extension of time if you are interested in perfecting a right for the full amount allowed in the permit. If it appears that reasonable diligence has been shown in the prosecution of work, an extension of time may be granted. I am enclosing a form for your convenience in submitting an application for an extension if you desire.

I note that this permit grants a right to the use of water for the development of power as well as for irrigation, and inasmuch as your letter makes no reference to the power part of the development you should report on its progress also.

Dear Sir:

The writer has just returned to Portland after a trip on the territory and has your card dated October 25 in regard to our water permit 10767.

We note from this card that you say we must have completely applied the water to the purposed use before October 1, 1935.

We dug the ditch to lead this water onto the land that we have applied for and we have had the water on the land, but inasmuch as ground is a sandy loam we have had trouble with the ditch caving in. At the present writing we cannot run the water through this ditch although we have had the water through.

We have spent a lot of effort and quite a little money trying to get this matter lined up, but it is not finished yet and we would not want to say the matter is just complete and the way we want it.

We intend to dig this ditch out again and slope the bank more to keep it from caving and we were wondering if it would be O K to get an extension or does the work we have done on this application we have made to you fill your requirements?

We certainly want to get the benefit of all the efforts we have made so far on it and we want to be perfectly frank with you and to tell you exactly what the situation is at the present time.

Please let us hear from you on the above at your early convenience and we assure you your correspondence on the matter will have our best attention.

Gentlemen:

This acknowledges receipt of your letter of October 17th with which you enclosed the notices of beginning and completion of construction under your Permit No. 10767.

Your notice of beginning of construction appears satisfactory, and the permit has been placed in good standing. The notice of completion of construction has also been filed, and action is therefore being suspended under the permit until October 1, 1935, when the time limit for the complete application of water expires.

If the water is completely applied to the proposed use on or before that date, you should submit the notice of complete application of water, after which a form will be sent you for making final proof. If you find that it is impossible to apply the water to all of the lands on or before that date, you should make an application for an extension of time at that time if you are interested in obtaining a right for the full amount allowed under your permit. If reasonable diligence is shown in the prosecution of work, such an extension may be granted.

Dear Sir:

We thank you for your card of the 8th with reference to our application No. 14, 802 for water permit No. 10,767.

We had overlooked the fact that we were called upon to mail you notice of completion of construction by October 1, 1934.

We went right after this work as soon as we received your letter of December 31, 1932 and the dam, water wheel, pump, flume, ditches, etc., are all complete and are in working order and were by the 15th of September 1933.

We have used practically all the water we could get for irrigation work pumping it into the tower and using it for irrigation purposes through a hose.

We still have some land to level below the pond and as soon as we can get this work done, the whole line up will be complete. It has not been possible for us to get at this leveling this summer but we hope to complete the work this coming spring and if you can extend our permit as far as the leveling of the land goes till say a year from this date, we will assure you we will give the matter our very best attention.

We have spent considerable money on this plant and it is working in fine shape and we hope you will see your way clear to grant an extension for the small amount of land leveling that will be necessary to flow the water out of the reservoir onto the land that we are trying to irrigate.

We have used some of the water on the low spots on this ground but we have got to do some leveling before the project is a success.

Enclosed is Form A and Form B taken from this water application. Asking you to advise us further in regard to the above and assuring you of our prompt attention, we remain.
