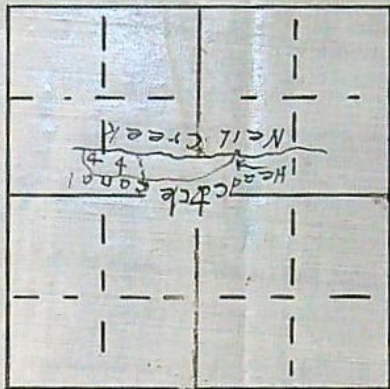

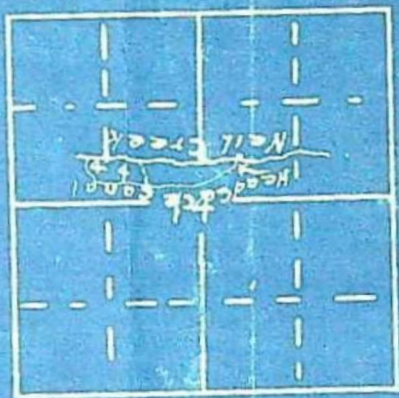

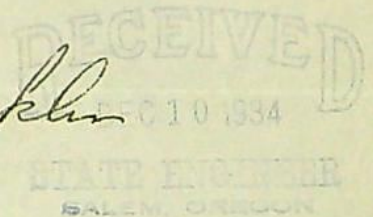

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed,
for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used
for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.08 cubic foot per second;

or its equivalent in case of rotation.

The point of diversion is located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 14, Township 3 South,
Range 48 East, W. M.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount
secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to
one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre,

and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the
proper state officer.

A description of the place of use under the right hereby confirmed,
and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

1 acre in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$,
2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$,
Section 14,
Township 3 South, Range 48 East, W. M.

The right to the use of water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted
to the lands or place of use herein described.
