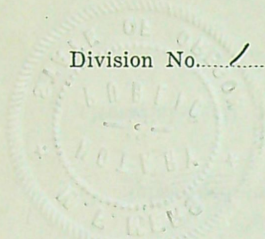

To the Board of Control  
Salem Ore My application for water  
was in August 1913 and had had three  
years to put the water on the land.

at the time my land was mostly in stumps  
and required a great deal of labor and expense  
to put it under the plough, and to level, as  
in getting out the stumps we make many  
uneven places, my land has a nice slope  
for irrigating but I will be obliged to get  
piping to carry the water over half of the land  
as it will take a number of years to get it  
smooth. I could not tell what I required until  
I saw the water run. I have 400 ft 10 in pipe  
40 rods ditch 40 rods flume and this year will  
get about 600 ft more pipe. This irrigation  
down here is in the experimental stage at present  
I had a fine stand of Potatoes in bloom Aug 24

when I turned the water on,  
and when I dug them they were very large  
and covered with second growth.

I counted a number and they went from  
10 to 17 subs and a potato. And if you want  
some to show what irrigation will do.

I will send you a sack of them, and pay  
the freight - I think I will have to ring all  
all from one place, as the banks to the river  
are very steep, and a 30 ft rise from low to  
high water in pump will be 15 ft under  
water at high water. The plant is rated  
between 1000 & 1100 gallons per minute, but  
have not had time to test it -

I have one year Extension of term  
Nov 15 - 1911 and shall continue to improve  
the proposition as fast as I see what is  
required. If I had not intended to appropriate the  
water in good faith I would not have expended  
over \$1300 for you. I don't know as I have filled out



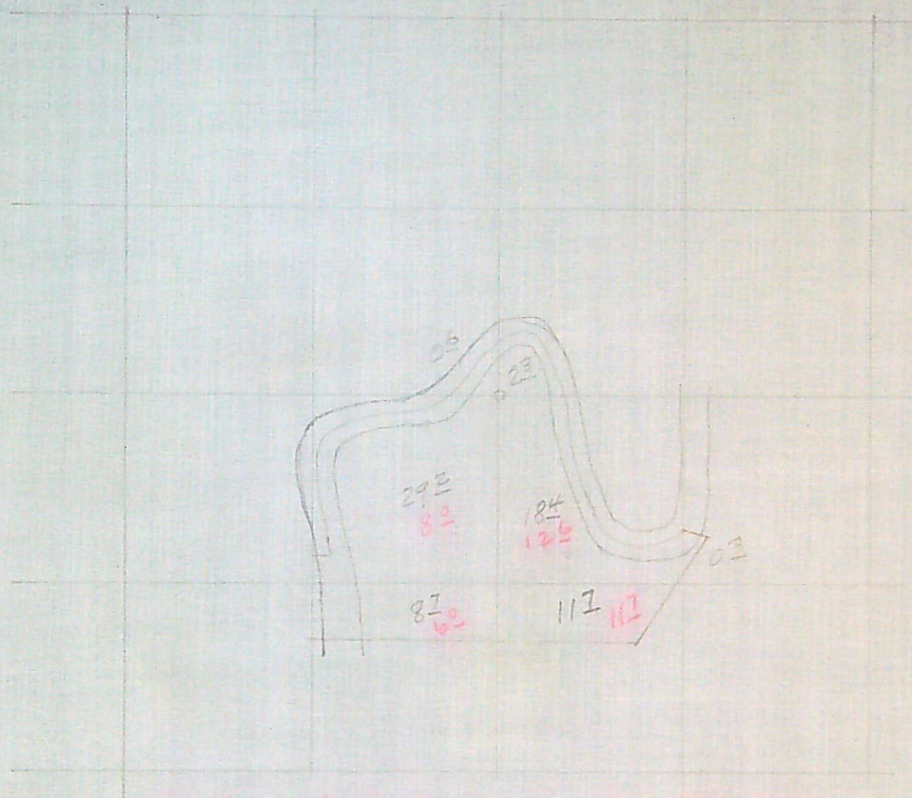
