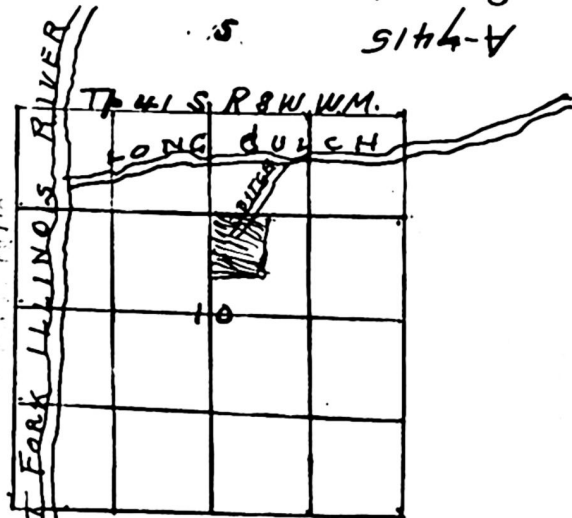

NOTICE OF BEGINNING OF CONSTRUCTION

I, Ralph Crossman, the holder of Application No. 7415, being Reservoir Permit No. 4691, issued by the State Engineer of the State of Oregon for the appropriation of 1/5 second-feet of the waters of Long Gulch in accordance with the tenor of such permit and the limitations endorsed thereon by the State Engineer, began the actual construction of the works described therein on the 15th day of July, 1920, being within the time limitation as fixed in said permit for the beginning of construction work.

The appropriator should state the manner of beginning construction work, number of men and teams employed, the amount of work completed up to the date of this statement, and any additional information which may tend to show the beginning of work in good faith.
Constructed dam 4 feet in height, 12 feet on top, ten feet on bottom using 6x6 fir stringers 1x12 uprights doubled, filled brush & rock. Two men on work.

NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF CONSTRUCTION

I, Ralph Crossman, the holder of Application No. 7415, being Reservoir Permit No. 4691, issued by the State Engineer of the State of Oregon for the appropriation of 1/5 second-feet of the waters of Long Gulch in accordance with the tenor of such permit and the limitations endorsed thereon by the State Engineer, have completed the construction of the works described therein the 17 day of July, 1920, being within the time limitation as fixed in said permit or extended by the State Water Board for the completion of construction work.

Remarks: Width of dam slightly larger than figured



Dear Sir:

On May 18th I made application for final proof on this application and permit, covering .2 cubic foot from Long Gulch, through the office of Mr. Opdyke who courteously aided me in the matter. I should be glad to learn whether this was passed upon by the Board, or if not yet reached in the routine of business, what the ordinary procedure is in such cases.

The 2½ acres cleared on this 80 acres, for which, with domestic purposes, I asked final proof on this water, proved not sufficient for my purposes, and I filed on an additional 80 acres adjoining me, and desire to clear and place under cultivation about five acres. Can I file on an additional .5 cubic foot of water from the same source for use on this land, which is of course in a different portion of the quarter section? There is a sufficient flow for this .5 foot, my own .2 and the .5 on which my neighbors have filed, all the year round except three months during the summer, when certain mining corporations take out the entire flow of this gulch as far as their ditches cross it in bring^{ing} water from the East Fork of the Illinois to their mines near Takilma and Waldo. If they can be persuaded to forego taking water from this gulch after they cease mining, there will be ample water for cultivation in the amounts already filed upon, and that desired by me additional.
